## We Will Not Be Ignored

The new state budget was announced Wednesday by Governor Rhodes. While including provisions to aid families paying for higher education, it virtually ignores higher education itself, almost guaranteeing tuition increases in the very near future
The budget allows for an expansion of the Ohio Instructional Grant Program It would extend state assistance to families with incomes of up to $\$ 20,000$ per year. The grants themselves will be larger, to a maximum $\$ 720$ per year for a state institution
This expansion of the Grant Program, while laudable and quite overdue, will be offset by tuition increases made necessary by the slight increase ( $20.8 \%$ ) of state funds that Rhodes is willing to channel directly to the instutituions. At a time when expenses by and for higher education are rising by approximately 25 perceñt, this increase is clearly not enough.
The budget is now being submitted to the General Assembly for approval. It is time for those concerned; all student at every state school in Ohio, to make the state legistlators aware that higher
