Frederick W. Stricker III, who has been one of my students for the past six years has asked me to write a letter of recommendation in his behalf, which I am most happy to do.

Mr. Stricker first appeared in my Western Civ. I class and his dedication to the course as well as the sophistication of his essays immediately aroused my interest in him. Since then he has taken an upper division Reformation course with me as well as two Graduate classes. In each case his performance was excellent. I am particularly impressed by the depth of his knowledge of the Radical Reformation, especially the Anabaptists and their offshots. In a Graduate class, which dealt with the lesser known personalities of the Reformation, he wrote a fine paper on Pilgrim Marpeck, using sixteenth century German sources. In an oral report he translated German primary sources ex tempore into English, much to the amazement of the whole class.

His work for me has been superb. He writes well, is able to use sources critically and his oral presentations are well organized.

What I find most amazing about this graduate student is his ability to rise from what to me seems to be an intellectually restrictive environment. Mr. Stricker belongs to one of the branches of the Mennonite denomination where scholarship is not encouraged. Yet this young man has all the attributes of a fine scholar.

asked. "It's easy", I answered, "isn't it the teacher who is first in-line to develop and inspire that young mind into the lifesaver it becomes at some later date!"


I'm not sure she was able or interested enough to grasp the depth of my answer, but it's probably not important anyway in this day of non-education.



## Dr. Péter Ernő, a leghívebb Széchenyi- követő emlékezete

(1906.I.1. Vid, Veszprém megye -  
1995. II. 26. Budapest)

Sok-sok szenvedés után, életének kilencvenedik évében itthagyott benneinket nemzetünk sok keserves megpróbáltatást kiállt nagy tanítója: dr. Péter Ernő.

Egyetemista korában tagja lett a budapesti központú Országos Széchenyi Szövetségnek, majd hamarosan irányítója, vezetője lett a Szövetség falukutató szakosztályának s magának a Szövetségnek is. Kiemelkedő eredményt ért el különféle szociográfiai pályázatokon, főleg a Magyar Társaság Falukutató Intézete keretében munkásságára fölfigyelt Teleki Pál Európa-hírű földrajztudós és geopolitikus is, aki 1940-ben, amikor felmerült a szükségesége, hogy a legnagyobb magyar születésének másfélszázados jubileumát az egész országra kiterjedő, a sajtót, rádiót, társadalmi egyesületeket, hivatalokat, önkormányzatokat megmozgató Széchenyi-emlékével ünnepelje meg a magyarság, az ország miniszterelnökeként kijelentette: erre a legmeg-

felelőbb ember dr. Péter Ernő, aki már ifjúsága óta igen sokat tett verssel, cikkekkel, könyvekkel Széchenyi ma is időszerű eszmevilágának a magyar nép közötti terjesztéséért. Dr. Péter Ernő megkapta a miniszterelnökség Nemzetpolitikai Osztályától a Széchenyi Emlekbizottság ügyvezető főtitkára megbízatást, és a közben megalakult Széchenyi Munkaközösséggel tagjaival az 1941. szeptember 21-i pesti vigadói nyitóünnepétől kezdve Székely-udvarhelytől Sopronig, Kassától, Kőszegig, Kolozsvártól Balatonfüredig az egész országot felrázta a Széchenyi tanítására való emlékezés.

Az emlékev során országszerte ezrek és ezrek ismerték meg dr. Péter Ernő nevét. Ezért a közismertségért, népszerűségért igen nagy árat kellett fizetnie! 1946. dec. 31.-től 1953. szept. 17-ig, közel hét éven keresztül kilenc fegyháznál is rosszabb helyen szenvedett, köztük pl. az Andrassy úton, a szegedi Csillagban, Márianosztrán, a recski munkatáborban. Utána több mint 3 évig a megalázó rendőri felügyelet alatt sínylődött. Kényszerű távollétében szépen berendezett lakását és taborhegyi mintaszerű kertjét elvették, és feleségét három kisgyermekével együtt embertelen körülmenyek között kitelepítették Jászaloszentgyörgyre.

1990. decemberében jogi és államrudományi gyémántdiplomával tüntették ki, 1991. szeptember 20-án ünnepélyesen megkapta a Magyar Köztársasági Arany Érdemkeresztjét.

Temetése szülőhelyén, szűk családi körben történik.

Tisztelt és szeretett halottunk üdvösségeért gyermekei, unokái és dédunokái, valamint barátai és tiszteleti részére 1995. március 18-án, szombaton, 15.30 órakor engesztelő szentmise áldozatot mutatnak be a Bp. VIII. ker. Lőrinc pap téri Jézus Szíve templomban.

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háborúk ütközeteiben eltöltött, és amelyek során számos hírneves emberrel, nagy tudású személlyel találkozhatott és beszélhetett.

Bár önálló hadtudományi munkát nem írt, szinte minden művében foglalkozott a hadügy és honvédelem kérdéseivel. Világ című könyvében jegyzi meg: „A honvédelem erejét itt ex asse felvenni nem akarom - mégis elég, úgy hiszem megmutatni azt, hogy e tárgról, ha nem helyesen is - amit csak az idő határozand el - de minden esetben egy keveset gondolkoztam.”

Az 1828-ban megjelent első művében, a Lovakról címűben is foglalkozott az „ország védelem” problémakörével, és számos példával magyarázta, hogy hány „hadi-vezér” vesztett csatákat, mert csak katonái számára, és nem azok tulajdon-ságaira és becsekre ügyelt.” A Hitelben „hazánk előmenetele” érdekében javasolta az ország honvédelménak és hadseregenek átalakítását. „Nem a sok katonai vívja a csatát a diadallal, hanem a táborknál által jól elkészült s bőlcseggel vezetett bajnok... S milly természetes, hogy valamelly háború kimeneteléről annak mindég meg kell csalatkoznia, ki az ellenség számát s ágyuit veszi csak számba, nem pedig a hadnép műveltségét s vezérinek eszét.”

Milyen kár, hogy hazai katonapolitikusaink sem nagyon olvassák a leg-nagyobb magyar honvédelmi eszmefutatásait, ahol a célszerű elképzélések szinte kelletik magukat. Hiszen kifejtette azt is, hogy „hazánk nem megközelíthetetlen szigeten fekszik, ezért szükséges egy olyan nemzeti hadsereg, mely a szomszédok támadó- és védelem-módjával nem csak egyenlő fokon” áll és olyan katonáknak, „kik mesterségeket professio gyanánt űzik”. (Ez régóta így működik Svájcban, és most vezetik be Belgiumban. Mint tudnivaló, ezen szegény országoknak nincs ablakon kidobandó felesleges pénzük, szemben megvédendő vívmányaiikkal és nemzeti értékeikkel.)

Stádium című művében megerősítette, hogy „a reformok nélkül a nemzetnek védőtehetsége parányi lesz, s a legelső megtámadó előtt az ország minden kapui tárra lesznek”.

Milyen kevesen is ismerik, hogy Széchenyi szervezi meg a Magyar Tudományos Akadémia Hadtudományi Alapztályát. Az 1844 karácsonyának előestéjén, Széchenyi elnökletével meg-tartott ülésen három császári-királyi hivatalos tisztl felvételéről folyt a szó: Mészáros Lázár huszár alezredes, Korpónay János gránátos főhadnagy és Czetz János gyalogsági hadnagy személyéről. Ók hárman a később hozzájuk csatlakozott Kiss Károly kapitány-

nyal és Gál Sándorral dolgozzák ki a magyar honvédség működésének alapelveit, szervezetét, felépítését. Mint tudjuk, mindegyikük mindenkoráig kitartott a szabadságharc ügye mellett. Mészáros Lázár akadémikusból Széchenyi javaslatára lesz hadügymintiszter, Korpónay János a hadügymintiszter segédtisztje, Czetz Jánosból a hadügymintiszterium vezérkari osztályának munkatársa. Hogy mennyire jól, azt a szabadságharc leverése utáni halálos ítéletük is bizonyíthatja.

1847 novemberében Széchenyi Moson megye követévé választották. Magyaróvárott ez alkalomból elmondott beszédéből a jelen kor honatya számára is tanulságos(-nak kellene lenniük) a következő soroknak: „Politikán irányá megkívánja, hogy az alsó táblánál összpontosítam tehetségemet. Tövise a pálya, de ezt megszoktam mint katona, érzem az évek hosszú lejárt sorát, mint politikus. Arra, hogy a jövő országgyűlésen e tövise pályára lépjen, okot nem szolgáltattat egyéb, mint a hazai szeretet.”

## Hány éves a tiszai gózhajózás?

Március 7-én jelent meg a magyar hajójás története békelyegsorozatban a 200 éve született Vásárhelyi Pál és a 150 éves tiszai gózhajózás békelyeg. Egyikről sem lehet Széchenyi megkerülésével beszélni.

Kézdivásárhelyi Vásárhelyi Pál 1795-ben született Szepesolaszin. Budán az Institutum Geometricum (a mai Műegyetem) hidrotechnikai fakultásán tanult, ahol, a világon talán elsőként, vízmérnököket képeztek ki. 1829-től a Duna felmérési munkálatainak vezetője, ő irányította az Al-Duna szabályozásának munkáit. Széchenyi, mint e munkák királyi biztosa 1833 szeptember 3-án elsőként érkezik Szegedre - a „Duna” későbbi nevén az „Argo” - gózhajóval (ezt megelőzően, de ugyanez évben felment egy hajó Törökbecséig: ez volt az első), útja során többször találkozik Vásárhelyivel, naplójában sűrűn emlegeti, novemberben pedig magával viszi Angliába. A híd és vasút ügyeiben is rendszeresen konzultál a mérnökkal. Mint a Közlekedési Bizottság elnöke (tkp. közlekedési miniszter), 1845 ószén Vásárhelyivel bejárja a Tisza felső és középső szakaszát, aki biztatására „El-sődleges Javaslat”-ot készít a szabályozásról.

Széchenyi ezt követően írja Eszmetörédekek, különösen a Tisza-völgy rendezését illetőleg c. művében: „... meg kell akadályozni a tiszai ár kiöntéseit, ... kerttő

kell varázsolni a Tisza-völgyét, ... a közlekedés javításáról kell gondoskodni, rendszeresíteni kell a gózhajózást, hogy a nagyobb termés elszállítható legyen”.

Az 1846 január 26-án megalakult Tisza-völgyi Társulat főmérnöke Vásárhelyi Pál lett, aki elkészítette a Tisza-szabályozás tervét. Mikor a Társulat ülésén ezt ismerte, a kialakult heves viták következetében szívszélhűést kapott, és április 8-án meghalt. „Megölték Vásárhelyit” - jegyzi naplójába Széchenyi.

„A legnagyobb magyar” és mérnöke minden össze tizenhárom évet működhetek együtt, de addig nemcsak egymásra, hanem a magyar Duna- és Tisza-tájra is maradandó hatást gyakoroltak. Tragikus végük is - melynek még napja is fatálisan egyező - összekötötte őket.

A munkát azonban folytatni kellett, amivel Széchenyi Paleocapa velencei mérnököt, a Pó szabályozóját bízta meg. 1846 július 17-én kezdődő útjukról a „Jelenkor” így tudósított 1846 július 30-i számában: „Széchenyi István gróf tiszai első útja a Pannónia gózhajó Szegedtől Tokajig. (Első gózhajó a Tisza!)” - ami a teljes hajózható szakaszon végigment (KP)

A magyar városok monografiája Szeged kötete (1927) a tiszai gózhajózás megnyitását 1845-re teszi (talán Szeged és Szolnok között volt is hajózás, de erre nem találtam adatot). A rendszeres tiszai gózhajójáratot 1847-ben indította meg a Dunagózhajózási Társaság.

A Tiszagózhajózási Társaság alapszabályát 1847-ben adták ki.

A fentiek alapján legalábbis nem egyértelmű, hogy hány éves a tiszai gózhajózás.

Dear friend and Distinguished Colleague:

In a recent conversation with our mutual dear friend Asztrik he informed me that you were organizing a series of festivities to celebrate the 600th anniversary of the foundation of the University of Obuda. It is indeed fitting that the ~~date~~ anniversary of the second Hungarian university be remembered.

It was with great delight that I heard of your efforts because it indicates that Hungarian scholars finally recognize that Obuda was not founded in 1389 but in 1395. When I was in Budapest in 1988, the display at the National Museum still had the wrong date. I even spoke to one of the officials of the museum and indicated that the year of foundation should be corrected.

In 1966 I wrote my dissertation on Medieval Hungarian University Foundations under the direction of Dr. Gabriel. A portion of this study was subsequently published in the Studium Generale: Studies Offered to A. L. Gabriel, which I edited. I believe that I was the first Hungarian scholar to establish the correct date of foundation for the Obuda Studium founded by Sigismund of Luxembourg. It is therefore with special joy that I received the news that the 600th anniversary of Obuda will be celebrated this year. The history

of this unfortunately short lived university has always been close to my heart.

We hope that you are well and are delighted that you are still so active in scholarly matters. I am happy to report that my long delayed book on Matthias Corvinus is finally nearing completion. I have about two and a half chapters to ~~copy~~ finish. Will keep you up to date on progress.

This brought to mind the problems we in the Selection Committee faced in making our decisions. A few years ago, while on a similar committee, the same questions were discussed, namely what are the guidelines to be followed for the selection of worthy Distinguished Professors.

In order to create/preserve a modicum of uniformity of standards in the selection process, I set down a few thoughts which I wanted to share with you.

You can do any of the following:

- A. Proclaim that each committee, each year, should set up its own standards and throw my enclosure into the wastebasket. Believe me, I will not be hurt.
- B. Use parts or all of the enclosed material in your "charge" to the new committee.
- C. Combine your ideas and some of my material in drawing up some vague instruction for the use of future selection committees.
- D. Call me so we can have lunch again and discuss this and/or any other matter.

## MEMORANDUM

A few guidelines for the selection of Distinguished Professors.

1. First and foremost: all decisions must be based on evidence.

This will require the selection committee members to read the nominations with care and look into the faculty files to find supporting evidence.

A. Distinguished Professor in Research - There must be a clear indication that the nominee has made tangible contributions to their respective profession or discipline.

Examples: This is evident in the publication of books, articles in learned journals or encyclopedias, textbooks, research reports etc. This research should be shared with others in the discipline, not only through publication but by the presentation of papers at regional, national or international meetings. Faculty members who receive major grants for their research should also be recognized.

Note of caution: While this is often difficult, the quality and quantity of the research should be carefully evaluated.

B. Distinguished Professor in Teaching - The most obvious indication of excellence in teaching is the recommendation of students. Although support of colleagues and chairs is important, student input for an award in teaching is imperative.

Examples: Although we know the imperfections of student evaluations, they should be consulted. There should be some evidence of consistent excellence in the classroom.

Note of caution: On occasion chairs, colleagues and even students nominate individuals, write in glowing terms about the virtues of the candidate, yet the information in the faculty file does not support the facts.

C. Distinguished Professor in Public Service - Award should recognize activity which is focused and is in some way tied to the mission of the University.

Example: Based upon their academic backgrounds, faculty members provide some expertise to the community, serve on boards of directors, reach out to ethnic or racial groups, promote cultural and multi-cultural ties.

Note of caution: There are some people who involve themselves in everything at the expense of their scholarship and their teaching. This award is for teacher-scholars who also excell in Public Service.

2. All nominees from the various colleges and schools should be given careful consideration. An attempt should be made to select candidates from the whole academic community.

A belated Happy Birthday to you. It is remarkable how time passes. Just a few years ago you were a little girl with long braids. You have blossomed into a mature scholar and a beautiful young woman. May the years to come bring you much happiness.

Please forgive me for not thanking you sooner for the excellent diagnosis you provided on King Matthias Corvinus based upon the "Medical Profile" I furnished to you. As I indicated in our last telephone conversation months ago, the same "Profile" was given to a cardiologist as well as a physician whose specialty is internal medicine.

Your diagnosis was by far the most thoughtful, and as far as I can determine, the most accurate. The analysis of the cardiologist was disappointing, the internal med. person came to basically the same conclusion that you reached.

Since you sent me your comments I have used the information in a number of ways. As a "trial run" I worked up a presentation which I gave last spring here at the University to interested colleagues and select History majors. In June I was in Budapest on NEH matters and one of my <sup>historian</sup> friends, who works for one of the three TV networks in Hungary did a series of interviews with me, among them one dealing with the death of King Matthias.

Last week I was in Hungary again, at the invitation of the Rector of the University of Budapest and spoke at a convocation marking the 600th anniversary of the institution's foundation.

It was a special joy to see your lovely Mother in Bp. during my brief stay there. She is working with incredible diligence on her project. While in Hungary I also spoke to a graduate seminar at the Central European University and my topic was the health, illnesses and death of Máté's király. I mentioned you by name as the person whose diagnosis had been most useful to me. I identified you as the great granddaughter of Keresztes-Fischer Ferenc, since historians in the audience would certainly know that name. My 45-50 min. presentation was received with great interest and colleagues are encouraging me to organize the material into a scholarly article. In all probability I am going to follow that advice, write up the information I gathered and submit it for publication either here or in Europe.

Two questions:

1. May I use direct quotations from your diagnosis in my article, naturally with proper attribution.

This is the best I could do between doctor's offices, pharmacies, physicians etc... on short notice:

The establishment of the University of Obuda in 1395 was part of a long series of university foundations in Central Europe, begun in 1348 at Prague and continued with Cracow (1364), Vienna (1365) and Pécs (1367). After a brief flowering Pécs, established by Louis the Great, disintegrated and Hungary was without an institution of higher learning. Eager to raise the cultural level of his kingdom and probably encouraged by his wife Mária, Sigismund of Luxembourg petitioned Pope Boniface IX to allow him to erect a studium in a suitable city within his realm. The Pope responded to the king's request and authorized the founding of the new university, which was located in Obuda, with all the usual faculties, namely Arts, Medicine, Law and Theology. The Provost of the Church of St. Peter in Obuda was to be the university's Chancellor. The foundation document, which unfortunately has not survived, except in summary, was dated October 6, 1395 and not 1389 as it was previously believed. Instructions probably began in the fall of 1396, but the Obuda studium did not grow into a viable institution. It probably ceased to exist in the troubled years of the first decade of the 15th century. Sigismund made an attempt to restore Obuda to the status of a university town and in 1410 turned to anti-Pope John XXIII for a second Foundation Bull, which was issued on August 1. This is the only major surviving document of the University. Instructions must have begun soon thereafter for a delegation of Professors from Obuda attended the Council of Constance (1414-1418) which successfully resolved the Great Schism. Following the meeting at Constance the fate of the University of Obuda fades once more into obscurity. It is most unfortunate that all the medieval university foundations in Hungary ended in failure.


Just a note to let you know about the progress on Matthias Corvinus.

Dear Prof. Domonkos:

Thank you once again for agreeing to write letters of recommendation for me. I have enclosed a self-addressed postcard; please fill in the dates and send it to me after you have mailed the reference forms to Ohio University and the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. If you cannot find these forms, please phone me as soon as possible (I have extra OU forms, but I would need to send to Illinois for more of theirs). Obviously, since the Cornell and Syracuse forms will be sent to me in sealed and signed envelopes, I shall need no notification on their account.

I am now requesting two more recommendations—one to the State University of New York at Buffalo (mailing label and response postcard enclosed), and one to the University of Wisconsin-Madison (mailing label, reference form, and response postcard enclosed). There is only one letter of recommendation I shall still need from you (making a total of seven), but I am still waiting for the form to come in the mail; I shall get it to you as soon as I have it.

I would very much appreciate it if you would send these out by the end of the quarter, **but the letter for Wisconsin is URGENT and has priority over the others.** The University of Wisconsin-Madison has the earliest deadline of any of the schools to which I am applying—they want everything in their hands the week after Thanksgiving. Therefore, please put Wisconsin's form "at the head of the line."

In writing, please feel perfectly free to convey any personal or academic information you believe will persuade the admissions committees to accept me into their departments. By way of reminder, I had you for Western Civilization 1 in Winter 1989, Reformation Era in Winter 1991, Seminar in Renaissance and Reformation in Spring 1995 (I wrote a paper on Pilgram Marpeck, Anabaptist theologian and engineer), and Historical Literature—European in Summer 1995 (readings on the social and economic conditions in the Middle Ages). I received all A's. Also, if you recall reading my historical fiction (on the conscientious objectors in World War One) and found it good, if you believe it is pertinent, please mention it. I published a non-fiction article in a national magazine (where I plan to submit my Marpeck paper), and two articles in The Vindicator; the national article was not historical, but the local articles dealt with contemporary legal history. I presented a paper on the latter topic at the Ohio Ass'n. of Economists and Political Scientists conference Oct. 14th. I am preparing a session dealing with local immigration history (and submitting a paper) for the Ohio Academy of History, and plan to submit a paper to Quest on an incident in colonial America.

Please excuse the long delay in thanking you for having helped me in offering a diagnosis of king Matthias Corvinus (1458-1490) of Hungary. Your evaluation of the "patient" has been most valuable for my work.

Shortly after receiving your letter, I gave an informal presentation at YSU where I used the information you provided together with a diagnosis furnished by a young neurologist friend from Cleveland. Since then your nephew Dr. Ben Hayek also added his analysis of what caused the death of the king.

Last week I was in Hungary at the invitation of the Rector of the University of Budapest and addressed a special convocation marking the 600th anniversary of the founding of that illustrious institution of higher learning.

While in Budapest I was also asked to give a lecture at the Central European University to a graduate seminar in Medieval Studies. My topic was the problem of the health, illnesses, and death of Matthias Corvinus.

My presentation was received with great interest and several colleagues have encouraged me to write an article in which I discuss not only the materials I assembled for the "Medieval Profile" I provided you, but present the whole methodology used in attempting to give a diagnosis for a patient who has been dead for over 500 years.

The information you provided has been most valuable. It will be used in my forthcoming book, and with your permission in the article I am going to write in the next few months. When and where it will be published is at this time still uncertain. Unless I hear from you, I will assume that I can quote your diagnosis in my work.



The news that the University of Budapest will celebrate its 600th Anniversary of Foundation in October is most welcome and I know that it is your able hand which is behind the preparations.




Concerning these matters of publication, I will consult with Prof. Székely, since he is in charge of this aspect of the project.



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

Dear Professor Domonkos:

It is with deep regret that I write to tell you that the review cycle in the Translations Program has been cancelled for this year. Although the Endowment's budget for fiscal 1996 has not yet been determined, congressional actions make it clear that the agency's grantmaking funds will be reduced by approximately forty percent. Since a considerable portion of the remaining funds has been stipulated by Congress as line items for specific programs, the funds available to make new grants in the Division of Research Programs in fiscal 1996 will be drastically diminished. The Endowment has therefore been forced to cancel this year's competition in the Translations Program.

During the coming months the Endowment will be reorganized to accommodate a significantly reduced budget. We expect that we will again be able to review applications for scholarly research projects during the next calendar year. Applicants to the Translations Program who submitted proposals as individuals and who request salary support for one year or less may apply to the Fellowships Program at its May 1, 1996, deadline. Applicants with collaborative or team projects may apply to the Research Division at an October 1, 1996, deadline.\* If you wish to resubmit your proposal, please contact the Endowment several months before the deadline to check on the status of the program and to request application forms.

I know how much thought and time have gone into preparing your application and how disappointing this announcement will be to you. I can only say how deeply distressed we are that the present circumstances have made this decision necessary, and so late in the review process.

## Préparation du 18e Congrès du CISH à Montréal

### 1 - Organisation matérielle

Après une brève introduction par Brian Young, président du Comité national des historiens canadiens, la parole est donnée à Jean-Claude Robert qui préside le Comité d'organisation du Congrès.

Le Congrès se tiendra du dimanche 27 août au dimanche 3 septembre 1995 au Palais des Congrès, vaste complexe comprenant 29 salles pouvant contenir de 100 à 6 000 personnes. Le Campus de l'Université de Québec à Montréal pourra également être utilisé en cas de besoin. L'un et l'autre sont situés au centre ville. Il y aura sur place une cafeteria et des espaces de rencontres.

Seules la séance d'ouverture et la séance de clôture bénéficieront d'une traduction simultanée (français / anglais).

Pour l'hébergement, deux catégories sont prévues : soit des hôtels (entre 100 et 150 \$ canadiens), soit des logements à prix plus modique sur lesquels le Comité canadien travaille actuellement.

Des négociations sont en cours avec les deux transporteurs aériens du Canada, Air Canada et Canadian International (qui viennent de fusionner).

Une vaste exposition de livres et de matériel informatique est prévue.

Enfin des excursions seront organisées, soit pendant la semaine du Congrès, soit après le Congrès (chutes du Niagara, Ouest Canadien, Maritimes, etc.)

Si la publication des Actes est confirmée, il sera impératif de fournir les textes sur disquettes Macintosh ou IBM-PC (Word et Wordperfect) <sup>1</sup>.

### 2 - Organisation scientifique

La liste des thèmes préparée par le Secrétaire général et adressée à tous les organismes membres deux mois avant l'Assemblée générale est abondamment discutée et commentée. Trois thèmes majeurs sont retenus (au lieu de quatre), dont celui sur "Les diasporas", primitivement présenté parmi les thèmes spécialisés, et qui prendra la place du thème "Pouvoir et liberté" (lequel glisse dans les sujets spécialisés et transversaux). Les thèmes majeurs bénéficieront de sessions d'une journée (une matinée et une après-midi).

En ce qui concerne les thèmes spécialisés, deux domaines qui faisaient défaut dans la liste initiale seront introduits : l'un est celui de l'histoire des sciences et des techniques, l'autre celui de l'histoire religieuse. Chacun des thèmes spécialisés retenus fera l'objet d'une session d'une demie journée.

On trouvera en annexe la liste des thèmes et sujets arrêtés.

Chacun des thèmes et sujets sera doté d'un responsable ou *organizer* (qui pourra s'adjointre un co-organisateur "junior"). Les organismes membres sont invités à adresser leurs propositions de noms d'organisateurs et d'auteurs de communication. 1. **Ouverture** :  
Le président, R. Feenstra, ouvre la séance et salue plus particulièrement les nouveaux membres, Laurence Brockliss de la Grande Bretagne, Willem Frijhoff des Pays-Bas et Serge Lusignan du Canada.
2. **Procès-verbal de la réunion précédente** :  
La Commission approuve à l'unanimité le procès-verbal de la réunion qui s'est tenue à Madrid, le 31 août 1990.
3. **Statuts** :  
Le président fait un bref commentaire sur les motifs de la modification des statuts. La proposition de la Commission ad hoc est approuvé à l'unanimité. (Le texte arrêté est joint à ce procès-verbal, annexe 1).
4. **Rapport financier** :
  - 4.1. A la demande du président, Madame De Ridder, secrétaire général et trésorier, présente le rapport financier pour les années 1990 et 1991. (Une copie est annexée à ce procès-verbal, annexe 2). Le rapport ne donne lieu à aucun commentaire; il est approuvé à l'unanimité.
  - 4.2. L'augmentation de la cotisation du CISH sera probablement décidée à Prague en septembre 1992 et entrera en vigueur en 1993. Le bureau propose une cotisation par membre individuel de 50 FS, ce qui donnera une augmentation du total des revenus parce que jusqu'ici on payait une cotisation par pays de 60 FS. Quelques membres préfèrent le système actuel de cotisation par pays. Après une discussion à ce sujet, il est décidé de maintenir le système d'une cotisation par pays représenté, avec une augmentation de 60 FS à 80 FS à partir de 1993.

pour ce pays; elle est au service de Trinity College Dublin tout en étant de nationalité allemande. Aucun autre membre présent ne se déclare convaincu par l'argument de M. Gabriel. M. Verger constate que dans ces conditions, il n'y a aucune raison de ne pas maintenir le vote déjà acquis à la majorité en faveur de M. Farge. La majorité des membres présents est du même avis que M. Verger et le président déclare que M. Farge est élu. M. Gabriel quitte la réunion.

- 5.3. Après une discussion, les membres se déclarent d'accord avec la proposition du Bureau de donner corps à la qualité de membre associé. La secrétaire générale se charge de la réalisation de ce projet.

#### 6. Congrès de Montréal en 1995

La secrétaire générale a reçu quatre propositions par écrit pour le thème du prochain congrès quinquennal du CISH. M. Gieysztor a proposé "Resources of the University"; MM. Domonkos et Gabriel proposent "Institutional and intellectual ties between the Universities of the Old and the New World"; Mme Robinson a proposé "Europeaness of University Learning".

Le sujet proposé de M. Gieysztor est jugé trop proche de celui de San Francisco (1975). Les deux autres sujets rencontrent l'un et l'autre beaucoup d'adhésions. On propose de les combiner. Est retenu : "L'institution universitaire et les savoirs", c.-à-d. la relation entre le savoir universitaire et le monde extérieur. De son côté, M. Fletcher propose un autre sujet "Social and economic relations between the university institutions and the environment" qui n'est pas retenu.

Quant à la procédure à suivre pour le choix des rapporteurs, on discute des avantages et désavantages des systèmes appliqués aux congrès précédents : candidature libre (Stuttgart) ou invitation par les organisateurs (Madrid). Aucun des systèmes n'obtient une préférence inconditionnelle.

Le président et la secrétaire générale sont chargés de s'occuper de la réalisation du congrès de Montréal, en collaboration avec MM. Lusignan et Verger, en tenant compte des observations émises par les membres présents.

#### 7. Activités futures

- 7.1. A la veille de la réunion, la secrétaire générale a reçu une invitation définitive de M. Romano pour tenir un colloque à Messine en automne 1993. M. Romano propose comme thème " Università ed Europa. Le istituzioni universitarie dal medioevo ai giorni nostri: struttura, organizzazione, funzionamento" et comme date 30 septembre-5 octobre 1993. (Les détails de cette proposition sont contenus dans l'annexe 3 de ce procès-verbal.) Quelques réserves sont formulées quant à la date. La secrétaire générale demandera à M. Romano si un changement est encore possible. On accepte l'invitation avec gratitude.

- 7.2. Deux propositions pour d'autres réunions ont été faite oralement pendant le congrès de Dublin : de M. Brizzi pour un congrès à Sassari sur les petites universités en mai 1994 et de M. Klinge pour un congrès à Helsinki sur les universités scandinaves et baltes dans le contexte européen en septembre 1994. Les deux propositions sont accueillies favorablement mais la date proposée par M. Brizzi est jugée peu opportune à cause de la proximité du congrès de Messine. On demandera à M. Brizzi si ce congrès serait possible en mai 1996. La secrétaire générale se mettra en contact avec M. Klinge pour élaborer le projet d'Helsinki.
8. Le bulletin d'information et le répertoire des historiens des universités sont liés étroitement aux membres associés et seront réalisés à la suite de l'acceptation de membres associés. La secrétaire générale est chargée de la réalisation de ce projet. Par faute de temps, la discussion sur un inventaire (compendium) des sources d'archives universitaires est remise à une date ultérieure.
9. Rapports des activités nationales  
Aucun rapport n'a été remis au secrétariat. M. Maffei annonce le décès des MM. Nicolini et Piana. Il demande une minute de silence à la mémoire des deux collègues décédés.
10. L'activité du CRE  
Le premier volume, sur le Moyen Age, de A History of the University in Europe a paru en décembre 1991 chez Cambridge U.P., le second volume (1500-1800) suivra dans le courant de l'année 1993. Le troisième (1800-1945) et le quatrième (de 1945 à nos jours) volumes sont en préparation. La traduction du premier volume en allemand, portugais et espagnol est en cours.



Voici, enfin, le procès-verbal de l'assemblée générale de Dublin, ainsi que ses annexes.

En ce qui concerne le colloque de Messine en octobre 1993, les réactions de votre part ont été assez maigres. Lors de congrès préalables, les membres de la Commission ont expressément demandé d'être consultés pour le choix des rapporteurs. Tenant compte du résultat assez pauvre de notre enquête, M. Romano et la secrétaire générale seront obligés de faire des démarches eux-mêmes.

Comme il a été convenu à Dublin, M. Lusignan, M. Verger et la secrétaire générale se sont réunis à Paris pour préparer le congrès de Montréal. Le thème du congrès est : "Transferts de savoir et création d'universités". M. Lusignan s'occupera du déroulement des préparatifs. Il rédigera un texte qui servira pour l'appel de communication. Il va de soi que vous recevrez personnellement ce texte et que vous êtes libre de vous présenter comme rapporteur.

Sous ce pli, vous trouverez trois curricula vitae de candidats qui sont présentés pour devenir membre de la Commission. Suite aux décisions prises à Dublin, MM. García y García et Maffei ont pris contact avec des collègues du Mexique et du Vatican (voir p.v. § 5.1). Selon M. Maffei, le père Boyle est disposé à devenir membre de la Commission comme représentant du Vatican. En ce qui concerne l'Amérique Latine, selon M.
