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YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Typists, secretaries, administrative assistants and office managers will have the opportunity this summer to increase their word processing knowledge and skills through three programs offered by the Office of Continuing Education at Youngstown State University.

"Introduction to Word Processing" will focus on word/information processing terminology and the concepts and benefits of word processing. Emphasis will be placed on hands-on training for both dedicated word processors and microcomputers with word processing capabilities.

Classes will be held on Mondays and Wednesdays from 5:30 to 7:20 p.m.

Aug. 11-27.

"Multimate," a full-day seminar, will teach participants advanced applications on a microcomputer using multimate word processing software. Topics will include merging, spell check, document compression, format changes, combining documents, stored paragraphs, and setting up a workable coding system. This class will be particularly beneficial to those working in industry.

The seminar is slated from 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m. July 18.

Another seminar, "Display Write III," will teach participants advanced applications on a microcomputer using Display Write III word processing software. This package is the microcomputer substitute for the Displaywriter.

This seminar will be held from 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m. Aug. 15.

The instructor for "Introduction to Word Processing" and "Displaywrite III" will be Virginia K. Phillips of Edinburg, Pa., and instructor for "Multimate" will be Dr. Karen Duda of Warren. Both are associate professors in YSU's Business Education and Technology Department.
