ARTIST BIOGRAPHIES

Praised for his "bright" voice and "perfect" tone quality (Butler Eagle), **Victor Cardamone** has garnered much attention and critical acclaim over the last decade, and continues to do so. His "sweet tenor" is equally known for its "power and ringing high notes" (Cincinnati Business Courier). He has also been described as "a perfect foil" (Classical Voice of North Carolina), "hilarious" yet "ideal in the romantic moments" but also "the stuff of nightmares" (Cincinnati Business Courier), and "thrilling" (San Francisco Chronicle).

Hailing from the northeast outskirts of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, Victor earned his Bachelor of Music in Music Education from Youngstown State University, with a double major in applied voice and French horn. He took additional coursework at Ball State University, where he served as a graduate teaching assistant in the voice department, before transferring to the University of Cincinnati, College-Conservatory of Music and earning his Master of Music in Vocal Performance and his Artist Diploma in Opera Studies. He has trained exclusively with Misook Yun, Jon Truitt, and Tom Baresel. He has coached primarily with Hyery Hwang, Kathy Kelly, and Marie-France Lefebvre. He has studied Schubert lieder extensively (including the songs of 1817, Die schöne Müllerin, Winterreise, and Schwanengesang) with Ken Griffiths.

Victor has bowed with Opera Western Reserve, the Warren Philharmonic, New Castle Lyric Opera, Asheville Lyric Opera, Brevard Music Center, Cincinnati Opera, the Charleston Symphony (Charleston, South Carolina), Wolf Trap Opera, the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra, the Dayton Philharmonic, Dayton Opera, Opera Project Columbus, Opera Columbus, the Merola Opera Program, the Sacramento Philharmonic, and San Francisco Opera. His major role credits include Ferrando (Così fan tutte), Rinuccio (Gianni Schicchi), Don Ramiro (La Cenerentola), Jeník (The Bartered Bride), Tamino (Die Zauberflöte), and Don Ottavio (Don Giovanni). His major cover credits include Ernesto (Don Pasquale), Pinkerton (Madama Butterfly), Almaviva (II Barbiere di Siviglia), and Chevalier de la Force (Dialogues des Carmélites). An advocate and champion of new music, he has lent his voice to a number of significant projects over the past few years. As a member of Opera Fusion: New Works, he was part of the first workshops and studio recordings for Eurydice (cocommissioned by The Metropolitan Opera and Los Angeles Opera), Blind Injustice (sponsored by the Ohio Innocence Project), and The Hours (co-commissioned by The Metropolitan Opera and the Philadelphia Orchestra).

Victor is a three-time Central Region Finalist in the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions, and was sole recipient of the Regional Encouragement Award in the 2017-2018 season. He is also a three-time Corbett Competition award winner, and was a former finalist for Washington National Opera's Cafritz Resident Artist Program. He is currently a member of the Adler Fellowship Program at San Francisco Opera.

When not singing or studying music, Victor can be found making something delicious in the kitchen, watching movies, and chilling with his favorite feline, a black cat named Bill.

Ben Malkevitch is a versatile pianist, organist, singer, music director, and composer based in the Cleveland area. They are on staff at Baldwin Wallace University, where they work with the vocal performance, musical theatre, and choral programs. Familiar with wide swaths of the operatic, musical theatre, art song, and instrumental repertoire, Ben does a wide range of recital, recording, and audition work. Ben is the music director and organist at Lakewood Congregational Church (UCC). They have played in the pit orchestra for touring productions of The Sound of Music and Wicked at Playhouse Square. They have been rehearsal pianist and vocal coach for several productions at Opera Western Reserve in Youngstown, most recently La Bohème, and have also music directed shows at Near West Theatre and French Creek/TrueNorth. In 2019, Ben was the chorus master for CityMusic Cleveland's performance of Verdi's Requiem. They are also on staff for the ArtsBridge and Dazzle Award musical theatre training programs.

Ben holds a Master's Degree in Collaborative Piano from the Cleveland Institute of Music, where they studied with Virginia Weckstrom. Behind the scenes, they enjoy doing music engraving work, creating new, easy-to-read editions for modern performers, as well as designing operatic supertitles.

Dr. Alice Wang is an active clinician, collaborator of chamber music, and an active orchestra player as the regular member of the Youngstown Symphony, Warren Philharmonic Orchestra, and the Opera Western Reserve Orchestra. Alice had performed in professional conferences such as the International Clarinet Association ClarinetFest and the Ohio Music Education Association Conference as a soloist, chamber musician, as well as the Director of The Dana Clarinet Ensemble. Dr. Wang has been teaching and performing with artists from all over the world in the Hawaii Performing Arts Festival every summer since 2017.

Alice completed her Bachelor of Music in Performance at the University of Southern California under the tutelage of Mr. Yehuda Gilad and Mitchell Lurie. She later joined the studio of Sir Walter Boeykens of the Royal Conservatoire of Antwerp in Belgium where she received her masters. As part of the guest student artist program Alice had the opportunity to study with Hermann Stefansson of Royal Stockholm Philharmonic Orchestra at the Royal College of Music in Stockholm in Sweden. During the past summers Alice had participated in the Aspen Music Festival, Marrowstone Music Festival, Atlantic Music Festival, and Round Top Music Festival where she soloed with the orchestra. In 2007, Alice completed her Doctorate of Musical Arts at the University of Texas at Austin under Prof. Richard MacDowell and joined the faculty of the Dana School of Music in the same year.

Alice currently lives in Pittsburgh with her husband Kurt, and their occasionally ill-mannered dogs Wally and Linus, a flock of hens, and depending on the season a thriving or failing as a bee keeper.

ABOUT THE CONDUCTORS.

MICHAEL S. BUTLER

Michael S. Butler is Director of Bands and Associate Professor of Music in the Dana School of Music at Youngstown State University. He conducts the wind ensemble and orchestra, leads the graduate wind conducting program, and oversees all aspects of the university's band and orchestra program. He also serves as music director for the YSU Youth Orchestra.

Prior to his appointment at YSU, Dr. Butler served as the Director of Bands for six years at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point where the Symphonic Wind Ensemble was recognized twice by CBDNA as one of the finest small university wind ensembles in the nation, first in 2017 and second in 2019. The ensemble was also selected through blind peer review to perform at the 2019 Wisconsin Chapter of the National Band Association Conference in Eau Claire. Before teaching at UWSP, he had a multitude of experiences that included teaching and conducting at the University of Florida, serving as the Associate Director of Bands & Orchestra at Spruce Creek High School, and the Director of Bands at William R. Boone High School. Ensembles under his leadership flourished and received invitations to perform at the Florida Music Educators Conference and the prestigious Carnegie Hall.

Dr. Butler is an active clinician, adjudicator, and guest conductor for wind bands nationally and internationally. An advocate of new music for the wind band, he regularly commissions new works to ensure talented composers contribute to the wind repertoire. He is active as a researcher and academic writer, contributing articles to music educator journals and the GIA Series "Teaching Music Through Performance in Band."

DUSTIN HARRIS

Dustin Harris is currently in his twenty-second year of teaching for Cuyahoga Falls City Schools. His primary duties include directing the Symphonic Band, Tiger Marching Band, Pep Band, and co-directing the Gold Concert Band. Mr. Harris also assists with the 6th, 7th, and 8th grade bands at both Bolich and Roberts Middle Schools and serves as the district's primary brass instructor.

During Mr. Harris' tenure with the Cuyahoga Falls High School Symphonic Band, the group has developed as one of Northeast Ohio's premiere AA High School Concert Bands. This group participates annually in OMEA events and has made appearances at the state level for the past decade. The group has consistently earned a Superior Rating at this level over the last three years. Under Mr. Harris' directorship the CFHS Symphonic Band has also performed in Severance Hall and been invited to perform at various events and venues in NE Ohio. Prior to his work at Cuyahoga Falls, Mr. Harris was Director of Bands at North Middle School in Grants Pass, Oregon for three years. He holds a Master of Music in Tuba Performance from Michigan State University, a Bachelor of Music in Tuba Performance from the University of Akron, and a Bachelor of Science in Education from Montana State University. Bands under his direction have consistently earned superior ratings at district and state-level events and have been invited to prestigious performances such as the 2008, 2016, and 2022 CBDNA/NBA Southern Division Conference, the 2016 Midwest Clinic, the 2018 FMEA President's Concert, and the 2020 National Concert Band Festival in Indianapolis. Mr. Shistle is active as an honor band clinician (including the 2015 FBA Nine-Star Honor Band), and adjudicator and currently serves as the Chairman of the FBA Concert Music Committee. He has also served on the FMEA's Board as Member at Large. Mr. Shistle's professional affiliations include the National Association for Music Education, the Florida Bandmasters Association, the National Band Association, Phi Beta Mu, and he is an honorary member of Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia. He was a recipient of the FBA Tom Bishop Award in 2007 and was elected to the prestigious American Bandmasters Association in 2019. ABOUT THE OLMSTED FALLS HIGH SCHOOL BAND PROGRAM

Olmsted Falls has been listed every year as one of the "100 Best Communities for Music Education." The high school band program is built up by the marching band, four concert ensembles, two jazz bands, as well as a music theory course taught by the choral director. During the football season, the entire band program comes together to form the Bulldog Marching Band. This group ranges from 250-300 students depending on the year. The Bulldog Marching Band is a festival band that learns on average 5 complete shows each year. The band has traveled to Ohio State University, Disney World, Universal Studios, Chicago, Washington DC, and New York over the years.

All of the concert bands are competitive in OMEA large group adjudication. Historically, these bands perform very well under the adjudication and look forward to hosting the district event as well. In order to provide the most educational experience, students at OFHS are encouraged to study privately and to participate in outside honors ensembles and camps as well as performing for solo and ensemble.

Olmsted Falls Wind Symphony is under the direction of alumnus, Ms. Julie Roberts. She assisted the band program for multiple years before taking over as the head director. While under her direction this group has doubled in size and now performs some of the most challenging music in the wind band literature. This ensemble is the top level of concert ensembles at Olmsted Falls High School and is taken as an honors class by most students.

Over the years, the Olmsted Falls Wind Symphony has performed at numerous special events such as Baldwin Wallace, Kent State University, and Severance Hall. This band has performed multiple joint concerts as well as hosting 3 bands from Massachusetts in 2015 and joining each group for combine selections. The musicians in this ensemble are very grateful for these special performances and hope to continue to have these exciting opportunities.

ABOUT THE CUYAHOGA FALLS CITY SCHOOLS BAND PROGRAM

Cuyahoga Falls High School supports four primary concert bands, the Freshman Band for all ninth-grade students as well as three ability-based audition bands, Gold Band, Black Band, and Symphonic Band. Symphonic Band is comprised of the most advanced musicians involved in the instrumental music program. The group performs some of the most advanced literature in the wind band repertoire. Many of the students in the group take private lessons and perform in other ensembles that meet outside the regular school day.

ENSEMBLE BIOS

Students involved in concert bands at any level have the option to enroll in the honors section and can earn honors credit upon completion of a quarterly project. During the fall season, the bands function as two units, the Tiger Marching Band and the Fall Concert Band. In addition to these large groups, students may choose to audition or participate in various other musical offerings such as the Gold Tones Jazz Orchestra, 7 O'Clock Jazz Ensemble, Pit Orchestra, Pep Band, Concert Percussion Ensemble, Brass Choir, Woodwind Choir, and various other chamber groups. All four concert bands routinely participate in OMEA events each school year. The band program is frequently represented outside the district as well, with numerous students participating in various university honor bands, Cleveland Youth Wind Symphony, Cleveland Contemporary Youth Orchestra, and Akron Youth Symphony. The concert bands have also represented Cuyahoga Falls at the American Bandmasters Association State Conference, Ohio Band Directors Conference at the University of Akron, the Northeast Ohio Band Invitational at Severance Hall, Kent State University Partnership Day, and the OMEA State Convention. (Freshman Band)

The Cuyahoga Falls band program is fortunate to have five directors that facilitate the program in grades 6-12. High School Directors: Jennifer Culver, Courtney Lambert, and Dustin Harris Middle School Directors: Amy Bertleff and Jim Lang

ABOUT THE YSU PERCUSSION ENSEMBLE

Notable YSU Percussion Ensemble performances include the Percussive Arts Society 2018 International Convention in Indianapolis, Percussive Arts Society Ohio Chapter Days of Percussion at Capital University, Ohio Northern University, Youngstown State University, and Ohio Music Education Association Conferences in Cleveland, Columbus, and Cincinnati.

An important part of our mission involves collaborations with composers in the commissioning, premiering, and critically acclaimed recording of their works. Our 2005 release "Dark Wood" includes six premiere recordings and commissions. Our commission project with New York City-based percussionist/composer John Hollenbeck on his "Ziggurat" for five percussionists and four saxophonists, was premiered at the Whitney Museum of Contemporary Art in New York City, and is available on his 2008 release "Rainbow Jimmies." The Youngstown Percussion Collective's 2012 release "Forms Of Things Unknown" is a concert-length suite by YSU professor of jazz studies, bass, and composition, Dr. Dave Morgan.

ABOUT THE YSU BANDS & YSU WIND ENSEMBLE

The wind band program at YSU includes a wide array of performance groups, from concert bands and chamber ensembles to athletic bands, including the YSU Marching Pride. Hundreds of students perform in these ensembles each year.

The wind band program at Youngstown State University has a rich history of collaboration with musical artists, including some of the most distinguished composers, conductors, and performers of our time to provide transformative experiences for our musical community. Notable artists include Michael Colgrass, Sean Jones, Joseph Schwantner, Donald Sinta, Allen Vizzutti, and many more. This collaboration frequently includes participating and leading commissions to propel the wind repertoire forward. The Wind Ensemble has had the honor of performing at prestigious venues throughout the United States, including repeated performances at the OMEA Conference, CBDNA Regional and National Conferences, MENC National Conference, ASBDA National Conference, and the world-renowned Carnegie Hall. The group has released a total of seven professionally produced and critically acclaimed CDs.

The YSU Wind Ensemble, directed by Dr. Michael S. Butler, is the premier concert band in the Dana School of Music and consists of the top wind and percussion students. The Wind Ensemble performs a wide range of music, including contemporary literature and standard repertoire, to ensure students receive exposure to the finest music written for the medium. In 2023, the Wind Ensemble performed at the prestigious Severance Hall, home of the Cleveland Orchestra, and was selected as one of the top small university wind ensembles in the nation, and their performance was featured at the national CBDNA Convention.

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

Sylvia Wang has performed as soloist and collaborative pianist across the U.S., Europe, Asia, Central America, Australia, Argentina and Lebanon. She has also recorded for the Newport Classic, CRI, Boston Records and Northeastern labels and been a winner and finalist for numerous awards and competitions. These include the Royal Overseas League Music Festival in London, the AVANTI award leading to a debut in London's Purcell Room, Chamber Music Yellow Springs in Ohio and the J.S. Bach International Piano Competition in Washington, D.C.

In addition to her work as a busy faculty member at Northwestern University, she has served as adjudicator and presenter for such institutions as the Central Conservatory in Beijing, China, the Centre for Young Musicians in London, the Chautauqua Institution in New York and the Sydney Conservatorium of Music in Australia. Her students have won prizes and awards at the Tokyo International Piano Duo Competition (Grand Prize and bronze medal), the Fischoff National Chamber Music Competition, the Carnegie Millennium Book Project and the Concert Artists Guild and occupy teaching and playing positions in the U.S. and abroad.

At age 17, she left her native Penang, Malaysia to study at the Royal Academy of Music in London as a recipient of the prestigious Associated Board scholarship, earning the highest award in solo performance, the Recital Diploma. Thereafter, she graduated with the M.M. and D.M.A. with top honors from the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York.

Prior to the pandemic, she returned regularly to Asia to teach and perform, with engagements at the Hong Kong Academy of Performing Arts, the Yong Siew Toh Conservatory in Singapore and a six-city tour of China. In addition to her work for "regular" audiences, she has presented animal-themed concerts for children in schools and concert halls across Southeast Asia.

She is the author of the e-book, Memorization and the Pianist, which has sold in Japan, Europe, Australia and the United States. During the pandemic, she completed work on fugaleze.com, an interactive

edition of the works of J.S. Bach designed to help in the study and preparation of selected contrapuntal works.

In recognition of "distinction in the field," she was conferred an honorary Associateship of the Royal Academy of Music in London.

Musique de Table (1987)

Thierry De May (b. 1945)

Musique de Table is by Belgian composer Thierry De May. It is for three percussionists, each using a small wooden table as their only instrument. The various sounds are produced by different ways of striking the table with the hands. The tables are amplified by means of contact microphones attached underneath. The piece is precisely notated with a combination of traditional notational symbols and a variety of unique graphic symbols. The music is fully choreographed via the composer's precise notational instructions.

Children's Songs (1971-84) Chick Corea (1941-2021), Arr. G. Schaft Selections from Corea's collection of 20 songs.

Rumba Guaguanco

Trad. Afro-Cuban, Arr. G. Schaft (b. 1959) This music is a result of my summer studies in Havana, Cuba in 1994. It was taught to me by master folkloric drummers Fermin and Santiago Nani at the Escuelas Nacionales de Arte (National School of the Arts) in Havana. It comes from the Cuban music/dance complex of yambu, guauguanco, and rumba Colombia known collectively as rumba (pronounced "room-bah). This music is typically played on conga drums, wood block, shekere, cahons, cowbell, and clave, whereas wooden boxes, or cajóns, are used in the Yambu style, serving as modern versions of codfish crates played by African slave dockworkers. Stubernic (1995)

A virtuosic work for three performers who play on a single instrument, as in the marimba traditions of Mexico and Guatemala. Mark Ford is the Director of Percussion Studies at the University of North Texas.

David Bixler, saxophone Dan Loomis, bass Fabio Rojas, drums

Alto saxophonist and composer David Bixler has recently embarked on an artistic reemergence with the release of two new recordings; In the Face of Chaos (2019) with Bixler, Boccato, Cowherd, and Sturm, and Blended Lineage (2020) with the Bixtet. A traumatic brain injury suffered by his youngest son necessitated a shift in Bixler's priorities during the last decade—a period in which his family devoted much of its energy to the care of its youngest member. Through this new lens, Bixler's repurposed creative approach is evident in his most recent output.

For the recording In the Face of Chaos, Bixler has assembled a band that understands the message of resilience and hope despite the odds that this music was intended to convey. Pianist Jon Cowherd, bassist Ike Sturm and percussionist Rogerio Boccato are sensitive interpreters of Bixler's music. Their combined effort produces music that is challenging for the listener without being afraid to embrace beauty.

Blended Lineage, a four-movement work for nine musicians includes trumpeter Mike Rodriguez, pianist Jon Cowherd, bassist Luke Sellick, percussionist Fabio Rojas, and a string quartet comprised of violinists Judith Ingolfsson, Heather Martin Bixler, violist Josh Kail, and cellist Rubin Kodheli. This piece is the product of a commission addressing the concept of modern-day tribes. Because the word "tribe" can appear divisive, Bixler framed the concept from the point of view that we all have groups or tribes to which we belong. The exercise of identifying these tribes is the first step in breaking down the barriers that separate them and finding where they intersect. In his piece, Bixler identifies four tribes of which he is a member: the human race, a Wisconsinite, a musician, and those who recognize the spiritual as a reality of life, and the music serves as a reflection of each of these four groups. The first piece, Origins is written for the beauty and diversity that exists through all of humanity. Motherland is an homage to his native Wisconsin. Trenches is dedicated to the musicians in NYC who choose musical rewards over monetary ones. My Soul Swoons Softly, the final piece, takes its title from James Joyce's, The Dead, and is a reflection on the Divine existence beyond what can be seen and touched.

Bixler is the host of Liner Notes with David Bixler, a new podcast centered on conversations with jazz musicians, as well as serving as Director of Jazz Studies at Bowling Green State University in Bowling Green, Ohio. As both a Selmer and Vandoren Artist he is active as a clinician and performer throughout the world.

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

BIOGRAPHIES

Tim currently performs as Principal Tuba with the Dayton Philharmonic Orchestra and the Carillon Brass Quintet. He is a member of Summit Brass, Cincinnati Contemporary Jazz Orchestra, and Symphonia. His past experience includes serving as a member of The United States Army Field Band. Timothy is currently completing a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from Arizona State University.

STAFF SERGEANT IRVING RAY joined the United States Army Band "Pershing's Own" in 2016. A native of Houston, TX, Irving comes from a large family of eight brothers and sisters, half of which played euphonium and the youngest sibling somehow holding out on trumpet. Sergeant Ray completed his Bachelor of Music Education at Sam Houston State University and both a Master of Music and Doctorate of Musical Artist in Euphonium Performance at the University of North Texas. Irving is an active soloist and clinician and has been featured as a guest artist in Singapore, Mexico, South Africa, Taiwan, Hong Kong, and at prominent music conferences such as the International Tuba Euphonium Conference, Texas Music Educators Association Convention, the College Band Directors National Association Conference, and the Midwest Clinic to name a few. Some of his greatest musical influences include Isaiah Ray, Frank Troyka, Dr. Matthew McInturf, Rex Martin, Dr. Demondrae Thurman, and Dr. Brian Bowman.
