Most important point: I am deeply distressed to have people I like very much saying horrid - and often unfair - things about each other. When other people have three classes of 35 to 40 and I have one with 10 and one with 15 I wonder not only about my real worth to the department but my real competence. Maybe these other "slights" are saying something I am simply refusing to recognize.

I do wish I could afford to return my contract unsigned or find some other place to dispense whatever talent and learning I have, but I can't at the moment see hope of either one.

And all this on top of the fact that I have been publicly proclaimed incompetent either to take department meeting minutes or to pour coffee! At least I have gained some perspective on this final item and can record it with a halfsmile.
