Founded in 1908, Youngstown State University originally served 160 students with about a dozen faculty members and provided expanded educational opportunity for all people—store clerks and factory managers, steel industry workers, newly arrived immigrants, women and men, and both part-time and full-time learners.

This progressive spirit guided the development of the institution as it evolved from a YMCA technical institute, later as Youngstown College (1928), then as Youngstown University (1955) and, in 1967, as Youngstown State University, a member of the Ohio public higher education system.

There are more than 420 full-time faculty and 750 professional and support staff members in seven colleges, schools and administrative departments. In partnership with schools and the corporate and non-profit communities, Youngstown State University promotes diversity and excellence in teaching, research, and service to increase the educational attainment and economic and environmental vitality of the region.

Commencement Speaker and Recipient of the Degree Honorary Doctor of the University



Today's commencement speaker, Sanford D. Rivers, has served as commissioner of the Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board since 2004. As commissioner, he oversees the development, implementation, and monitoring of the multi-billion dollar slot-machine industry in the Commonwealth.

Sanford D. Rivers

Mr. Rivers has deep roots in Youngstown

and at Youngstown State University. He grew up on Myrtle Avenue on the city's South Side and graduated from South High School. A business major at YSU, he was also an outstanding football player whose ability as a running back earned him a place in the University's Athletics Hall of Fame. In 1968, Rivers graduated from YSU with a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration.

Shortly after graduating, Rivers began his long and distinguished career with Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh, serving first as assistant director of admissions, then as senior associate director of admissions, and as assistant vice president for enrollment from 1989 to 2004.

When Rivers was selected to head the Pennsylvania Gaming Commission, Gov. Ed Rendell said of him, "Sanford Rivers' name at Carnegie Mellon is synonymous with incorruptibility." Rivers feels his character was molded to great extent as a YSU football player, where he learned, he says, "discipline, conditioning, and fair play. You respect other people and play by the rules of the game."

Rivers kept his passion for football alive during his Carnegie Mellon career, serving for 16 years as an official with the NFL. He worked several championship and playoff games, including Super Bowl XXXIII in 1999. In 2000, Rivers established the Sanford Rivers Endowed Scholarship at the YSU Foundation. The scholarship is awarded annually to a student athlete from the City of Youngstown.

Rivers and his wife, Carroll, have been married for 41 years and live in Churchill, Pennsylvania.



Student Speaker

Today's student commencement speaker is Michael Shaffer, a Youngstown native, who is today receiving a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration with a minor in economics. Like many Youngstown State University students, Shaffer traveled many other roads before returning to YSU to finish his degree.

A 1980 Chaney High School graduate, Shaffer came from what he calls "a typical blue-collar family." His father worked in the steel mills until 1979, when the mills closed in Youngstown. After graduating from high school, Shaffer went directly into the work, world, got married and had his family in place by the age of 22.

For more than 20 years, he worked at different jobs in the Youngstown area, mostly in management positions but soon found out how important a college degree is to career advancement. In 1993, after a divorce, Shaffer began attending YSU. After a year, he realized that raising two children, working two jobs, and going to college full time was untenable, and he took a job out of state.

By 2002, his children were out on their own, but he still had to confront the fact that a college degree was the key to the business career he sought. So Shaffer returned to Youngstown and to Youngstown State University, and today becomes the first person in his family to attend and graduate from college.

Academic Regalia and Ceremony

The gowns, hoods, and caps worn in academic ceremonies today are relics of those worn in medieval times by students and professors. Probably the gowns and hoods were worn for warmth in the unheated halls where lectures were delivered. From the sixteenth century on, somber black garb became the norm, and it is primarily in the hoods worn in academic processions today that the medieval academic pageantry is retained.

The hoods representing graduate degrees granted by various colleges and universi-

ties have linings (turned to exhibit their hues to the fullest advantage) in the colors of the granting institutions. In addition, the facing of the hood represents by its color the discipline in which the degree has been granted: white for arts, letters or humanities; golden yellow for science; purple for law; green for medicine; lemon yellow for library science; orange for engineering; olive for commerce or business; light blue for education; pink for music; brown for fine arts; apricot for nursing; dark blue for philosophy; scarlet for theology; citron for social work; sage green for physical education.

There are different opinions about the origin of the caps worn in academic ceremonies. One view is that the "mortar board" is in actuality adapted from the wooden square used by masons. Another is that it stems from the ecclesiastical or clerical head covering of the medieval period.

There is something of the same adherence to tradition in commencement processions that exists in academic garb, although each institution has



the right to adapt the ceremony to its own requirement. The faculty leads the line of march followed by the candidates for degrees. Then follow the chief marshals, the president, speaker, trustees, deans, and other members of the party to be seated on the platform.

Recipients of University Honors receive golden honor cords placed around the shoulders. University Scholars wear a specially minted medallion on a red ribbon to denote their academic achievement.

The Presidential Medallion

President Sweet wears a one-of-a-kind medallion that bears an embossment of the Youngstown State University seal on each of the small elements and on the large central piece. On the back of the central medallion are engraved the names of the University's five past presidents and Dr. Sweet.

The presidential medallion was designed and created out of sterling and bronze by Wendell August Forge of Grove City, Pennsylvania. Dr. Sweet is the first president to wear this medallion.

The Youngstown State University Seal

The University's official seal was adopted in 1936. Designed by a student, the seal includes a torch, quills, wings, a globe, and the Latin words animus liberatus. In simple terms, those words summarize the transformation—or liberation that occurs on this campus countless times each day. In English, they are translated *The Mind Freed*, or *The Spirit Freed*.
