II. Defense Courses

We are now giving four courses in aviation:

Elementary CPT - 20 students (60 per year) Secondary CPT - 10 students (30 per year) Cross Country - 6 students (24 per year) Student Instructor - 6 students (24 per year)

Production Supervision - 35 students
Explosives - 22 students
Fuel Analysis - 30 students (offered directly, not through Case)

V. Football

Many of the Board members were present at the Gridiron Club dinner which was held recently at the Youngstown Club. Approximately 250 were present at the dinner. This group of men sold 1674 season tickets at six dollars per ticket for the football season.

The following teams have been scheduled for next year: Western Reserve University, Geneva College, Morris Harvey College, West Virginia Wesleyan College, Illinois Wesleyan University, and University of Toledo.

VI. Music School

Since the last Board meeting the Youngstown College has acquired the Dana's Musical Institute. Their equipment was purchased for \$2,000. To house the music school the Thomas property at 616 Mick Avenue was purchased by the Young Men's Christian Association for \$15,000. \$6,100 has been authorized and spent to remodel this property. We now have one building composed of studios and classrooms, and the former garage and chauffeur's quarters in the rear have been remodelled into 14 practice studios. At present there are about 60 students enrolled in the music department, and in addition, about 70 private students are receiving instruction from the music school faculty.

Dr. Stearns, Mr. Myerovich, Mr. Bretz, and Mr. Hoffman were retained from our Music Department. In addition we now have on our staff from Dana's, Mr. Lynn B. Dana, Jr., Mr. Donald Hurrelbrink, Mr. Jacob Schmitt, Miss Kathryn Guarnieri, Mr. J. D. Cook, Mrs. Mary Fankhauser, Mr. Julius Guyas, Mr. James Whistler, and Mr. Theodore Baar.

VII. Classes for Youngstown Welding and Engineering Company

We are at present conducting classes in Engineering Drawing and Mathematics for the Youngstown Welding and Engineering Company. Forty students are enrolled, and they meet on Saturday mornings from eight until twelve o'clock. The company is paying five hundred dollars for this instruction.

VIII. Faculty Changes

The following men have resigned from the faculty:

Dr. Weigert has been added to the teaching staff. He is carrying a part time schedule in both Youngstown College and Hiram College. A number of faculty members have been added to our part time staff for our evening program.

IX. Rosignation of Mr. Ronnick Bell

The resignation of Mr. Rennick Bell from the Board of Governors was presented to the Executive Committee at their last meeting. Mr. John Clingan of Niles was appointed to the Board to fill the vacancy.
