











Their ultimate decision and the fate of society will depend on the effort they expend in exploring the questions of man and society and also the aid they receive in acquiring a true vision of their society.














Hopefully, they would be guided by those who can see beyond the narrowness of their own needs and the arrogance of age of position and who have discarded the collected myths of their own upbringing.


"Institutions of higher learning are slow to respond to external pressures for change. The above statement was made in my inaugural address when I had the privilege of assuming the presidency of Youngstown State University. It occurred at a time that found us in the dawn of a new era in the University's development which promised to be by far the most challenging and


exciting in its history.

As I reread the 1971 edition of the Neon, published at times when the graduates of 1975 were incoming freshmen and during a time of great social unrest, I was impressed with the manner in which the present student body coped with the many challenges facing them and how they capitalized on many of the opportunities they have had during the past four years. Since 1971, the student body has participated in a transition from limited input into their academic and social life to active participation through its own Student Government and Student Council, as well as, appointments to various University committees.

If you will, take an imaginary tour with me of YSU from Fifth Avenue and continue to its eastern boundary on Wick Avenue. The 1975 graduating seniors and those entering YSU since 1971 have seen a significant change in the physical growth of the University. Gone are Central Hall, the Bookstore, Ford Hall, and many magnificent old homes located on urban renewal property that is not part of YSU. Replacing these structures are the parking deck, the Beeghly Physical Education Center, Kilcawley Center, the Technical and Community College, the Power Plant, the new Library and Bliss Hall. Such a tour is a most interesting mental exercise because without this new construc-

tion, the University would still be a struggling institution, operating in obsolete facilities and unable to attract and hold good faculty staff.

In 1971, the University began to face the slow down of enrollment growth that began during the sixties. Registrations continued to decline until this 1974-75 academic year when a modest upturn took place. The class pictures of the graduating seniors in this 1975 Neon will be significantly different from the 1979 edition, in that, we will probably note that the 1979 graduating seniors will consist of students who are not only generally older when they first attended college, but we will find that they were enrolled primarily on a part-time basis.

It has been truly a challenging and exciting experience for the students who were a part of the 1971-75 era. They should be proud of themselves, for they were dedicated to their beliefs, concerned about the objectives and values of American society, yet they kept striving for a meaningful education.



The Urban Intern Program is jointly funded by the Federal Government, the Youngstown Educational Foundation, and the Public Agency in which a student is placed.



ACI Concrete Canoe Races


Each spring the American Concrete Institute (ACI) cohosts regional concrete canoe races with student chapters of the American Society of Civil Engineers (ASCE). Last year (1973-74), the YSU chapter of ASCE participated for the first time in the Eastern and Midwest Regional races HELD AT THE UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA AND NOTRE DAME UNIVERSITY RESPECTIVELY.

The races were unique in two respects. First, because of the brittle nature of concrete as a building material, i.e., it has virtually no tensile strength;













the construction; handling transporting, and loading of the canoes without developing tensile cracks presents a challenge to the canoe builders. Secondly, the density of concrete itself (unit wt of about 145%) does not lend itself well for use as a floatation device. The races generate a competition among the various civil engineers around the country, and also provide unique design and fabrication problems.

Although last year was the first year YSU Civil Engineering students first got their "feet wet" in the races, their race results were quite impressive — Eastern Regional Semi-Finals and Midwest Regional 6th place.


Dr. Jack Bakos Civil Engineering The Student Development Program at YSU offers academic help and non-academic assistance to students trying to reach their goals in college.

Several services are offered which aid students in developing themselves. Academic tutoring in all subjects, a Math Lab, and a Reading Lab are available to those who meet the program's criteria. The Special English Composition Project, in conjunction with the English Department, offers assistance to students who need more individualized attention than is available in larger classes. Peer counselors work with students on a one-to-one basis to help students in adjusting to

college life and learning about campus resources. A campus-wide tutorial service operates through Student Development for any YSU student upon request.

The program is open to anyone but offers top priority to older students, Veterans, the handicapped, those who have low ACT scores, and to







those who live in rural and Appalachian areas.


Funded by a grant from the Ohio Board of Regents and by YSU, no fees are charged.

The director of the program, Malcolm J. Costa, is assisted by graduate and undergraduate students.




THE JAMBAR HAS NO SEX BARRIERS


Contrary to sexist rumor, "disstaff" has not thus far converted the traditional paper into one with a "Tales of Wonder-Woman" theme.

of Bob Woodward and Carl Berstein has been removed from the editorial office. One of Clare Booth Luce now hangs there instead.















The Penguin Review Files

Perception is the cognitive realization of sensation; it is an unceasing process of mind and environment interacting to produce, for lack of a better term, knowledge. It's a simple one-on-one correspondence, and traditionally, it produces in the individual a localized reality. However, technology has, with a proliferation of recording devices, freed the mind from its dependence on the immediate environment for its orientation. The result is a continuum of multiple realities-interfused, overlapping, and, oftentimes, conflicting. Ironically, 20th century man is attempting to make some semblance out of this

complex web of information by more diligently and precisely recording and programming the world around him. Tongue and cheek, we may call this race to record the DATA GAME.

Data, in itself, is unintelligible substance—it's just there, like a telephone pole; to be useful, it must be linked with the next pole, through a system of relays, to produce a MESSAGE. The application can be as innocent as a NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC portfolio, or as perverse as a Watergate scandal.

Data in no way can be construed as an end in itself, and yet, we tend to treat it as if it were. We collect it, store it, and more often than not, never find reason enough to retrieve it. Of course, having this colossal volume of substance at our fingertips allows us an unusual amount of play in whatever applications we put it to, be it Art, Politics, Marketing, Science, etc. But the danger is that this proliferation of data may eventually inundate us. The game, however, goes on and on.

The race to record surfaces in every segment of society. The stories behind these ventures are oftentimes bizarre and shocking, and the product, in themselves, an unchallengeable statement of our times. The story of the PENGUIN REVIEW FILES, as reconstructed here, is a typical example of the inanity of the DATA GAME.

Data is the bare bones of Art. It is the one constant that underlies what is genuinely creative. Data, in itself, is neither creative or mundane, good or bad. The use to which it is put determines its propriety or lack of such.

Several years ago the PENGUIN REVIEW became immersed in the political end of data collection. The result was an unethical, and nearly illegal, penetration into the public and private lives of officials of the University. The establishment of the PR Files dates back to a special staff meeting on May 14, 1971. The meeting was chaired by then editor, Jim Villiani. The following members and former members of the PR were in attendance: John Missik, Ron Baylukoff, Roger Davis, Bill Hayden, and Rick Stein. The section of transcript reproduced here was taken from a cassette recording buried in the Files.

Hayden: You know damn well the University's out to get us. Baylukoff: They can't touch us. Stein: We can't be sure of that. Davis: Didn't they try to censor us? All we had to do was threaten legal action and they backed down.

Villani: But what about the vote

to cut our budget? Missik: It lost.

Hayden: By one vote.

Missik: One vote is enough. Stein: Next time we may not

have that one vote.

Hayden: I tell you . . .

(unintelligible)

Davis: What we need is in-

surance.

Villani: You mean blackmail. Baylukoff: Must you be so blunt—we're being taped!

Villani: Sorry.

Missik: Administrators have been known to compromise their positions.

Davis: We'd need something

physical.

Baylukoff: A camera and a tape recorder.

Villani: And balls . . .

The decision to establish the File was unanimous. Within a few days members of the PR went diligently to work gathering materials. The data was classified and filed away. The administration never again



came close to dissolving the PR, and the collection of data steadily decreased. The last entry in the File was dated December, 1973. None of the materials were ever used.


Speakers

Nothing classic or traditional catches Flyeron Falco but pure passionate expression for those motions and textures that surround a twentieth century environment.



































Interview with Dean Bleidt: The Greek System at Y.S.U.

Pat Bleidt is the Assistant Dean of Student Affairs at YSU and is the advisor for I.F.C. and Panhellenic Council. In an interview with her I asked her to give her comments on the Greek system at YSU, its purposes, the images it projects, and her suggestions to improve it.

She believes that the primary purpose of fraternities and sororities is to provide an opportunity for individuals to develope inter-personal relationships with others, and to strive for common goals and objectives. It is also important to learn about other life styles through interaction with different people. She feels that an important part of being in a fraternity or sorority is the development of leadership skills and the achievement of high academic standards.


Dean Bleidt believes that there are both positive and negative images projected by the Greeks at Y.S.U., although the latter of the two may not necessarily be intended. She feels that the negative image is the "closed group" barrier that some independents may encounter in situations with the Greeks. She contends that these "cliques" are not intentional, but still Greeks should make more of an effort to include independents in some of their activities.

She goes on to say that the positive images greatly outweigh the negative ones in all aspects. She notes that a person has a great sense of pride in being affliated with a Greek organization. This individual makes a commitment to an organization that he believes in, and tries to excell in everything that he represents.

Dean Bleidt offers many suggestions to help the Greeks; who, at this time, do have some problems to contend with. One of these is declining membership. She feels that recruitment should be the top priority of all the Fraternities and sororities. She says that there should be an all-out and united effort by the Greeks to promote their system on a continuous basis, not just a temporary effort, such as seasonal rush.







The social life is important too, in providing an occasion to escape deadly serious classes,

sterile books, the doldrums of academia.

Dean Bleidt also feels that the Greeks should provide more activities for everyone, and include the Greeks and Independents together in these activities. There should be more publicity, and there should be a joint coordination of the action by the Greeks and the KCPB.

Dean Bleidt says that the Greeks are starting to realize their numbers are getting weaker; but there must be a concern by the Greeks to change things. One way for the Greeks to change things would be for all the Greeks to be more unified and work together as a whole system, not as a fraternity or sorority competing against each other.






On April 12, 1974 Stambaugh Auditorium was the scene of the most important Greek event of the year, GREEK SING.







Women's Gymnastics





















Baseball



Zaluski was also hot on the basepaths, stealing 24 bases in 29 attempts.













Ray Dempsey—Coach





Few people took him seriously when Youngstown State University football coach Rey Dempsey revealed last August that his team's 1974 goal was an NCAA Division II playoff bid.

But they do now!

Dempsey's young Penguin squad came within an eyelash of an unbeaten season, finishing his second season at YSU with an 8-1 record and an NCAA playoff berth against Delaware (10-1)

Building his 1973 offense are five talented freshmen — who have improved greatly as sophomores — Dempsey and his coaching staff have molded a unit which averaged 27







points and 397 yards per game.

Quarterback is the heart of any team and the Penguins have no need for a transplant with 6-foot-5 Cliff Stoudt in command. He has improved with each game — mechanically as well as mentally — completing over 50 per cent of his passes for 1,000 yards this season. He threw three touchdown passes and ran for eight more.

Dempsey favors a solid running attack, however, and he has a dangerous duo in junior fullback Dave Garden and sophomore tailback John Kinch.


The stingy Penguins defense allowed just 83 points and an average of 240 yards per game, while registering eighteen interceptions, 27 quarterback sacks, twelve fumble recoveries and three blocked punts.

Senior defensive end Nazih Banna, defensive tackle Chris Burba, and linebacker Jules Lehman were the steadying forces for this highly skilled outfit, with plenty of support from junior end Mike Sullivan, soph tackle Larry Dannals, junior middle guard Jack Pierson, and surprise linebacker sensation Jerry Tuscano — who cracked the starting


lineup as a freshman.




In all, it added up to a big winner at Youngstown State for a man who refuses to be outworked or outcoached. And the future looks very rosy for Penguin grid faithful.



For the second time this year, a YSU varsity team made it to the NCAA Division II playoffs. This time it was Dom Rosselli's hoopsters, who compiled an impresive 19-9 record.

Playing before the home crowd, the Penguins suffered only three defeats against 13 victories, while on the road, having a rougher time, won six of twelve.

Standouts for the Penguins were freshman Jeff Covington of Washington D.C., leading point man averaging 20.9 per game, and graduating senior Phil Gaston, who averaged 17.8 points per game. Covington, by the way, set a new freshman record as he scored 543 points during the campaign. His most outstanding performance was against Alliance College when he scored 44 points and pulled down 24 rebounds.

The Penguins also racked up some large scores this year against some mediocre teams. YSU beat New Hampshire 121-46, a new single game scoring record, while breaking the century mark four times this season.



















Last year the NATIONAL LAMPOON prepared a parody on the high school yearbook, a la the 1950's. In line with "American Grafetti" and the nostalgia kick of 1973 and 1974, the editors of the LAMPOON produced their satirical commentary on the way things used to be. But last year's nostalgia craze has practically become this year's reality.

1975 at Youngstown State University portrays the way things are. In this ever growing monolitic tribute to academia. the sparks of the student activism of the late 60's have apparently been extinguished. In retrospect, 1970 th- 1972 perhaps marked the peak of "social awareness" (as defined by students of that era), at YSU. Students successfully fought to abolish Homecoming queens, beauty pageants, mascots and other practices bound up with the past. Students also pressed for the institution of the credit/no credit option, an expanded Placement office, a good faith re-evaluation of required courses, expanded University health services, the Free Clinic

And there are others. More secure now in their world-view, they have come to realizations that have helped them to sort out the confusion


and the universal sense of malaise. They have exposed themselves to themselves and others, and have come to meet the challenges of the growing process.

The present has already been heralded as the era of the new academic seriousness; like the Scarecrow in "Oz" we expect that a piece of paper at the end of the line will certify to the world that we are learned.

However, this is not the 1950's. Jobs are scarce as a number of last year's graduates in local mills will attest to. Now the push is for admission to Graduate or Professional schools, not necessarily for the American or fortune, but to avoid the unemployment office. And year after year, decade after decade, speakers at commencement exercises tell the graduates that it's their job to solve the problems facing the







world. And after so many years of raping the Earth, taking the money and running, the hope is that someone might begin to actually do something.

Yearbook staffs are anything but profound people. A yearbook gig is a trip into the absurd, a trip which is rarely made with full knowledge and never full understanding. As in the myth each year the rock is pushed up the mountain only to roll down once more. But out from the depths each one of us says something in what we do, much like each one of you reading these words say something in your own way.

So our mes sage for the graduate is merely the hope that when you leave the womb of academia, you'll step out of your own head for a minute and look at the world where the insanities of racism, wars, hunger, ecological destruction, and human suffering hang heavy in the air. Breathe deep, then do what you will.
