I. Minutes of September 10 were approved.

II. Old Business

- A. Strategic Plan Status. No Report.
- B. Degree Audit Program. Dr. McEwing reported that development is progressing. The manner in which courses are clarified in the inventory needs to be adjusted.

III. New Business

- A. Budget Status. Dr. Gillis has listened to comments from the Chairs. There is no indication that change is needed at this time.
- B. Administrative Searches. The search for a Dean for Arts and Science has not been finalized. The President is not on campus at this time. The search for a Provost has been started and a position description has been submitted for publication.
- C. YSU Transfer Module. The Transfer Module has been finalized. A clean version should have been sent to Columbus by this time.
- D. Course List for High School Students. Deans should reconsider the original lists with an eye to reducing the available offerings.

Dean Ruggles discussed the Distance Learning Program, indicating YSU might be able to offer some future programs through existing cable TV. Post-secondary optional courses might be offered to high school students in this manner in real-time live format. He suggested Deans might solicit faculty members interested in teaching such courses.

- E. Five Year Calendar. A five year calendar from 1992-97 developed by Dr. Yiannaki was distributed. Deans were asked to review dates and look at the revisions for winter and spring schedule of operations for 91-92, 92. Discussion ensued concerning quarter-semester systems and alternatives.
- F. Discussion of problem of evaluating high school records of foreign students. There appears to be a need for a standard system for dealing with such evaluations.

- A. Dr. Kohut will be soliciting reactions to the Looby-McBriarty marketing plan.
- B. Dr. Hotchkiss announced that a teleconference on grant-writing will be held on October 17. Those interested should contact Beth Kushner.
