VIJAY IYER TRIO

Program Note

By overwhelming consensus, the VIJAY IYER TRIO has become one of the pivotal jazz bands of the twenty-first century. Described as "the best piano trio in jazz today" (*Der Spiegel*), "the great new jazz piano trio" (*The New York Times*), "truly astonishing" (NPR), and "the best band in jazz" (PopMatters), the trio makes "cutting-edge music, but always accessible" (*The Guardian*) – emotionally resonant and deeply interactive, radiating groove and brimming with polyrhythmic detail, rooted in tradition yet truly innovative in style and form.

Uneasy (2021) Vijay's trio record on ECM Records, was named one of the best albums of 2021 in Pitchfork, The New Yorker, JazzTimes, The Boston Globe, PopMatters, BrooklynVegan, and the annual jazz critics' poll housed at The Arts Fuse.

The band has played to sold-out venues and jazz festivals in Berlin, Mannheim, London, Rome, Istanbul, and Barcelona. London Jazz News spoke of an "extraordinary gig", The Blue Moment called the group at "the peak of their art" and the German daily Mannheimer Morgen concurred, going as far as calling Vijay's band "the new standard when it comes to piano trios".

Composer-pianist VIJAY IYER (pronounced "VID-jay EYE-yer") was described by Pitchfork as "one of the most interesting and vital young pianists in jazz today," by the Los Angeles Weekly as "a boundless and deeply important young star," and by Minnesota Public Radio as "an American treasure." A Grammy nominee, Vijay Iyer has been voted DownBeat Magazine's Artist of the Year four times - in 2018, 2016, 2015 and 2012. Iyer was also named DownBeat's 2014 Pianist of the Year, a 2013 MacArthur Fellow, and a 2012 Doris Duke Performing Artist.

Born and raised in upstate New York, Iyer studied violin from age 3 to 18 and was self-taught on piano. Living in the SF Bay Area in the 1990s, Iyer worked with composer-saxophonist Steve Coleman, trombonist-composer-theorist George Lewis, and author-performer-activist Amiri Baraka. Iyer moved to New York in 1998, and subsequently collaborated with Wadada Leo Smith, Roscoe Mitchell, Butch Morris, Rudresh Mahanthappa, Steve Lehman, Craig Taborn, Tyshawn Sorey, poet Mike Ladd, novelist Teju Cole, writer/bandleader Greg Tate, filmmaker Prashant Bhargava, rapper Himanshu Suri, and many other artists across genres and disciplines.

Iyer is the Franklin D. and Florence Rosenblatt Professor of the Arts in the Department of Music at Harvard University, and the director of the Banff International Workshop in Jazz and Creative Music. He is a Steinway artist.

During the last 15 years, bassist MATT BREWER has developed and sustained a well-earned reputation as the first-call bassist, applying his resonant tone, uncanny time feel, and conceptual breadth on both upright and electric bass to touring and recording projects by an elite cohort of individualistic, gamechanging artists. In addition to Greg Osby and Wendel, a short list includes Gonzalo Rubalcaba, Antonio Sanchez, David Sánchez, David Binney, Steve Lehman, Logan Richardson, Ambrose Akinmusire, Aaron Parks, Dhafer Youssef, Vijay Iyer, Joel Ross, Gerald Clayton, Mike Moreno, Lage Lund, Ben Monder, and the contributing members of SFJAZZ Collective.

Brewer is an accomplished composer, whose harmonically evocative, rhythmically percolating original works have been performed by a stellar collection of improvisers; and an esteemed jazz educator. He is currently Professor of Jazz Bass at San Francisco Conservatory of Music. He is an adjunct faculty member at The New School, a frequent guest artist/teacher at the Banff Center and Siena Jazz Workshop, and has taught lessons and master classes across the globe.

JEREMY DUTTON has performed with Gerald Clayton, Ambrose Akinmusire, Sachal Vasandani, Taylor Eigsti, Camila Meza, Jacky Terrasson, Joel Ross, Linda Oh, Maria Grand, Keyon Harrold, Vijay Iyer, Philip Dizack, Matt Penman, Stefon Harris, Harish Raghavan, and Dayna Stephens.

As a resident of New York City, Dutton's dynamic talent has seen him featured by The New York Times and AT&T's The Bridge.

Director's Biography

Adam Day Howard is an American-born, British-trained actor, director, playwright and musician. A graduate of the Masters of Musical Theatre program at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland, he has worked in a half dozen countries on three continents, including the Number 1 UK Tour of Dreamboats and Petticoats, Fame, at the Grimaldi Forum in Monaco, and has appeared on television for BBC Scotland's Tonight's The Night With John Barrowman, and UK MTV's Plain Jane. He was an original contributing writer and composer for the musical From Up Here, now available from Broadway Licensing, and was the music supervisor for the Off-Broadway musical Here There Be Dragons which premiered at The Player's Theatre, Manhattan in summer of 2022. His new play Snow White and The Seven Dorks: A Texas Holiday Panto premiers at Stages Repertory Theatre, Houston this December. He is a full-time lecturer of Musical Theatre at YSU and is very grateful for the opportunity to be here! JUDGES' BIOGRAPHIES

Over the last two decades of his conducting career, **Dr. Jungho Kim** has established an outstanding reputation for his superb musicality and leadership on the podium. He has conducted the Savaria Symphony Orchestra and Dohnanyi Orchestra Budafok in Hungary, National Arts Centre Orchestra in Canada, Northwest Iowa Symphony Orchestra, and Omaha Symphony Orchestra, as well as Rochester Philharmonic and Buffalo Philharmonic in New York State. After successfully leading the Augustana University Orchestra to a musical high point and in expansion of both its size and quality for the past two years, Kim was recently named Director of Orchestra of the Hugh A. Glauser School of Music at Kent State University in Northeast Ohio, USA. Following his first professional three-year position as a section violinist at Gyeonggi Philharmonic Orchestra in Korea, Kim went on to earn two master's degrees from the College-Conservatory of Music at the University of Cincinnati–one in violin performance and the other in orchestral conducting, studying with Anna Vayman and Mark Gibson.

Kim completed the Doctor of Musical Arts degree at the Eastman School of Music under the guidance of Maestro Neil Varon. He served as the assistant conductor of the Rochester Philharmonic and was awarded the Walter Hagen Conducting Prize during his doctoral studies. Along with the opportunities he has had to study with world famous artists such as Maestro Kurt Masur and Pinchas Zukerman, he takes the most pride in some of the comments he has received from musicians in orchestras he has worked with—one of the evaluation sheets from a professional orchestra simply said "Hire him." His uncanny ability to bring out the best in the people he works with has led to countless many lasting friendships and memories that speak to his humility, character, and musicality.

Dr. Jim Johnson grew up in the suburbs of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He earned his D.M. in Trumpet Performance from The Florida State University under the guidance of Dr. Christopher Moore, his M.M. in Trumpet Performance from Kansas State University with Dr. Gary Mortenson and his B.S. in Music Education from Indiana University of Pennsylvania under Dr. Kevin Eisensmith.

Before coming to The University of Akron, Dr. Johnson served as the Principal Trumpet of the Salina Symphony Orchestra in Salina, Kansas and the Kansas State University Faculty Brass Quintet. He performs with Conspiratus Brass duo, of which he is a founding member.

He has performed with the Des Moines Symphony Orchestra, Tallahassee Symphony Orchestra (Tallahassee, FL), Albany Symphony Orchestra (Albany, GA), and Sinfonia Gulf Coast Symphony Orchestra (Destin, FL). Dr. Johnson is also an accomplished arranger as well, having his music performed at the National Trumpet Competition, the William Adam International Trumpet Festival, the Kansas Music Educators Association All-State Conference, and at the Haus Marteau Brass Chamber Workshop in Lichtenberg, Germany.

Benjamin Lorenzo is an associate professor of music and the Director of Bands at Kent State University's Glauser School of Music where he conducts the Wind Ensemble, teaches conducting, and provides leadership for university bands. Previously, he served as Associate Director of Bands and Director of Athletic Bands at the University of Arkansas where he led the Razorback Marching Band and Wind Symphony. Before this appointment, Lorenzo held positions at Oklahoma State and Texas Tech University. His teaching experience also includes high schools in Florida and Texas.

Passionate about wind bands in Latin America, Dr. Lorenzo has worked with musicians in Mexico, Panama, Peru, Colombia, and the Dominican Republic. He has also conducted bands in Kuala Lumpur and was a clinician for the Malaysian Band Directors Association Conducting Workshop. Additional experience abroad includes guest conducting the World Youth Wind Orchestra Project (WYWOP) in Schladming, Austria. Lorenzo remains active as an adjudicator, conductor, and clinician throughout the United States and has conducted professional ensembles such as the West Point Academy Band.

Lorenzo holds the Doctor of Musical Arts and Master of Music degrees in Wind Conducting from The University of Texas at Austin under the tutelage of Jerry Junkin. He received a Bachelor of Music degree in Trombone Performance from Florida International University, studying with Mark Hetzler. A native of Havana, Cuba, he is a proud alumnus of Miami-Dade County Public Schools, where he began his teaching career.

Music for Pieces of Wood (1951)

Steve Reich (b. 1936)

Scored for five sets of claves, Reich's compositional technique utilizes a slow process, widely called minimalism, but this is a term Reich does not favor. Rather Reich's slow process involves, two players who maintain an ostinato while the others successively begin with a one-note pattern, adding notes one at a time, until a complete pattern results. Successive sections reveal a progressively shorter rhythmic process – section one = 12 notes, section two = 8 notes, and section three = 6 notes. Such slow processes allow listeners ample time to perceive various tempi and rhythmic patterns amidst this polyrhythmic texture.

Earl Hatch (1906-1996), Arr. Claudio Santangelo (1906-1996)

Jacob Potts - marimba soloist

Earl Hatch was born in Greely, Colorado and passed away in North Hollywood, California. His parents were both musical and he started his career as snare drummer at age six, and trap drummer with the Theater Orchestra at the age of ten years. He learned piano at fifteen and went on the road with a six-piece jazz band as a piano player. After that, his long music career continued until his death, including Walt Disney and other movie companies. His own designed bass marimba can be heard in movies such as Dr. Zhivago, The Sound of Music and The King and I. He was given an Honorary Doctorate 1988. Most of his works can be obtained at Earl Hatch Publications. Notes by TEK Percussion Database

Variations on a Ghanaian Theme (1981)

Daniel Levitan (b. 1953)

Variations uses rhythmic patterns from the folkloric music of Ghana, Africa and Levitan manipulates these patterns using techniques such as permutation and counterpoint. Composer and percussionist Daniel Levitan studied composition at Bennington College with Henry Brant, Vivian Fine, and Marta Ptazynska. Percussion studies include marimba with Tom Hemphill, Indian tabla with Phil Ford and Ray Spiegel, and conga and Latin percussion with Frankie Malabe. Levitan's numerous works for percussion have been performed at conservatories throughout the world. Notes by Daniel Levitan and Glenn Schaft.

Gymel (1976)

William Duckworth (1943-2012)

Gymel, a marimba quartet, mixes minimalism and indeterminacy (chance), and while always sounding similar, it is never the same. The semi-graphic musical score is a diamond shaped collection of notated one-measure motives or 'blocks', all voiced within an octave, in E-flat major. The center of the score contains a sort of musical island - a much longer musical phrase that must be played five times by each player. The one-measure motives must each be repeated numerous times within a specified range and are connected by various potential pathways, eventually leading to the longer center block. Each player starts in a different corner of the diamond and gradually moves toward the center, and then toward a different ending location. Notes by Glenn Schaft

Raptures of Undream (1998)

Bruce Hamilton (b. 1966)

"Generally, the music I compose reflects my wide-ranging musical interests. My aesthetic involves a balance: a mixture of musical ideas, concern for pure sound and energy, and aspects of theater and humor. Naturally, being a percussionist has had a major impact on my approach to rhythm and gesture. Often, my pieces integrate my experience with rock, funk, jazz, and Latin music into a modernist framework. Raptures of Undream was written for the Indiana University Percussion Ensemble. The piece is scored for six players, armed each with a floor tom tom and a cymbal. The work is divided into four sections delineated by tempo. Rhythmic/melodic motives are presented and developed through divergent textures and rhythmic guises. A prominent theme is the contrast between contrapuntal sections and unison passages. Essential to the piece is the sense of "groove" which serves as the underpinning to the sometimes wild (and rapturous) rhythmic excursions." Notes by Bruce Hamilton

Percussionist and composer Bruce Hamilton was born in Philadelphia and grew up in New Jersey and currently lives in Bellingham, Washington. He received a BM in percussion performance and the Performer's Certificate from Indiana University and completed a Doctorate in Composition there. Notes by Glenn Schaft.

Transmigration (2009)

Phil Richardson (b. 1986)

Transmigration is meant to exemplify the reflective nature of music, and its ability to (at least temporarily) transform us into rational beings. The piece was conceived after reading the following quote: Schopenhauer believed that art, in particular music, had - has - the power to cause the will, the irrational, striving will, to somehow turn back onto and into itself and cease to strive. He considered this a religious experience, although temporary. Somehow art, somehow music especially, has the power to transform man from an irrational thing into some rational entity that is not driven by biological impulses, impulses that cannot by definition ever be satisfied. - Philip K. Dick, "The Transmigration of Timothy Archer" Notes by the composer.

Cross (1997)

Eugene Novotney (b. 1960)

Joey Callard- timbale soloist

Born in 1960 in Mentor, Ohio, Eugene Novotney received his Bachelor of Music Degree in Percussion from the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music and his Master of Music Degree & Doctor of Musical Arts Degree from the University of Illinois, with emphasis in Percussion, Composition, and Ethnomusicology. In addition to his formal western music studies, he has studied Dagara xylophone music at the "Dagara Music Center" in Medie, Ghana, Ewe drumming at the National Theatre of Ghana, Accra, Ghana, Brazilian percussion at the "Instituto de Investigacio Musico" in Salvador, Brazil, and Afro-Cuban Percussion at the "Centro Nacional de Escuelas de Arte" (CNEART) in Havana, Cuba. He has also conducted research trips to Xian, Shanghai & Beijing, China; Ubud & Blabatuh, Bali; New Delhi, India; Kokrobite, Ghana; Rio de Janeiro, Brazil; and Port-of-Spain, Trinidad, resulting in numerous transcriptions, arrangements, and analytical studies. He is Professor of Music and the Director of Percussion Studies at California State University-Humboldt in Arcata, California and has written several outstanding works for percussion ensemble and soloist. His Afro-Cuban Folkloric influences are readily apparent in Cross, which is based on the Cuban clave and cascara rhythms. We have expanded Cross to include an improvised solo section as well. Notes by Glenn Schaft.

The work was composed in Carbondale, Illinois and premiered in Carbondale by the Southern Illinois University Percussion Group (Nathan Staley, Nathan Kingery, and Ron Coulter). Originally from Hermitage, Pennsylvania, Ron was raised on a dairy farm and eventually earned his B.M. 2002 and M.M. 2004 degrees in Percussion Performance from Youngstown State University. His principal teachers include Dr. Glenn Schaft, Tony Leonardi, Dr. Stephen Gage Feza Zweifel, John Riley, Erica Azim, Fred Morris, and Nina DeCiancio. Ron served as Assistant Professor at Casper College in Casper, Wyoming and for ten years, served as Senior Lecturer of Percussion Studies and Improvisation at Southern Illinois University Carbondale and adjunct Instructor of Percussion at John

A. Logan College in Carterville, IL. He previously taught at Clarion University of Pennsylvania and at Youngstown State University. Ron is an Educational Endorser with the ProMark Corporation and

Black Swamp Percussion.

Ron has been a free-lance percussionist since 1997, performing in a wide range of musical situations from marching percussion to live electronica. As a performer, he has toured nationally and internationally appearing in 41 U.S. states and most major cities in Canada and Japan. He has performed with the Glenn Miller Orchestra, the Four Aces, Donadi, Sean Jones, Al Martino, Julia Rich, the Gaylords, New Arts Jazztet, Galen Abdur-Razzaq, Marvin Stamm, Joanne Brackeen, Chuck Mangione, Sony Holland, Maria Schneider, Sandy Duncan, Beat Kastley, Nick Hilscher, Robert Van Sice, Steve Lippia, Dick Johnson, Eric Mandat, Marvin Hamlisch, Rapture 7, and Christina Fontanelli, among many others. Ron has performed at two Percussive Arts Society International Conventions, the International Society for Improvised Music Symposium, the College Music Society National Convention, the Music Educators National Convention (MENC), and numerous state and regional MENC conventions. In 2002 Ron was a finalist in the Percussive Arts Society International Multiple Percussion Competition. He is a co-founder of the Percussion Art Ensemble and the Youngstown Percussion Collective, and in 2005 he founded the Perkusiv Arts Elektronik; an ongoing series of sound events exploring the performance of existing and the creation of new electro-acoustic music, including
