

The Intellectual and Cultural History of
Medieval Buda, 1242-1526

The cities of Buda, Pest and Obuda, which were combined in 1873 to form the modern capital of Hungary, rose to prominence within the kingdom following the devastation resulting from the Mongol (Tartar) invasions of 1241-1242. The three towns, but especially Buda, played an increasingly important role in the political and cultural life of medieval Hungary as the kings frequently lived on the Hill of Buda, overlooking the Danube, and eventually made this fortification their permanent residence. During the reign of Louis the Great, Sigismund of Luxembourg and Matthias Corvinus, the city of Buda emerged as one of the important capitals in East-Central Europe, and its fame declined only after the disastrous defeat of the Hungarian armies at the Battle of Mohács in 1526.

Two books on Medieval Buda are available in English but both are oriented toward specific audiences and have a narrow focus. Last year Martin C. Rady published a volume entitled, Medieval Buda: Study of Municipal Government and Jurisdiction (East European Monographs, no. 182, Columbia University Press, 1985), an excellent institutional history. Over a decade ago, the distinguished art historian Laszlo Gerevich wrote, The Art of Buda in the Middle Ages, a volume marred by a poorly translated text and illustrations of inferior quality. A major History of Budapest in five massive volumes has been published recently, but it is basically inaccessible to most non-Hungarian scholars. The major aim of my project is the elimination of this lacuna by writing a monograph of about 200-250 pages in which the intellectual and cultural history of Medieval Buda is presented to an English speaking scholarly audience.

The planned volume will contain chapters which will attempt to present a fairly complete picture of the intellectual and cultural life of Buda from 1242 to 1526. Among the important topics to be covered will be the growth of schools and attempts to establish universities in or near the Hungarian capital; the extent of literacy among the population; the development of literature, both vernacular and Latin; the establishment of an early printing press in Buda (1473) and the role of booksellers in the city. Special attention will be given to the coexistence of Late Medieval and Renaissance culture, the humanistic court of King Matthias and the deep spirituality of the mendicant orders, i.e. Franciscans and Dominicans. The major developments and innovations in architecture and the decorative arts, as well as music, will be discussed. Late fifteenth and early sixteenth century Buda was an exciting, vital and vibrant city, where the late flowering of Medieval culture and the new trends associated with the Renaissance, compete and coexist side by side. Most Hungarian historians and art historians have concentrated their attention either on the Renaissance court of Matthias Corvinus, or have studied the late Gothic flowering and have neglected to emphasize the simultaneous development of these two trends. My study will elaborate on this dichotomy, a

development which is not unique to Hungary.

The basic collection of manuscript sources for the history of Buda, Pest and Obuda is found in the chartulary and regesta collection assembled by the Budapesti Történeti Múzeum (Historical Museum of Budapest). Unfortunately, only one volume of this rich primary source material was ever published. The assembled documents were seriously damaged in the course of the siege of Budapest during World War II but the collection has been slowly reconstructed and reconstituted with the use of copies, microfilms, etc., mainly as the result of the work of Prof. E. Mályusz, Dr. L. Kumorovitz and Dr. A. Kubinyi. Plans to publish subsequent volumes of these documents and registers have not materialized, and there is little hope that they will appear in print in the next decades due to Hungary's increasing economic difficulties. The only way this information is accessible is by using the research facilities of the Budapesti Történeti Múzeum (BTM).

30 While in Hungary for an editorial meeting in May of 1986, I discussed my research plan for a book on Medieval Buda with the Director of the BTM, Prof. Dr. György Székely. His response was most positive and he promised all possible help to bring the project to fruition. The Museum will make available to me the major collection of written primary sources, and equally important, their repository of items from their exhibits. Prof. Székely assured me that he will allow me to study not only those items which are on display at the Museum, but will open all storage areas of the collection for my examination. This rich treasury of the physical remains of the life of the medieval inhabitants of the Hungarian capital, will be an important aid to my research. I also had the opportunity to discuss the project with Dr. Gyöngyi Török of the Hungarian National Gallery, a recognized scholar on Late Medieval and Renaissance architecture and painting. She was extremely enthusiastic about the prospect of an up-to-date book in English on the intellectual and cultural history of Buda, and has promised her full cooperation. She will also make available all the items on display and in storage at the National Gallery, and will accompany me to various architectural sites for in situ study. At a recent Renaissance Conference at Indiana University (Bloomington), both Prof. Székely and Dr. Török reiterated their support, as did Dr. Tibor Klaniczay, Director of the Institute for Literary Studies of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences. Prof. Klaniczay, who is "shepherd" my study on Matthias Corvinus through the Academy Press (Akadémiai kiadó), is familiar with my work and considers this project to be of great value. The one area where I am uncertain about the availability of sources to carry on my work is in the musical disciplines. I will have to rely exclusively on the advice of Hungarian colleagues when dealing with this aspect of the study.

During the past fifteen years I have studied the history of late Medieval and Renaissance Hungary, and have written a number of studies on various aspects of political and cultural development. (See attached list of publications.) I am familiar with the various sources, printed and archival, have worked in Hungary before, know personally the major scholars who work in this area. I have a good idea as to what can and can not be done in Budapest in four months. Through the years I have been able to assemble most of the printed primary materials as well as the secondary scholarly literature. If my request for a sabbatical from YSU is approved, I will have the time to finish all preliminary "spade work" before going to Hungary in the spring of 1988. The four months in Budapest would enable me to complete all aspects of the research. Upon returning to the U.S., the final draft of the monograph would have to be prepared. The proposed volume would probably be submitted to the East European Monographs Series, for publication.

The assistance of the Fulbright-Hays Faculty Research Abroad Program in writing a history of the intellectual and cultural life of Medieval Buda will be greatly appreciated. The resulting volume could become a welcome addition to the understanding of this rather neglected phase of history.



Last November I applied for a Fulbright-Hays Faculty Research Abroad Program, requesting a grant for four months of archival work in Budapest, Hungary. The title of my project is "The Intellectual and Cultural History of Medieval Buda, 1242-1526."


Item 21 of the application form (2) requested information concerning financial matters. Under the heading of "Faculty Maintenance Stipend - Duplicating Support" I had indicated that I applied for an IREX grant, as well as a sabbatical from Youngstown State University.

I am happy to inform you that I have been notified by IREX that my name has been forwarded to Hungary as a nominee for the program, and in the meantime, I have also received a sabbatical from Youngstown State University, at full pay, for the academic year from September 15, 1987 to June 15, 1988. This changes considerably the financial aspects of the application which I submitted to you last November. Instead of support for the full four months of my stay in Budapest, I only need funds for the period from June 15 to July 15, 1988, i.e. when my sabbatical is no longer in effect. This reduces by almost \$16,000 the amount which I had originally requested.

In view of these fortunate developments, I have re-written page 2 of the application form and am submitting it to you with the request that you substitute it for the original. (Enclosure.) I felt that this new information should be made known to you, especially in these days of budgetary difficulties. I would also like to emphasize that I continue to be very much interested in receiving a Fulbright-Hays Faculty Research Grant. As a former Fulbright student at the University of Vienna (1963-64), I fully appreciate the excellence and prestige of the program.
