The teaching talents of two faculty in Mathematics are being recognized on the state and national levels.

Alicia Prieto Langarica, left, associate professor, has been awarded the national Henry L. Alder Award for Distinguished Teaching from the Mathematical Association of America. The award is presented annually to only three faculty members nationwide and recognizes extraordinary teaching that has influence beyond the classroom.

Anita O'Mellan, left, a professor of Mathematics and Teacher Education, has been selected to receive the Kenneth Cummins Award for Exemplary Mathematics Teaching from the Ohio Council of Teachers of Mathematics. The award, given annually to one Ohio math or math education faculty member, will be presented at OCTM's conference in October in Sandusky.

O'Mellan earned a PhD from Memphis State University, joined the YSU Mathematics faculty in 1993 and was cross-appointed with the Department



of Teacher Education in 2000. Her research interests focus on Graph Theory, Combinatorics and Mathematics Education. Prieto earned a PhD from the University of Texas at Arlington. Her research focuses on the intersection of mathematics and biology, specifically problems related to the medical field.

**Morgan Bagley,** assistant professor of Kinesiology and Sport Science, received

Michael Butcher, professor of Biological Sciences, is the principal author of an article in the Journal of Anatomy titled "Ontogenetic allometry and architectural properties of the paravertebral and hindlimb musculature in Eastern cottontail rabbits (Sylvilagus floridanus): functional implications for developmental changes in locomotor performance." The paper's co-authors include three former YSU students - JA Rose, Z.D. Glenn and N.M Tatomirovich. The study is the first report for a large collaborative study with colleagues at NEOMED and Kent State University-Stark. Butcher received funding from the National Science Foundation for the study using Eastern cottontail rabbits as a model. Two additional manuscripts by the group, one submitted to the Journal of Experimental Biology and the other to Functional Ecology, are currently in revision.

a \$3,750 grant from the National Athletics Trainers' Association to help expand and enhance the department's partnership with the Youngstown city schools. The grant will help develop an athletic training camp on the YSU campus to provide hands-on education to city high school students about the profession of athletic training, emergency medical services and the importance of hydration. The grant was awarded by NATA's Ethnic Diversity Advisory Committee, which gives funding to educational institutions seeking to enhance ethnic diversity within the profession.
