YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - Youngstown State University's Office of Continuing Education is offering a pilot enrichment program for children entering the second and third grades next fall.

Composed of ten different sessions, the "Adventures in Summer" program will be held from 8:30-11:30 a.m. June 16-27 at Hilltop Elementary School in Canfield.

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YOUNGSTOWN, Ohio - The 11th annual District Directors Institute on Federal Taxation will be held at Youngstown State University from 8 a.m.-5 p.m. June 13.
