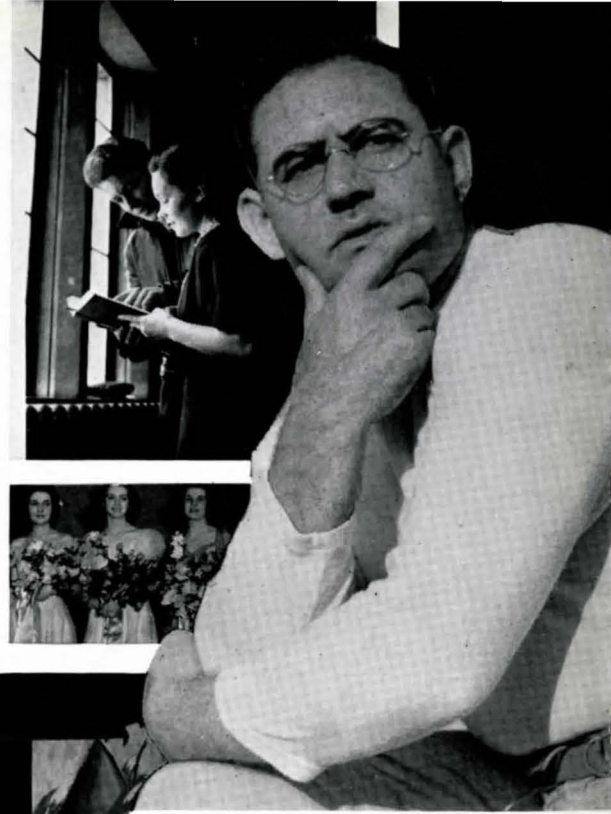
## R. I. P.

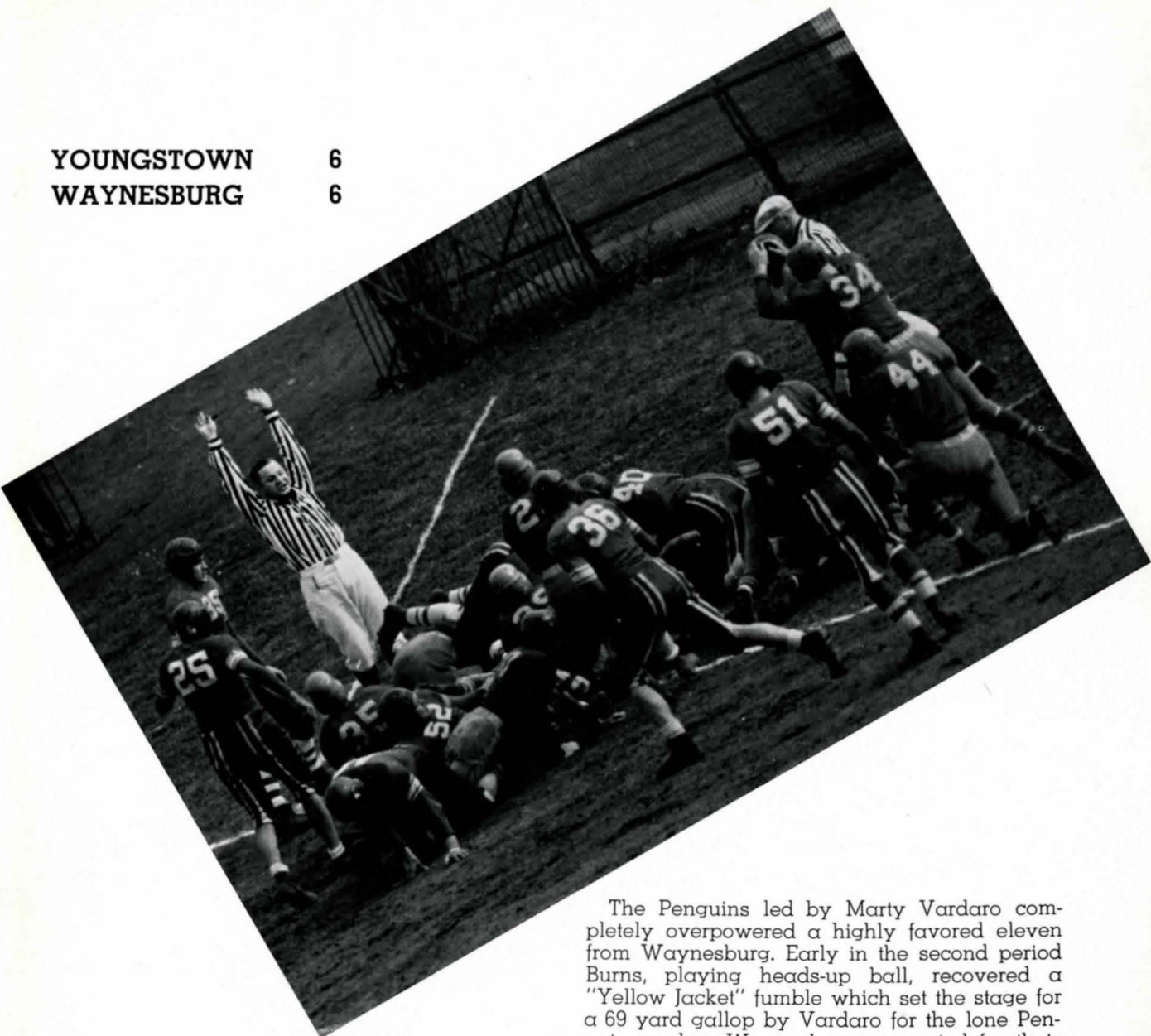
Striking through the air, the Youngstown College Penguins opened their 1940 grid campaign by defeating the Covenanters from Geneva.

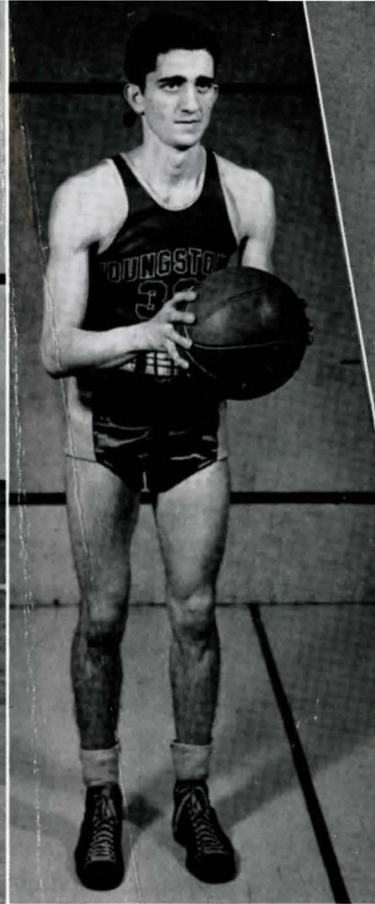
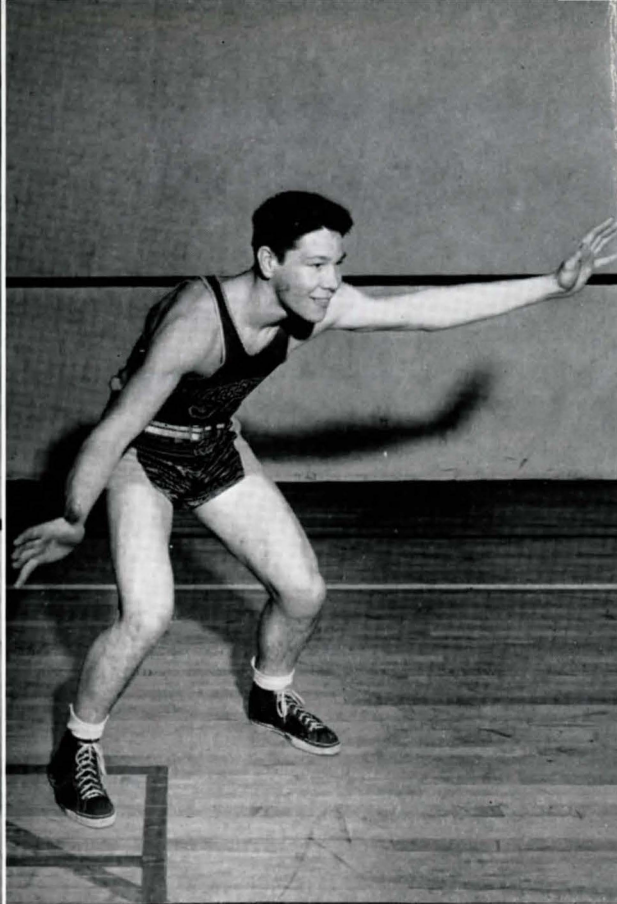
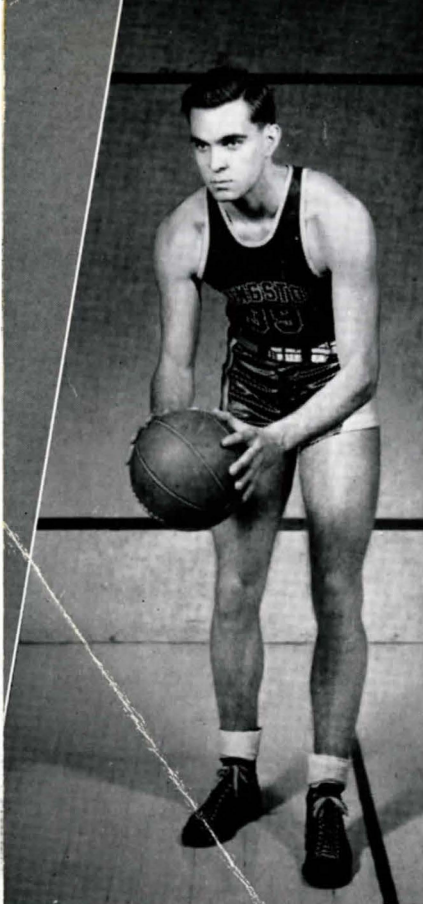
## **Dominic Rosselli**
