The minutes of the meeting of the Executive Committee held May 12, 1944, were read and Mr. Wick reported that following the meeting of May 12, he and Dr. Jones had called upon Mr. Purnell and informed him of the action taken.

Mr. Wick asked Dr. Jones to take up the agenda for the meeting and Dr. Jones commented concerning the action of the faculty with respect to granting honorary degrees.

Upon motion made by Mr. Collins, seconded by Mr. Bender and unanimously carried, the granting of the honorary degree of Doctor of Laws to Frank Purnell was approved.

He also reported that a total of 753 men and women from Youngstown College were known to be acting in service of their country in the war effort; that seven faculty members were in service; and that there were 17 known deaths to date. The statement of current income and expenditures and surplus for the month of April, as well as for the period from February 1 to May 1, 1944, was presented:

CONDENSED STATEMENT OF CURRENT INCOME AND SURPLUS

Dr. Jones reported that the college was subject to renegotiation on its contracts with the Government as to all aviation courses. He also reported that it was now anticipated that the deficit for the year would be approximately \$10,000.00 instead of \$20,000.00 as formerly estimated and that check in the amount of \$10,000.00 to cover the anticipated deficit had also been received from the Youngstown Foundation.

He reported plans were under consideration for conducting a rehabilitation course for returning soldiers; that a special institute was being planned for the giving of pre-high school training and that laboratory courses were being arranged for technical training and that such courses would be open to veterans during the day time and to workers from the industries in the evening.

He also reported that the co-operative program worked out with the retail merchants group for the giving of special courses in the afternoons and evenings was functioning and that the program was affording many girls an opportunity to earn their way through school.

Dr. Jones reported that the faculty had completed its recommendations of candidates for certificates and degrees.
