It's election season, and that means a lot of work for Paul Sracic, YSU professor of Political Science and International Relations and a much sought-after source for U.S. political analysis.



Among Sracic's activities leading up to Tuesday's election: lectures to the U.S. Embassies in Bangladesh, Kuwait, Ireland and Belgium; a press roundtable with reporters in Brussels; appearances on NHK World Japan and BBC Radio; and an election night live chat and Q&A sponsored by the U.S. Department of State. He has been quoted in dozens of articles in leading media around the globe, including the *Financial Times* of London, the *Jerusalem Post*, Yahoo News, the *Washington Examiner*, the *Los Angeles Times* and RealClearPolitics. He also authored a column in Kyodo News, Japan's leading news agency; was a panelist for "The Valley Votes: What to Expect Next" hosted by *Mahoning Matters*; and is scheduled for a post-election talk at the Youngstown/Warren Regional Chamber's annual Economic Forecast Breakfast on Nov. 5.

Sracic, who holds a doctorate in Political Science from Rutgers University, has received two Fulbright Awards to lecture in Japan and has given more than 40 international U.S. State Department-sponsored lectures in eight different countries.

# **Counseling Today**

With a raging pandemic, increasing racial conflicts and various other challenges, 2020 has been an angstridden time for us all...and even moreso for children.

How to handle that anxiety is the topic of a new article co-authored by **Victoria Kress**, YSU professor of Psychological Sciences and Counseling. The article appears in *Counseling Today* and is titled "Techniques for helping children navigate anxiety related to COVID-19." The article provides several strategies counselors can use to help children manage anxiety, including creating a routine, utilizing thought-stopping tools, and clearly communicating. "Children have many questions about the challenges we are currently facing," the article says. "Adults should explain things to children in clear, concrete terms."

The bad – and the good – of pain is the subject of a new essay by **Lucas Hardy**, associate professor of English and World Languages.

The essay, titled "Jonathan Edwards and the Aesthetics of Pain," appears in *Jonathan Edwards Within the Enlightenment: Controversy, Experience & Thought*, a volume in the New Directions in Jonathan Edwards Studies Series curated by the Jonathan Edwards Center at Yale University.



Hardy examines the philosophy of pain developed by Edwards, a prominent 18th-century preacher and philosopher widely regarded as one of America's most important and original philosophical theologians. Hardy shows that Edwards, arguing against the prevailing Enlightenment belief that pain was either a symptom of injury or a form of divine punishment, advanced a theory that pain might

coincide with pleasure to produce new ways of experiencing the mind and body.

Hardy joined the YSU English faculty in 2012 after completing a Ph.D. in Early American Literature at the University at Albany, SUNY. He is currently completing a book-length study on pain and religious life in colonial New England.
