YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Dr. Frank J. Seibold, veteran professor of advertising and public relations at Youngstown State University, will assume the post of interim dean of YSU's Warren P. Williamson, Jr. School of Business Administration on Aug. 1.

He succeeds Dr. Earnest R. Nordtvedt, who acted as interim dean of the school for 1986-87. Dr. Nordtvedt plans on rejoining the faculty of Loyola University in New Orleans. He took a leave of absence from that university to assume his role at YSU.

Dr. Seibold will act as the interim dean until a new dean can be found by the Williamson School of Business Dean Search Committee.

Dr. Seibold joined the YSU faculty as an associate professor of advertising and public relations in 1971. He was chairman of that department from 1975-84; he was acting dean of YSU's School of Business Administration from 1978-79.

Before coming to the University, Dr. Seibold was an assistant professor at New York Community College in Brooklyn, a lecturer for Adelphi University in Garden City, N.Y., and an executive sales consultant with the Liberty Mutual Insurance Co. of New York.

He received his Bachelor of Arts degree, magna cum laude, from Long Island University in 1956, a Master of Science degree from that university in 1960, and his doctorate in Communication from Yeshiva University in 1969.

Dr. Seibold is on the Executive Committee of the Phi Kappa Phi Honor Society; he received the YSU Watson Merit Award for Outstanding Administration; and he was given the Outstanding Teacher of the Year Award by YSU's Alpha Mu marketing fraternity.
