Dr. Jones introduced General Marlin, who spoke concerning the problems involved in the placement and rehabilitation of returning veterans and the assistance which the Veterans Administration can render in solving such problems. Mr. Chetister also spoke on the same subject and both speakers answered questions concerning the help which can be given to returning soldiers through the Veterans Administration, and the part which the College and other organizations can take in such work.

Judge Bennett reported concerning the terms of a proposed twenty year lease of the old Rayen School building and property and advised that such lease would require the approval of the Trustees of The Rayen School, The Board of Education of Youngstown, and the Common Pleas Court of Mahoning County.
