"Computer Literacy" will provide an examination of computer terminology and an overview of how computers work, as well as their applications to both professional and personal use. The focus will be primarily on microcomputers and will include lectures and hands-on experience. This basic course is recommended for those with no experience or prior knowledge of computers.
