Founded in 1908, Youngstown State University originally served 160 students with about a dozen faculty members and provided expanded educational opportunity for all people—store clerks and factory managers, steel industry workers, newly arrived immigrants, women and men, and both part-time and full-time learners.

This progressive spirit guided the development of the institution as it evolved from a YMCA technical institute, later as Youngstown College (1928), then as Youngstown University (1955) and, in 1967, as Youngstown State University, a member of the Ohio public higher education system.

Today, Youngstown State University is a leading comprehensive university, serving more than 12,800 full- and part-time students with 120 undergraduate programs, 40 master's degree programs and a doctorate in education. There are more than 420 full-time faculty and 750 professional and support staff members in seven colleges, schools and administrative departments.

In partnership with schools and the corporate and non-profit communities, Youngstown State University promotes diversity and excellence in teaching, research, and service to increase the educational attainment and economic and environmental vitality of the region.

## Commencement Speaker and Recipient of the Degree Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters



Thomas J. Cavalier

Today's commencement speaker, Thomas J. Cavalier, is chairman, president and CEO of Butler Wick Corp. and its subsidiary, Butler, Wick & Co., Inc. He also serves on the board of Butler Wick Trust Company, a Butler Wick Corp. subsidiary. On August 9, Mr. Cavalier was named Youngstown State University's Distinguished Citizen for 2007, one of

the highest honors given by the University. For twentyseven years, the Distinguished Citizen Award has been given to an area leader who has rendered exceptional service to the greater community.

Following graduation from Youngstown State University in 1976, Mr. Cavalier began his career with Butler, Wick & Co., Inc. and has served in his current position since September of 1985. Since Mr. Cavalier assumed leadership of the company, Butler Wick has formed Butler Wick Trust Company, Butler Wick Investment Management Group, Butler Wick Capital Markets Group, and Butler Wick Insurance Group. Butler Wick Corp., through its two subsidiaries, has 200 employees in 19 offices throughout Ohio and Pennsylvania. In August 1999, Butler Wick Corp. became a subsidiary of United Community Financial Corp., a bank holding company. Mr. Cavalier serves on the board of United Community Financial Corp.

In addition to his numerous professional affiliations, Mr. Cavalier has also served the community in many capacities. He is chair of the board of the Youngstown State University Foundation and is a member of the board of University Housing Corp. In 2005, the YSU Board of Trustees nominated Mr. Cavalier as the YSU representative to the board of Northeastern Ohio Universities College of Medicine (NEOUCOM). He is currently vice chair of that board and chair of the Finance, Fiscal Policy and Investment Committee. He currently serves and is a past president of the board of the Butler Institute of American Art and is a board member of the Tri-County Regional Make-A-Wish Foundation. In 2002, Mr. Cavalier served as the campaign chair of the Youngstown/Mahoning Valley United Way. His previous community involvement includes membership on the boards of the Youngstown-Warren Regional Chamber of Commerce, the Youngstown Symphony Society, Forum

Health, the Poland Schools Foundation for Educational Excellence, and the Youngstown Central Area Community Improvement Corporation.

Mr. Cavalier and his wife Cristine reside in Canfield and have five children: Dr. Christina Cavalier, Mr. Brian Cavalier, Mr. Christopher (Shirley) Thomas, Mr. Michael Thomas, and Mr. Joseph (Megan) Thomas. They have one grandson, Christopher Thomas.

Erin Bishop is a graduate of Youngstown State University's Community Health BSAS degree program. Today, she receives her Master of Public Health. Ms. Bishop has been a valued parttime faculty member in the Department of Health Professions for the last six years.

Ms. Bishop has been active as a volunteer for

many years with numerous YSU and community organizations. She served for two years as the president of Eta Sigma Gamma, the national health sciences honorary society. She is a member of several community organizations including the Mahoning County Continuum of Care, the Homeless Coalition of Mahoning County, the Coalition on Homelessness and Housing in Ohio, and ACTION, and serves on several ministries with St. Christine's Parish of Youngstown. She also volunteers at the Mahoning Valley Rescue Mission and the Second Harvest Food Bank.

Nationally recognized for her work in diabetes prevention, Ms. Bishop has presented at seven professional national conferences as a Team Leader of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Bureau of Primary Health Care National Health Disparities Collaborative. ## Academic Regalia and Ceremony

The gowns, hoods, and caps worn in academic ceremonies today are relics of those worn in medieval times by students and professors. Probably the gowns and hoods were worn for warmth in the unheated halls where lectures were delivered. From the sixteenth century on, somber black garb became the norm, and it is primarily in the hoods worn in academic processions today that the medieval academic pageantry is retained.

The hoods representing graduate degrees granted by various colleges and universi-

ties have linings (turned to exhibit their hues to the fullest advantage) in the colors of the granting institutions. In addition, the facing of the hood represents by its color the discipline in which the degree has been granted: white for arts, letters or humanities; golden yellow for science; purple for law; green for medicine; lemon yellow for library science; orange for engineering; olive for commerce or business; light blue for education; pink for music; brown for fine arts; apricot for nursing; dark blue for philosophy; scarlet for theology; citron for social work; sage green for physical education.

There are different opinions about the origin of the caps worn in academic ceremonies. One view is that the "mortar board" is in actuality adapted from the wooden square used by masons. Another is that it stems from the ecclesiastical or clerical head covering of the medieval period.

There is something of the same adherence to tradition in commencement processions that exists in academic garb, although each institution has



the right to adapt the ceremony to its own requirement. The faculty leads the line of march followed by the candidates for degrees. Then follow the chief marshals, the president, speaker, trustees, deans, and other members of the party to be seated on the platform.

Recipients of University Honors receive golden honor cords placed around the shoulders. University Scholars wear a specially minted medallion on a red ribbon to denote their academic achievement.

#### The Presidential Medallion

President Sweet wears a one-of-a-kind medallion that bears an embossment of the Youngstown State University seal on each of the small elements and on the large central piece. On the back of the central medallion are engraved the names of the University's five past presidents and Dr. Sweet.

The presidential medallion was designed and created out of sterling and bronze by Wendell August Forge of Grove City, Pennsylvania. Dr. Sweet is the first president to wear this medallion.

The Youngstown State University Seal

The University's official seal was adopted in 1936. Designed by a student, the seal includes a torch, quills, wings, a globe, and the Latin words animus liberatus. In simple terms, those words summarize the transformation—or liberation—that occurs on this campus countless times each day. In English, they are translated *The Mind Freed*, or *The Spirit Freed*.
