## Programme Notes

The opera "Maritana" consists of three acts, text by Fitzball, written around the romance of "Don Caesar de Bazan," the music by William Vincent Wallace (1814-1865). The first performance of the opera occurred in the native land of the composer at Drury Lane Theater, London, Nov. 15, 1845. "Maritana" was first heard in America at the Bowery Theatre, New York City, May 4, 1848. The overture to the opera contains the popular and much loved song of Maritana "Scenes that are Brightest," sung in the third act.

The celebrated minuet by Paderewski has been very cleverly arranged for band by M. L. Lake. This number retains its popularity whether played on the piano, by orchestra or band. Paderewski was born in Padolia, Russian Poland, in January, 1860. Although he retired from the concert stage to serve his country, since the World War, the music lovers of America have recently received him back here, where he is making a concert tour.

On May 1, 1833 in Hamburg, Germany, Johannes Brahms was born—a person who was later destined to be the last great German composer. Born of common people, surrounded by the ordinary things of life, Brahms portrays these homely things in his music. Schumann hailed him as the successor to Beethoven, when Brahms was twenty-seven years old. His music does not have the pomp and glow of his contemporaries, but contains the traditions of the school of Bach and Palestina. Dance No. 5 is one of many contained in four books of Dances. Brahms died in 1891.

March "Jasmine" is from the pen of A. D. Davenport of the class of 1923. This example in composition, together with the arranging, rehearsing and conducting of the evening's program is part of the work required for graduation.

Edward MacDowell was born in New York December 18, 1861, and died there January 23, 1908. Typically American, MacDowell has given to the world compositions which have found their place in the history of musical art. In his works MacDowell shows imagination and feeling. Perhaps we live too near him to appreciate fully the influence his music has on our national music or to give him the place he deserves among the musicians of the world.

## PROGRAM NOTES

### CONCERTO DA CHIESA ..... Felice Dall Abaco

Evariste Felice Dall Abaco the son of a jurist was born at Verona, July 12th, 1675 ,and died on his birthday 1742. Abaco was director of the orchestra and electoral senator at Munich. He was a profound musician of instrumental music and was one of the last representatives of the ancient dignity and majesty of Italian instrumental music. The concerto da chiesa (church concerto) resembles in many ways the Sonata da chiesa. The sonata is derived from the oldest cyclic form, the suite, a series of movements in ideal dance measure, contrasted in time and rhythm but agreeing in tonality. In the Church Sonata, the names of the dance forms in question did not appear as titles. Already at the commencement of the 17th century, the name Concertino was given to such compositions as were composed of several pieces, in which divers voices and instruments take in turn the leading part. The first part of this Concerto (Largo Andante) is simply a majestic prelude built on a peaceful bass. The second part (Allegro a spicato) presents a powerful characteristic wrangling theme. The third part (largo) is a wonderful hymn, a song full of fervour and sublimity, while the two repeats of the finale (Allegro e spicato- are built a thinly veiled Gigue. Thus, the several parts of this concerto are in excellent keeping; and form in their variety a pleasing and harmonious whole.

### LIEBESLEID ..... Cadman

Leibesleid is a beautiful love song with its main theme and counter melody which has been very cleverly arranged for 'cello solo with String accompaniment by Mr. Lester Opp, Class of 1922.

### MINUET FROM THE 4TH QUARTET ..... Beethoven

Beethoven the greatest master of modern instrumental music was born in Bonn, December 16th, 1770 and died in Vienna, March 26th, 1827. His most important works are nine Symphonies, a number of String Quartets, Sonatas and several Concertos. The minuet, an ancient French form of dance in 3-4 measure, was originally of a rather slow movement. Haydn, Mozart, Schubert quickened the time and Beethoven increased it even to that of a Scherzo.






