YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - As part of the Dana Concert Series at Youngstown State University, Lori Turk, flute, and Roman Rudnytsky, piano, will present a free concert of 20th Century music at 8 p.m. Jan. 9 in Bliss Recital Hall.

The program features four compositions commissioned by the National Endowment for the Arts with sponsorship of the Cincinnati Composer's Guild.

"Chama" by Peter Ware of Toronto was inspired by the mythology of the Toltec Indians.

"Five Pieces for Flute and Piano on Legends of the Seneca Indians" is by Dr. Robert Rollin of Boardman, a member of the Dana School of Music faculty in YSU's College of Fine and Performing Arts.

"Thoreau's Flute: Reflections from Walden," was composed by Charles Hoag, chairman of the Symposium of Contemporary Music at the University of Kansas and conductor of the Lawrence Symphony.

James T. Marshall of Whitman College, Walla Walla, Wash., is composer of the final number, "Convergence."

Flutist Lori Turk received her master's degree at YSU and is a member of the Youngstown Symphony. Rudnytsky, a Dana faculty member, is an internationally known concert pianist.
