Heeting of Board of Trustees of The Youngstown College

July 27, 1945

met at Moon, Friday, July 27, 1945, at the Youngstown Club.

Dr. Jones and Carl W. Ullman were also present.

Mr. Wick presided.

Mr. Wick reviewed at length the great contribution which Mr. C. S. Robinson had made toward the founding and development of the College. All present expressed their high regard for Mr. Robinson and their deep sense of loss to the College by standing for a period of silence. Upon motion by Mr. Strouss, seconded by Mr. Leventry and unanimously carried, the Chairman was authorized to appoint a committee to draft a Memorial Resolution concerning the death of Mr. Robinson. Mr. Powers, Mr. Barrett and Mr. Murray were appointed.

The following enrollment figures were reported by President Jones, which showed the Summer School this year was the largest the school ever had;

It was reported that at a meeting of the Salary Committee held July 16, increases in salary of the faculty members, as recommended by the President, had been made and upon motion by Mr. Leventry, seconded by Mr. Maag and unanimously carried, these increases were approved for the School Year 1945-1946.

It was reported that for the first six months of the year, 244 veterans had been tested for the Veterans Bureau. For this service, the school received \$9.00 per veteran tested.

Dr. Jones presented the financial report for the year 1944-45, which showed an operating surplus of \$2,882.82. A copy of the Balance Sheet and Comparative Statement of budgeted and actual income and expense is as follows:

April

Upon motion by Mr. Gayton, seconded by Mr. Barrett and unanimously carried, James E. Bennett was elected as Trustee to fill the vacancy created by the death of C. S. Robinson, his term to expire in 1949.

Upon motion by Mr. Maag, and seconded by Mr. Davies and unanimously carried, reimbursement of President Jones for expenses incurred by him in the amount of \$4,00.00 in behalf of the College was approved and the distribution of \$2,500.00 to the faculty as a salary bonus for the year 1944-1945 was authorized.

The matter of the name used for the new engineering school was discussed. Upon motion by Mr. Powers, seconded by Mr. Maag and unanimously carried, the name "William Rayen School of Engineering of The Youngstown College" was adopted.

Mr. Mang reported progress to date in the remodeling and altering of the Rayen School building and the minutes of the meetings of the Building Committee and Executive Committee concerning this matter were read and approved. It was pointed out that bids as originally received would have involved an expenditure in excess of \$150,000.00 and that by rejecting those bids and taking bids on the basis of cost plus a fixed fee for the general contractor, it was hoped that the aggregate cost of alteration would not exceed \$120,000.00. President Jones reported that within the last month he had sought additional funds and had raised the estimated \$40,000.00 to cover the extra costs incurred in connection with the remodeling. Upon motion by Mr. Barrett, seconded by Mr. Wilson and unanimously carried, the action of the Building and Executive Committees were approved.

There being no further business, the meeting was duly adjourned.
