The reading, sponsored by the English Department and the Penguin Review, YSU's literary magazine, is free and open to the public.

Dr. Greenway, who now resides in Youngstown, is listed in the Directory of American Poets and Fiction Writers, and Who's Who in American Writers. He has published over sixty poems in such periodicals as Poetry, New Letters, Montana Review, Laurel Review, Quartet, and others.

He has won an Academy of American Poets Prize, and prizes from Negative Capability, Attention Please, and Cape Rock Journal. He has been anthologized in the 1984 Anthology of Magazine Verse and Yearbook of Poetry, and Southern Writers IV by the New Virginia Review.

His first volume of poetry, Pressure Under Grace, is a Walt Whitman Prize finalist. His second, Where We've Been, was a finalist in the Owl Creek Poetry Contest and was nominated for a Lamont Prize.

Dr. Greenway has been invited to read his poetry at the New Orleans Center for the Creative Arts, the New Orleans Poetry Forum, Tulane University, the University of Southern Mississippi, the Dylan Thomas Society of Swansea, Wales, and on public radio.
