My dear Mr. Kirwan:

This is in further reference to your letter of March 18, 1940, addressed to the Adjutant General's Office, War Department, Washington, D. C., in which you make inquiry on behalf of Mr. William J. Adams of 1808 Stewart Avenue, Youngstown, Chie, ecnoeraing payment of the bill of Dr. A. W. Prepper, amounting to \$75.00 covering unauthorised dental services consisting of x-rays, extraction of all teeth and the construction of two artificial dentures.

Under existing regulations payment of the cost of medical or dental treatment precured through private agencies without prior authority from this Administration may not be allowed unless such treatment was required in an emergency for the relief of a service connected compensable disability, when Government Facilities were not feasibly available and delay would have been hazardous. All of these conditions must be present and in the absence of any one payment may not be allowed.

The records of this effice fail to show that claim for compensation has been filed by Mr. Adams or that service connection has been established for any condition. Under such circumstances there is no way in which the cost of Dr. Propper's services may be assumed by this Administration.

Tour interest in this case is appreciated and it is regretted that a more favorable reply may not be made.
