




Architecturally, the new Youngstown State University parking decks are simple and unassuming. But functionally, they are as pleasing as any existing or proposed building on campus.

Situated on land purchased from the City of Youngstown through its Urban Renewal Agency, the parking decks are another step forward in the completion of YSU's Phase 1 Campus Expansion Program.

Financed from General Fee and parking funds, the total cost of YSU's newest addition is \$2.3 million. Three-and-one half decks will provide space for 1,250 cars at an average cost of \$1,840.00 per parking space.

An entrance and exit on both Arlington and Lincoln Avenues with red and green directional arrows will eliminate confusion during rush periods. Attendants will be stationed at each set of ramps and will tour the levels when classes are in session. Six highly illuminated stairway towers will provide the student easy access to and from his car.

The decks are fashioned of demountable pre-cast concrete columns, beams and decks on a foundation capable of supporting a three-story building.
