YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - A new recycling center has opened at Youngstown State University, co-sponsored by Circle K, the university student service organization, as a community project.

Newspaper, glass, tin cans, aluminum cans and items, and bi-metal cans can be taken to a blue truck that will be parked in a YSU parking lot off Bryson Street by the Service Road at the north end of the campus from 4:30 to 6 p.m. the first Tuesday of each month. Circle K members will be at the truck to assist those dropping off materials.

The new center, which opened Nov. 4, is for the convenience of the university community and residents of the near North Side of the city.

The project was sponsored by Youngstown Recycling/Environmental Centers, a non-profit organization whose aim is to seek solutions to the solid waste problem through encouraging separation and recycling of household waste items. Recycling/Environmental Centers already has centers at the Pyatt Street Market in Youngstown; Liberty Township Administration Building; Central Facilities Building in Canfield, and at Grace Lutheran Church, Hall Ave., Hubbard.

Robert Capp, Youngstown, president of Circle K, and Dr. Stephen Hanzely, Poland, YSU professor of physics and astronomy and a Circle K advisor, are on the executive committee of Youngstown Recycling/Environmental Centers. Barbara Scott, YSU Public Services, is also a Circle K advisor.

All money from sale of the recycling materials is used by the organization for operations and equipment.
