ABOUT TONY LEONARDI



Tony Leonardi was born and raised in Syracuse, NY. Before launching his music career, he served in the military and studied at Ithaca College in New York. Over the years, he played with legendary performers such as Nat King Cole, Sammy Davis Jr., Tony Bennett, Bobby Darin, Buddy Rich, and Stan Kenton. Tony toured the United States and Europe with various jazz groups including his own quintet, The Jazz Explorers, and as a member of the Woody Herman Orchestra. He appears on four (4) albums with Woody

Leonardi enrolled as a student at The Dana School of Music in 1968. Shortly thereafter, he and a group of other students began to organize jam sessions. At the some of the students' urging, Tony began the process of starting what would eventually become a nationally acclaimed and formally accredited jazz program at YSU. Tony received his Bachelor of Music from YSU in 1971, where he graduated Summa Cum Laude. In 1976, at the Wichita Jazz Festival, the Jazz Ensemble would establish itself as a nationally acclaimed, award-winning jazz ensemble that put Youngstown State University on the map, sweeping awards and top ratings in every category. Tony also received his master's degree in music in 1979 and that same year was hired into the full-time faculty of YSU.

As the Director of the Jazz Studies Program, Tony brought a host of internationally renowned jazz musicians to YSU to work and perform with his students. They included Stan Kenton, Thad Jones, Mel Lewis, Pepper Adams, Jiggs Whigham, James Moody, Clark Terry, Benny Golson, Marvin Stamm, Bob Mintzer, Kenny Burrell, Jamey Aebersold, Chuck Mangione, Eddie Daniels, Joanne Brackeen, Clark Terry, Sal Nistico and many others.

Many of Leonardi's students have gone on to enjoy successful careers as performers, composers, arrangers, band leaders, and teachers.

Among the awards received during his time at YSU, Tony received an Outstanding Service to Jazz Education award at the 1977 National Association of Jazz Educators Convention, and was voted Jazz Educator of the Year in 1986. He received two Distinguished Professor Awards in 1990, and again in 2001. In 2008, he posthumously received the prestigious Heritage Award.

Tony's last year before retirement ended early when he was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. Upon his passing in July of 2001, the interim Director of The Dana School of Music, Ted Perkins, said, "The Dana School of Music has lost a master teacher and outstanding musician with the passing of Tony Leonardi. His successes at Dana are legendary, and his students are very much devoted to him. Under his guidance, the Dana jazz program developed a national reputation and a tradition of excellence."

In an article published by The Youngstown Vindicator shortly before Tony's passing, he was quoted as saying, "A large part of my success is due to the high quality of students that I have been blessed with; quality not only in terms of talent, but quality in terms of who they are."


A NOTE FROM BENJAMIN WHITE

Johan Botes is known for his extraordinary versatility as a soloist, collaborative musician, and teacher; a career which has brought him recognition in concerts around the world.

A native of South Africa, Botes showed musical promise from an early age. Among many notable awards in his native country, he was the 2007 First Prize Winner of the Third UNISA/Vodacom National Piano Competition playing Rachmaninoff's technically demanding Third Piano Concerto to a standing ovation; a performance for which he also won the Desmond Wilson Memorial Prize for best concerto in the final round.

In 2008, Botes moved to Europe and continued his studies in London with British pianist Martin Roscoe at the Guildhall <u>School of Music</u> and Drama. That year also resulted in <u>master classes</u> with Imogen Cooper, Alexander Rudin, Paul Lewis, Leslie Howard, Leon Fleisher and Richard Goode as well as regular <u>coaching</u> <u>classes</u> with pianist Graham Johnson and soprano Margaret Humpfrey-Clark.

As a soloist, Botes has performed in venues worldwide. He has appeared as soloist with the Juneau Symphony in Alaska, Bainbridge Symphony and Auburn Symphony in Seattle, the Chamber Orchestra of South Africa, Pro Musica Orchestra in Johannesburg, the KwaZulu-Natal Philharmonic Orchestra in Durban, the University of Pretoria Symphony Orchestra as well as the Texas Chamber Orchestra at UT Austin. He has also performed in Prague with the Hadrec Kralove Orchestra in 2003 and in 2005 he toured to Bulgaria where he played with the Varna Philharmonic Orchestra in Varna.

In 2010, Botes won the Sidney M. Wright Presidential Scholarship Competition in Piano Accompaniment and in the same year began collaborative Piano Trio work with cellist Francesco Mastromatteo. Their first performance in October 2010 resulted in critical acclaim, winning them Prize for the best Chamber Music Recital at The <u>University of Texas</u> at Austin in 2011. Before Marshall, Botes was lecturing in Piano, Group and Collaborative Piano at The University of Arkansas in Fayetteville.



INTRODUCTION

This girl-loves-ghoul rock 'n' roll off-Broadway musical is set in the atomic 1950s at Enrico Fermi High, where the law is laid down by a zany, tyrannical principal. Pretty senior Toffee has fallen for the class bad boy. Family pressure forces her to end the romance, and he charges off on his motorcycle to the nuclear waste dump. He returns glowing and determined to reclaim Toffee's heart. He still wants to graduate, but most of all, he wants to take Toffee to the prom. The principal orders him to drop dead while a scandal-seeking reporter seizes on him as the freak du jour. History comes to his rescue while a tuneful selection of original songs in the style of '50s hits keeps the action rocking across the stage.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE & STATEMENT

This musical deals briefly with themes of suicide.

In the past 40 years, the musical theatre canon has been filled with many works that could be categorized as "Halloween Musicals." From Little Shop to Dracula, Young Frankenstein, and more, there are dozens that fit the mold — but almost none, perhaps, as well as Zombie Prom. This '90s Off-Broadway hit could be pitched as Grease meets Night of the Living Dead. It is a joyful collection of high school, horror, and musical theatre tropes that is impossible not to enjoy. Zombies often serve as a metaphor for so many things, and while zombies usually symbolize conformity, Jonny Warner is the opposite! His zombie-ness illustrates his rebellion against institutionalization and conformity. Through '50s high-style and B-movie gags, Zombie Prom serves as a reminder that if we are members of an institution that quashes others for making us feel "uncomfortable," we should wake up and support them instead. Please enjoy this musical and take the Halloween spirit of rebellion with you!

Theater. He served as the Production Manager for the YSU Department of Theatre & Dance for 15 years. He is a member of Puppeteers of America, UNIMA-USA (Union Internationale de la Marionnette), and is an avid woodworker and golfer.

Katherine Garlick (Costume Designer) is an Associate Professor of Costume Design and Technology and resident designer at YSU. She holds her MFA from Indiana University, Bloomington. Previous teaching experience includes Kutztown University and Indiana University of Pennsylvania. Her professional work spans both technical and design roles across the region, with favorite theaters including the Weston Playhouse, West Virginia Public Theater, Contemporary American Theater Company (CATCo) Columbus, and Unseam'd Shakespeare in Pittsburgh. She is an active member of the United States Institute of Theatre Technology and the Costume Society of America. Her design work at YSU has been recognized on both a regional and national level by the Kennedy Center American College Theatre Festival.

Ellen Licitra (Lighting Designer) has spent the past 40+ years lighting up theaters and TV studios — both locally and across the country — earning eleven awards for her work. Some of her most memorable shows have been *The Color Purple, Jekyll & Hyde, Sweeney Todd, Pippin, Chorus Line, Dream Girls, Funny Girl, Normal Heart*, and *Hair*. Notably, Ellen worked for several summers as assistant to Tony Award-nominated lighting designer lan Calderone at the NYC Eugene O'Neill Theater Center National Playwrights Conference. Retired after 26 years of designing lighting and rigging at Vincent Lighting Systems, Ellen continues to follow her passion.

Jan Crews (Accompanist) is a collaborative pianist who began playing piano by ear at age three and a half. Growing up in Orlando, Jan began accompanying choruses and singers at age ten — and in 1971 was the first pianist hired by Walt Disney World, where she served as staff accompanist for seven years. For the past eight years, Jan has worked as a collaborative pianist at the renowned Interlochen Arts Camp, accompanied voice students

at Dana School of Music & the YSU musical theatre program, and is frequently called upon to accompany local musical theatre productions.

Laurie Henderson Jones (Accompanist) was born in New Orleans but raised in her family's home in Vicksburg, Mississippi. She began piano lessons at age five and continued formal study through college. Growing up in the church, she played solo and accompanied choirs and soloists from her early teens. Laurie also has extensive experience in musical theater, beginning in community theater at age nine. She played her first "pit" at age 13, when her mother — usually at the piano — decided to audition and star in the show! Laurie has played lead roles in *The Wizard of Oz* (as Dorothy) and *Camelot* (as Guinevere), as well as performing in a semi-professional production of *I Do, I Do.* She has also served as musical director. Laurie accompanies for recitals, choral concerts, musical theater productions, and churches. She enjoys her position as an Elementary Music Teacher for the Mathews Local School District.

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

THE STORY

Scapin, a delightful comedy by Molière, promises to put audiences in stitches. This classic farce follows the misadventures of Scapin, a conniving servant with a knack for mischief and manipulation. As he navigates a web of love triangles and schemes, the play explores themes of deception, forgiveness, and the triumph of wit.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Jean-Baptiste Poquelin, also know onstage as Molière (1622-1673) was a French playwright, actor, and poet, widely regarded as one of the great writers in the French language and world literature. He is known for his comedies, farces, tragicomedies, and more. His plays have been translated into every major living language and are performed at the Comedia-Francaise more often than those of any other playwright today.

In 1671, Molière wrote and performed in Les Fourberies de Scapin (Scapin the Schemer) for King Louis XIV. The central character was expertly crafted

in the combined style of the Italian Commedia dell'arte comic improvisational servant character and the French Comedy of Errors fashion. Scapin, a servant, tries to help two young pairs of lovers, while getting revenge on his master, by scheming and telling lies to all.

In 1997, Bill Irwin (actor, director, and clown extraordinaire) along with Mark O'Donnell (American writer and humorist – from Cleveland, Ohio!) adapted Molière's full-length masterpiece into a modern two-act gem, with a nod to early 1900s American Vaudeville. The result was pure entertainment.

Please sit back, and enjoy our attempt to recapture the hilarious tale of that rascal, Scapin.

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

Marla Berg is a versatile performer, appearing in recital, concert, opera, and musical theatre. She has sung with Cleveland Opera, Glimmerglass Opera, Central City Opera. Anchorage Opera, Fort Worth Opera, and Kansas City Opera. Her roles include Violetta in "La Traviata." Pamina in "Die Zauberflöte." Constanze in "Die Entführung aus dem Serail," Miss Wordsworth in "Albert Herring," Lucia in "Lucia di Lammermoor" and Hanna in "The Merry Widow." In concert, she has appeared with The Cleveland Orchestra. the American Composers Orchestra. the Denver Chamber Symphony, and the Ohio Chamber Orchestra.

Berg's musical theatre appearances have included Maria in "West Side Story," Julie in "Carousel," and Fiona in "Brigadoon." Her recent appearances include performances in "Falling for Prepositions" with Claire Porter at Dobama Theatre in Cleveland Heights, at Centenary College in New Jersey, Rochester University in New York, and Ohio Wesleyan University. Berg has also appeared at Porthouse Theatre as Mother Superior in "The Sound of Music" and Mrs. Sowerberry in "Oliver!"

As a director, Berg has directed the fall opera scenes programs for the past three years at Kent State University. She has also directed their productions of "The Impresario," "A Hand of Bridge," "A Musical Evening at the Choufleurs" and, most recently, "Iolanthe." She received her Bachelor of Music degree from St. Olaf College and a Master of Müsic and an Artist Diploma from Cleveland Institute of Music. She is currently associate professor of voice and director of the opera program at Kent State University.

Todd Gaffke enjoys a diverse musical career as a performer and educator. He has appeared as a soloist and chamber musician throughout the United States and in Europe performing a variety of modern saxophone works as well as classics and transcriptions. His playing has garnered numerous awards including: Downbeat Magazine's Outstanding Classical Soloist, the Liberace Foundation Scholarship Competition winner, and 1st prize in the Plowman Chamber Music Competition. He has appeared as a member of the wind sections in the Flint, Saginaw, Midlad, Jackson, and West Michigan Symphony Orchestras.

Dr. Gaffke is also adept in jazz repertoire. He performs frequently with The University of Akron Jazz Faculty Ensemble. He has performed at the Detroit Jazz Festival and Lansing Jazz Festival, and with the Harry James Orchestra and Lansing Symphony Big Band.

Dr. Gaffke is Assistant Professor of Saxophone at The University of Akron. Before coming to UA, he was Adjunct Instructor of Saxophone at Grand Valley State University and held Graduate Teaching Assistantships at Michigan State University and Central Michigan University. Dr. Gaffke earned a Bachelor of Music degree in saxophone performance from Central Michigan University, and a Master of Music in performance and Doctor of Musical Arts in saxophone performance with jazz cognate from Michigan State University. His primary teachers include Joseph Lulloff, John Nichol, and Rob Smith

Dr. Barton Samuel Rotberg enjoys a fulfilling career as a performer and instructor of violin, string pedagogy and chamber music. ClevelandClassical.com described his performance as, "The violinist's timbre in the first movement was simply stunning," and "Rotberg's full violin sound lent charm and beauty."

Rotberg has been a featured soloist with numerous orchestras including the Erie Chamber Orchestra, Pittsburgh Philharmonic, Amherst Chamber Orchestra and Warren Philharmonic in concerti of Mozart, Beethoven, Tchaikovsky, Mendelssohn and other repertoire staples. The trio gave performances in the U.S., Canada and France. Rotberg's chamber music performances have been heard on WQI N FM Frie radio and WQI V FM Cleveland

In addition to teaching at the BW Conservatory, Rotberg is a faculty member at the BW Community Arts School, Conservatory Summer Institute and

Oberlin College's Community Music School. He has given guest masterclasses and performances at venues such as Interlochen Arts Academy, Longy School of Music and University of Windsor.

Prior to teaching at BW, he served for four years as assistant professor of Music at Mercyhurst University, D'Angelo Department of Music where he was coordinator of the string program. He has been an adjudicator for the Tuesday Musical Competition in Akron, Music Teacher's National Association Competition and the Lakeland Civic Orchestra Concerto Competition.
