YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - A number of faculty and students from The Dana School of Music of Youngstown State University's College of Fine and Performing Arts will participate in programs Feb. 8 at the Ohio Music Education Association's Professional Conference in Cleveland.

This three-day conference, Feb. 7, 8, 9, will be held at Stouffer's Inn, downtown.

The Feb. 8 program will include performances by the YSU Symphonic Wind Ensemble under the direction of Joseph Lapinski at 9:40 a.m. and by Jazz Ensemble I, conducted by Tony Leonardi of Poland, at 1:10 p.m.

Lapinski, also of Poland, will lead a clarinet clinic, "Tone and Intonation," and John Turk of Boardman Township, will give a tuba clinic, "Improve Your Tuba Section...Improve Your Band," including the premiere of Dr. Edward Largent's composition "Three Shorts for Tuba and Piano." All are Dana faculty members.
