Forty-five of the above students have been called from the Army Reserve group in the last two weeks, making the enrollment on June 1st 395 students in the Liberal Arts Day division.

II Aviation Program

We have at the present time 118 trainees in our Link Instrument Program. Fortytwo students who were supposed to finish on May 15th have not completed their work, so the new group of thirty-five arrived before the first group finished. The weather has delayed their flight program.

III Report on Army Basic Program

We have been notified that our school will come up for consideration by the War Manpower Board in August. Youngstown College will be considered for an Army Basic Program. At the present time several members of our mathematics and science departments are subject to call by their selective service boards, and they will have to be replaced, providing an Army contingent is sent to Youngstown College. It is extremely difficult to hire men in these fields at the present time.

IV Statement relative to Accreditation by North Central Association

It was brought to our attention by Mr. Bowman, Superintendent of City Schools, that it is possible to hire graduates of Youngstown College in the field of elementary and junior high school teaching, but that the senior high schools can not hiro graduates of Youngstown College unless we are accredited by the North Central Association. This is further Evidence of the necessity of our applying again to the North Central Association for admission after we have attempted to make the changes in our program which they have suggested in their criticisms of our institution.
