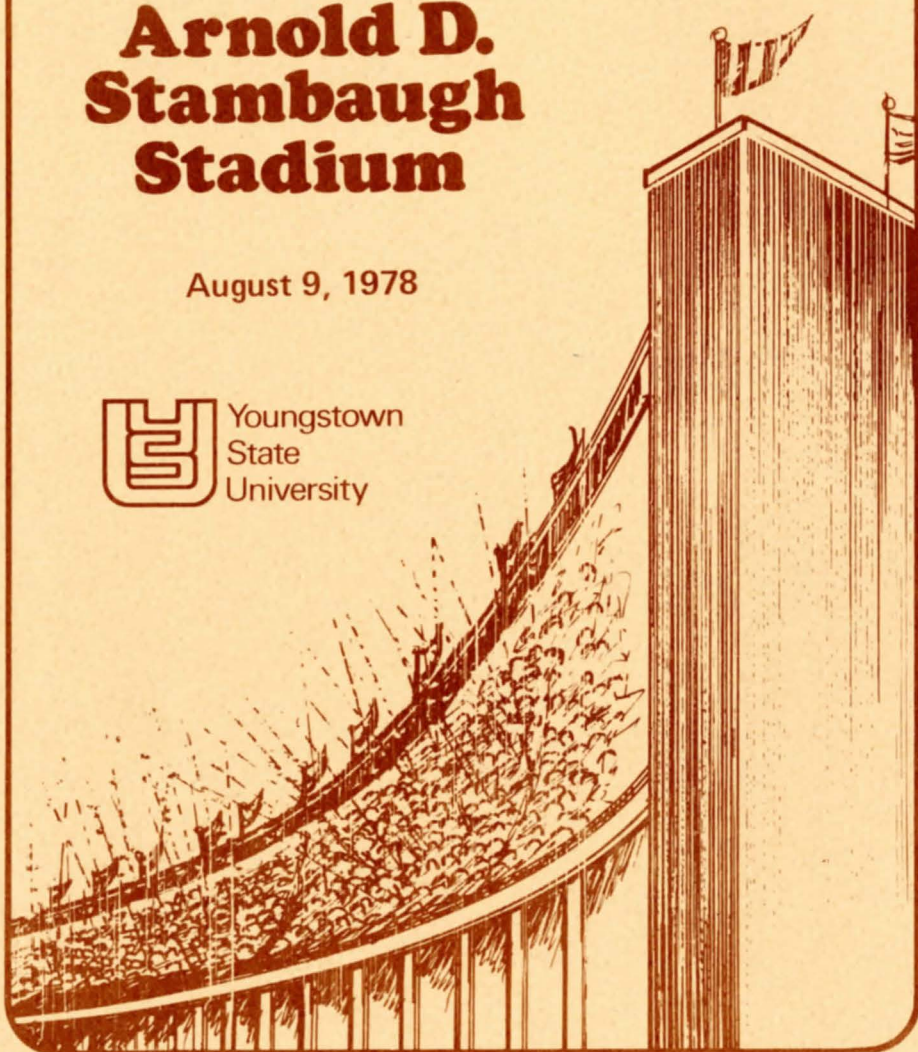

Long a leader in both community and industrial affairs, Arnold D. Stambaugh has always encouraged and supported the development of Youngstown State University. The recipient of the "Others Award" from the Salvation Army, the highest commendation given for community service and the first time awarded in the Youngstown area, Mr. Stambaugh is the former owner of Stambaugh Lumber Company and a former chairman and director of Peoples Bank.



He is also a recipient of the Youngstown Junior Chamber of Commerce "Man of the Year" award (1977), and the prestigious Silver Beaver Award from the Boy Scouts of America.

The Youngstown State University Board of Trustees recently cited Mr. Stambaugh for "providing the leadership and inspiration in bringing together the leadership of the Community to provide the major thrust in a successful community fund-raising drive to make a reality the long desired community dream of a major spectator stadium."



SPORTS AND HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION COMPLEX

Bordered on the north by the Madison Avenue Expressway and on the south by Beeghly Center, the 17.8-acre Complex will feature the 16,000-seat Stambaugh Stadium which includes press and broadcasting areas, public facilities, concession areas, stadium field lighting, scoreboard, players' and officials' dressing rooms, coaching offices, equipment storage and an artificial playing surface.

Plans call for softball, soccer and field hockey fields, tennis courts and an eight-lane all-weather track to adjoin the stadium.

Primarily an educational and instructional facility, Stambaugh Stadium will accommodate physical education classes for both men and women, expanding the University's intramural, recreational and intercollegiate facilities.
