YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Dr. George E. Sutton, dean of Youngstown State University's William Rayen School of Engineering, has been chosen to deliver the address at the University's annual Honor's Convocation.

His topic will be "Decisions."

The program, which recognizes students for academic achievements and also designates distinguished professors, will be held at 8 p.m. Tuesday, May 12, in Kilcawley Center's Chestnut Room. Students in the top one percent of their class in each of the six undergraduate schools and colleges are recognized, and a number of other awards and scholarships are announced.

Dr. Sutton, who resides in Poland, received his bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering from West Virginia University, Morgantown; master's degree from the University of Florida, and doctoral degree from Michigan State University. He taught at all three institutions, and later taught at Arizona State University and the University of Nevada, where he was chairman of the Mechanical Engineering Department.

He was a fighter pilot with the Royal Air Force and U.S. Navy in World War II. Before becoming a member of YSU's faculty in 1976, he also served as director of professional service for the National Council of Engineering Examiners.

He has served as president of both the Mahoning Valley and Northern Nevada chapters of the National Society of Professional Engineers, is a former president of the Mahoning Valley Technical Societies Council, and is a member of the Youngstown Private Industry Council.
