The Commencement Speaker

HARTFORD N. GUNN, JR.

Founding executive and first president of the Public Broadcasting Service (PBS), Hartford N. Gunn, Jr. has been employed exclusively within the public broadcasting community throughout his 28-year professional career.

Gunn, who was born in Port Washington, New York, received his bachelor of arts degree from Harvard College and his master of business administration degree from the Harvard Graduate School of Business Administration. He holds a bachelor of science degree from the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy.

Joining public broadcasting in 1951 as director of operations and assistant general manager of Boston-based WGBH-FM, Gunn was instrumental in the formation of one of America's earliest and most successful public television stations, WGBH-TV. It was during this period that he assumed the chairmanship of the board of the Educational Television Station (ETS) Division of the National Association of Educational Broadcasters, the organization which represented American public television until 1973. Gunn has served as president of PBS since 1970.

Throughout his career Gunn has been a firm supporter of freedom and autono-

my for local public television stations. Among his numerous contributions to the industry is the development of the concept of regional networks in public television. He worked extensively for the passage of the Public Broadcasting Act of 1967, which created the corporation for public broadcasting and paved the way for federal funding assistance to the medium.

Vice chairman of PBS since 1975, Gunn is currently responsible for the future planning of the system. He has recently served as director of an exhaustive study of public television's needs and expectations for the 1980's—a study vital to current efforts to reshape PBS's structure and operations.

Gunn holds honorary doctorates in Human Letters from Northeastern University (1967) and Boston College (1970), and in Laws from Central Michigan University (1975). He was the recipient of the 1973 Ralph Lowell Memorial Medal for Outstanding Contributions to Public Broadcasting, the medium's highest honor. In 1977 he was presented the Distinguished Service Award of the National Association of Educational Broadcasters. In the same year, he was named recipient of the Central Educational Network's Award for Exceptional Service to Public Broadcasting.

ACADEMIC REGALIA AND CEREMONY

The gowns, hoods, and caps worn in academic ceremonies today are relics of clothing worn in medieval times by students and professors. In the early universities—Bologna, Paris, Oxford—the undergraduate students had no prescribed academic dress but wore their usual clerical or ecclesiastical habits. The professors wore more colorful academic regalia than their modern day descendants. Probably the gowns and hoods were worn for warmth in the unheated halls where the lectures were delivered. From the sixteenth century on, there is a change to somber black and it is only in the hoods worn in academic processions today that the warmth and color of medieval academic pageantry is retained.

The hoods representing degrees granted by various colleges and universities have linings (turned to exhibit their hues to the fullest advantage) in the colors of the granting institutions. In addition, the facing of the hood represents by its color the discipline in which the degree has been granted: white for arts, letters, or humanities; golden yellow for science; purple for law; green for medicine; lemon yellow for library science; orange for engineering; drab for commerce or business; light blue for education; pink for music; brown for fine arts; apricot for nursing; dark blue for philosophy; scarlet for theology; citron for social work; sage green for physical education. It is possible, also, to determine from the length of the hoods the type of degree held by the wearer—quite long for the doctor's degree, medium for the master's, short for the bachelor's.

Since 1895, in the United States, the colors and types of caps and gowns have been largely standardized; in 1932 the code was revised to some extent, and in 1960 it was revised once more. A few American universities have adopted gowns other than black in color, and in European universities there is more diversity in cut and in the cap than prevails in the United States. Trustees and administrators of American colleges and universities, too, may wear regalia

which is different from that commonly worn. The trustees of Youngstown State University wear a specially designed cardinal gown.

The bachelor's gown is worn closed; the master's gown is worn open or closed, depending partly on its tailoring; and the wearer of the doctor's gown has the privilege of wearing it open or closed. The sleeves of the three types of gowns are of different lengths and cuts, and in addition the sleeves of the doctor's gown have three horizontal velvet stripes. The doctor's gown also has vertical facing of velvet in front. The stripes and facing may be either black or in the color representing the field in which the wearer has received the doctorate.

There are different opinions about the origin of the caps worn in academic ceremonies. One view is that the "mortar board" is in actuality adapted from the wooden square used by masons. Another is that it stems from the ecclesiastical or clerical head covering of the medieval period. The tassels worn on the caps may or may not be of the same types. In some institutions all masters' and bachelors' tassels are black; in others the tassels, which are the same as the colors of the facings of the hoods, reflect the degree received. The tassels worn by doctors may be black or gold thread.

There is something of the same adherence to tradition in commencement processions that exists in academic garb, although each institution has the right to adapt the ceremony to its own requirements. The chief marshals lead the line of march, followed by the president, the speaker, trustees, and other members of the party to be seated on the platform. Then follow the faculty and the candidates for degrees. The procession at the end of the ceremony follows the same order.

Recipients of **University Honors** will receive special insignia, consisting of golden honor cords placed around the shoulders.
