MINUTES OF MEETING OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF YOUNGSTOWN STATE UNIVERSITY

Tod Administration Building Friday, October 9, 1987

Pursuant to Resolution YR 1988-11 and to Notices mailed on the 25th day of September, 1987 by the Secretary to the Board to each Trustee, a copy of which precedes these Minutes (with copies to the President of the University, the President of the YSU Chapter of OEA, to Alan R. Kretzer, Special Counsel appointed by the Attorney General of Ohio, and to the Executive Director of YSU Alumni Association) a regular meeting (one-hundred and twentieth) of the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University convened in the Board Room in the Tod Administration Building.

Eight Trustees were present at the meeting, to-wit: Mrs. Elizabeth DeLuca, Paul M. Dutton, Dr. John F. Geletka, William J. Lyden, Mrs. Emily P. Mackall, Richard P. McLaughlin, Michael I. Monus, and Dr. Earnest Perry. Absent was Earl W. Brauninger.

Also present were Dr. Neil D. Humphrey, President, Dr. Bernard T. Gillis, Provost, Dr. Taylor Alderman, Vice-President Personnel Services, Dr. Lawrence E. Looby, Vice-President for Institutional Advancement, Dr. Charles A. McBriarty, Vice-President, Student Services, Edmund J. Salata, Executive Director of Facilities, Philip A. Snyder, Director, News Service, Franklin S. Bennett, Secretary to the Board of Trustees, and Patricia Martin, Secretary o the President. Also present were approximately 50 persons, including deans, members of the faculty, students and members of the news media.

Dr. Earnest Perry, Chairman of the Board, presided.

Item I - Proof of Notice Meeting

Evidence was available to establish that due notice of the meeting had been mailed on September 25, 1987 by the Secretary, to each of the nine Trustees and to the President, and that copies had also been mailed to Dr. Paul Dalbec, President of the YSU Chapter of OEA, to Alan R. Kretzer, Special Counsel, Thomas Thompson, President YSU-ACE, and to Mrs. Patricia

Tkacik Hanna, Director YSU Alumni Association. Such evidence precedes these Minutes.

ITEM II - Minutes of Meetings Held on June 19, 1987 and August 29, 1987

Copies of the drafts of the Minutes of the Meetings of the Board of Trustees held on June 19, 1987 and August 29, 1987 had been mailed to each Trustee, to the President, Provost, Vice-President Personnel Services, the Executive Director of Facilities, and the Special Counsel.

There being no additions or corrections, the minutes were accepted as mailed.

ITEM III - Recommendations of the President of the University

Dr. Humphrey recommended that two Resolutions be adopted by the Trustees.

After a Motion which was made by Mr. Lyden and seconded by Mr. Dutton, had received the affirmative vote or each Trustee present, the Chairman declared the following Resolution duly adopted:

a. Resolution to Ratify Faculty/Staff Appointments

WHEREAS, the <u>Policies of the Board of Trustees</u> direct the President to appoint such employees as are necessary to effectively carry out the operation of the University; and

WHEREAS, new appointments have been made subsequent to the June 19, 1987 regular meeting of the Board of Trustees; and

WHEREAS, such appointments are in accordance with the 1987-88 Budget and with the University policy on Equal Employment Opportunity;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby ratify and confirm the YR 1988 12

appointments as listed in Exhibit A attached hereto.

(b) Resolution Accepting Gifts

After a Motion, which was made by Mrs. Mackall and seconded by Mrs. DeLuca, had received the affirmative vote of each Trustee present, the Chairman declared the following Resolution duly adopted:

Resolution Accepting Gifts

WHEREAS, Resolution YR 1980-34 provides that the President shall compile a list of gifts to the University for each meeting of the Board of Trustees and present the list accompanied by his recommendation for action by the Board;

WHEREAS, the President has reported that the gifts as listed in Exhibit B attached hereto are being held pending acceptance and he recommends their acceptance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby accept these gifts on behalf of Youngstown State University and instructs the President to acknowledge such acceptance to the donors and to express our gratitude for their generosity to the University.

ITEM IV - Reports of the President and Other Officers of the University

1. Comments of President Humphrey

Dr. Humphrey stated that the University was releasing enrollment statistics that would show a total enrollment of 14,675 students for the fall term. He complemented Dr. G.L. Mears, Director of the Budget and his staff for the accuracy of their projections concerning enrollment. They were off by only 55 students, less than one percent.

2. <u>Dr. Gillis, Provost, reported concerning the</u> following matters.

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YR 1988-13

A. Ohio Board of Regents Approves Mall Management Program.

At its meeting on September 11, 1987, the Ohio Board of Regents approved the Mall Management Program. This will allow immediately offering this new major and advertising its availability.

B. Reaccreditations in Allied Health Programs.

The Paramedic program at the University has received notice of renewal of certification until September 7, 1989 from the State Department of Education.

Additionally, the National Accrediting Agency for Clinical Laboratory Sciences is recommending continued accreditation to April 30, 1989 of the Medical Laboratory Technician - Associate Degree program to the Committee on Allied Health Education and Accreditation at its October 13, 1987 meeting.

C. Restricted Admissions Policies-Allied Health.

Through efforts of the Admissions Office and the Allied Health Department, a common set of admissions criteria has been developed for all Allied Health Programs, and criteria has been established for the new Bachelor of Science in Applied Science in Allied Health that begins this fall. These admission criteria have been approved by the department faculty, the Dean, the Provost and the President and will be reported to the Board of Trustees in conformity with Article VIII, Sec. 1.2, Policies of the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University. An attachment was provided each Trustee for criteria.

D. Consortial Ph.D. in Biomedical Sciences.

A consortial arrangement is being proposed by a committee of faculty from each institution to the provosts of the Northeastern Ohio institutions consisting of the University of Akron, Kent State University, the Northeastern Ohio Universities College of Medicine and Youngstown State University. It would produce a joint Ph.D. in Biomedical Sciences. result of recent discussion among the provosts is that the recommendation will be reviewed carefully and again reviewed by the Provosts of Northeastern Ohio before proceeding with any definite plans.

E. North Central Association Reaccreditation Status.

The North Central Association reaccreditation selfstudy is being prepared in draft form and will be circulated to several on-campus groups before final draft is prepared.

F. Faculty Honors, Publications and Recognitions.

Dr. Leslie S. Domonkos, Professor of History, has been awarded a Fulbright-Hays Research Abroad Award. It is for the period March 15 to July 15, 1988. He will simultaneously hold an International Research and Exchange Board Fellowship during his research on a monograph in Hungary, Austria, and Italy. He is on a Faculty Improvement Leave this academic year.

The Kent State University Press has published a book on "Salmon P. Chase: A Life in Politics," written by Dr. Frederick J. Blue, a Professor of History at Youngstown State University.

Dr. Robert L. Rollin, an Associate Professor of Music in the Dana School of Music, has received an American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers Award for the 1987-88 year. This is the seventh consecutive year Dr. Rollin has received the ASCAP Award.

3. <u>Dr. Scriven Assistant Provost reported concerning</u> the following matters.

Dr. James A. Scriven, Assistant Provost reported to the Board on two University programs:

- (a) The Career Planning Program, and
- (b) Enhancement Program for Non-Traditional Students.

Dr. Scriven then introduced a slide pictorial presentation on these programs. He concluded by saying that the slide presentation had been shown to two national meetings of Admissions Officers and had been well received. It has also been shown many times to local adult groups and these groups have related well to it.

4. <u>Dr. Looby, Vice President for Institutional</u>
<u>Advancement, reported concerning the following</u>
<u>matter.</u>

WYSU-FM is in the midst of its fall membership campaign and as of this date \$7,200.00 has been raised.

5. Mr. Salata, Executive Director of Facilities, reported concerning the following matters.

A. Industrial History Museum

Bids will be received and opened on December 14, 1987 for this project.

B. Wick Pollock Inn

This project is proceeding on schedule and completion is expected in June of 1988. First floor block walls are up to level and pre-cast floors are expected next week. The new building shell is expected to be completed by December, 1988. In the existing building all demolition necessary has been completed and all plumbing has been roughed in.

C. Outdoor Alarm System

This project cost is approximately \$85,000.00 and the project is now complete. We will have a full service test of the system on October 23, 1987 at 1:30 p.m. This test will be very loud and will be heard by the entire community.

D. Tennis Courts

Seventy-five per cent of this project is complete. The weather has not been helpful but completion should come in two or three weeks.

E. Bliss Hall Renovation

Bids were received for this project on August 18, 1987 and came in substantially over the estimate and over the budget. The project will be rebid and these are expected to be received October 15, 1987.

ITEM V - Reports of the Committees of the Board

1. Personnel Relations

Mrs. Mackall reported that the Personnel Relations Committee was recommending three Resolutions for adoption by the Board. She then read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

a. Resolution Concerning Salary Reduction Pick-Up

WHEREAS, all University faculty and staff who are enrolled in either of the State retirement systems currently participates in the "Salary Reduction Pick-Up," whereby the University reduces the employee's salary by the amount of the contribution to the retirement system, and with the funds makes an employer contribution of an identical amount to the system, with the exceptions of University Law Enforcement Officer Supervisors (Sergeants) in Campus Security; and

YR 1988-14

WHEREAS, it is deemed appropriate to extend this benefit to Sergeants;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University implements a "Salary Reduction Pick-Up" for Sergeants in Campus Security effective October 11, 1987.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board reaffirms its authorization of Resolution 1985-9, passed on August 24, 1984, as approving the implementation of a "Salary Reduction Pick-Up" for the President of the University and for all Professional/Administrative staff enrolled in the State Teachers Retirement System, effective July 1, 1987.

The Motion was seconded by Mrs. DeLuca and, after discussion, received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairman declared the Motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Mrs. Mackall next read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

b. <u>Resolution Concerning Personnel Responsibilities</u>

WHEREAS, reallocation of responsibilties relating to payroll administration and collective bargaining was made effective July 1, 1987; YR 1988-15

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University that Articles I.4 and I.8 of the Policies of the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University be and are hereby revised to reflect the provisions specified in Exhibits C and D attached hereto.

The Motion was seconded by Dr. Geletka and, after discussion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairman declared the Motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Mrs. Mackall next read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

c. <u>Resolution Concerning Faculty Who Have Earned</u> <u>Advanced Degrees</u>

WHEREAS, a number of University faculty completed all requirements for earned doctoral or master's degrees since September 14, 1986 and prior to September 15, 1987; and

YR 1988-16

WHEREAS, faculty members who completed earned doctoral or master's degrees are entitled to salary increases, in accordance with the provisions of Article 4 of the YSU/YSU-OEA Agreement;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University hereby ratifies the salary increases for these faculty members displayed on Exhibit E attached hereto.

The Motion was seconded by Mr. McLaughlin and, after discussion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairman declared the Motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

2. Building and Property Committee

Mr. Lyden reported that the Building and Property Committee had no report.

3. Budget and Finance

Mr. Monus reported that the Budget and Finance Committee was recommending six Resolutions for adoption

by the Board. He then read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

a. Resolution to Amend the Budget for the Academic Challenge, Research Challenge, and Productivity
Improvement Challenge Programs

WHEREAS, prudent management required the adoption of budgets for the Academic Challenge Program, the Research Challenge Program, and the Productivity Improvement Challenge Program based on estimated end-of-year balances and without knowledge of the level of state support; and

YR 1988-17

WHEREAS, actual end-of-year balances are now known and state funding has been determined;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees does hereby approve the amended budgets for the Academic Challenge Program, the Research Challenge Program, and the Productivity Improvement Challenge Program as shown in the attached Exhibits F, G, and H.

The Motion was seconded by Mrs. Mackall and, after discussion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairman declared the Motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Mr. Monus next read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

Resolution to Authorize Transfer of Funds From the Educational and Associated Operations Fund Unallocated Reserve

WHEREAS, the FY 1987-88 budget adopted by the Board of Trustees requires Board of Trustees approval of all transfers of funds from the Unallocated Reserves; and

YR 1988-18

WHEREAS, it is prudent to provide adequate insurance coverage for the University employees and physical assets and the costs for providing insurance coverage continue to increase; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that the University participate in observance of the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution and although a generous gift has been received to cover some of the expense, additional money will be required;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby authorize and direct the transfer of \$30,000 from the Unallocated Reserve, Educational and Associated Operations (Fund One) to the General Insurance account and \$11,880 to the Public Events account.

The Motion was seconded by Mrs. DeLuca and, after discussion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairman declared the Motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Mr. Monus next read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

c. Resolution to Amend the Intercollegiate Athletics Budget

WHEREAS, a generous gift has been received from Mr. Edward DeBartolo, Jr. for the purpose of supporting a drug testing program for athletes; and YR 1988-19

WHEREAS, the YSU/APAS <u>Agreement</u> provides for salary increases for all part-time professional/administrative positions; and

WHEREAS, other adjustments of the Athletic Department budget are believed desirable;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby authorize the transfer of \$65,959 from the Intercollegiate Athletics Contingency Reserve to the Intercollegiate Athletics department budget, the use of the \$25,000 gift from Mr. DeBartolo, and the use of \$11,390 of scholarship funds restricted to athletics and does hereby approve the amended revenue projection and the amended departmental budget as shown in Exhibits I and J.

The Motion was seconded by Mr. McLaughlin and, after discussion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairman declared the Motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Mr. Monus next read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

d. Resolution to Amend the Scholarships and Financial Aid Department Budget

WHEREAS, funds are provided by the Federal government to support the processing of student applications for financial assistance; and

YR 1988-20

WHEREAS, there is a demonstrated need for additional staff in the Scholarships and Financial Aid department;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby approve and authorize an increase of \$8,450.00 in the amount of Federal Student Aid Processing funds for the purpose of increasing the Scholarships and Financial Aid department staff by .5 FTE and does hereby approve the amended budget for the department as shown in the attached Exhibit K.

The Motion was seconded by Mrs. Mackall and, after discussion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairman declared the Motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Mr. Monus next read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

e. Resolution Concerning Fedor Bequest

WHEREAS, Lucille G. Fedor of Campbell, Ohio, bequeathed in excess of \$300,000 to Youngstown State University and her will stated". . .I direct that the trustees of said university establish a fund to be known as the John W. Fedor and Lucille G. Fedor Scholarship Fund (and) I direct said trustees to use the income from said scholarship fund for scholarships for worthy students, with

YR 1988-21

the trustees of said university to have sole discretion as to the requirements for the payment of scholarships from said fund"; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. Fedor was an elementary school teacher and Mr. Fedor was an elementary school principal; and

WHEREAS, it is believed socially desirable to encourage university students who are preparing to become elementary school teachers;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby direct that the money received from Mrs. Fedor's estate shall be deposited to the University's endowment fund, the principal to be invested in conformity with University policy, and the income to be for one or more annual graduate scholarships for graduate students Elementary Education; all additional income shall be used to provide scholarships to undergraduates in Elementary Education.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the scholarship recipients shall be selected by the Scholarship Committee of the School of Education, with the assistance of the Dean of the School of Education, from the student applicants for such scholarship judged to be worthy by virtue of superior scholarship and financial need.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the JOHN W. FEDOR AND LUCILLE G. FEDOR SCHOLARSHIP FUND scholarships shall be so divided as to preclude awards of more than the annual tuition but it is intended that the awards not be less than an amount equal to one-half the annual tuition.

The Motion was seconded by Mrs. DeLuca and, after discussion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairman declared the Motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

Mr. Monus next read and moved for adoption the following Resolution:

f. Resolution Concerning Sidney Rigelhaupt Bequest

WHEREAS, the University has received \$40,000 from the Estate of the late Judge Sidney Rigelhaupt; and

YR 1988-22

WHEREAS, the will does not direct the use of these monies;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University does hereby direct that this bequest be designated as a fund functioning as an endowment to be titled THE JUDGE SIDNEY RIGELHAUPT ENDOWMENT FUND.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that until changed by this Board of Trustees, the annual income of the endowment shall be used for support of the Center for Human Services Development of the Public Service Institute of Youngstown State University.

The Motion was seconded by Mr. McLaughlin and after discussion received the affirmative vote of all Trustees present. The Chairman declared the Motion carried and the Resolution adopted.

4. Student Affairs

Mrs. Mackall stated that the Student Affairs Committee had no report.

5. Academic Affairs

Mrs. DeLuca stated that the Academic Affairs Committee had no report.

6. Public Services

Dr. Geletka stated that the Public Services Committee had no report.

Mr. Dutton reminded the Trustees of forthcoming events to be held on campus during November celebrating the two hundredth anniversary of the United States Constitution and encouraged all present to participate in these events.

Policies of the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University

ARTICLE I: ADMINISTRATION OF THE UNIVERSITY

Section 4. Vice President--Personnel Services

The Vice President-Personnel Services shall be employed by the Board upon recommendation of the President and shall serve at the discretion of the President. He shall hold a professional/administrative appointment subject to the stated terms of a contract of employment.

The Vice President-Personnel Services is the personnel officer for all University personnel except student employees and is the appointing authority for all classified civil service personnel. He shall provide leadership in the development and implementation of University personnel policies, administer-performance-evaluation systems, be-responsible-for-payroll-preparation, negotiate-and administer-eollectively-bargained-employment-contracts, and perform such-other-duties-as-may-be-assigned-by-the-President AND ADMINISTER PERFORMANCE EVALUATION SYSTEMS. HE SHALL SERVE AS THE UNIVERSITY'S CHIEF NEGOTIATOR UNLESS AN ALTERNATE CHIEF NEGOTIATOR HAS BEEN DESIGNATED BY THE PRESIDENT, AND HE SHALL ADMINISTER COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENTS. HE SHALL PERFORM SUCH OTHER DUTIES AS MAY BE ASSIGNED BY THE PRESIDENT.

Policies of the Board of Trustees of Youngstown State University

ARTICLE I: ADMINISTRATION OF THE UNIVERSITY

Section 8. GONTROLLER EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE

The Gentreller EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE shall be employed by the Board upon the recommendation of the President and shall serve at the discretion of the President. He shall hold a professional/-administrative appointment subject to the stated terms of a contract of employment.

The Gontroller EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE shall be responsible to the President for the proper accounting and reporting of all University funds, payment of all obligations except-payroll, collection of all accounts receivable, and investment of University funds AND THE ADMINISTRATION OF PAYROLL. The Gontroller EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF FINANCE shall issue all bank checks upon the University's accounts, which checks shall be countersigned by the President, and shall serve as "Chief Fiscal Officer" when such designation is required.
