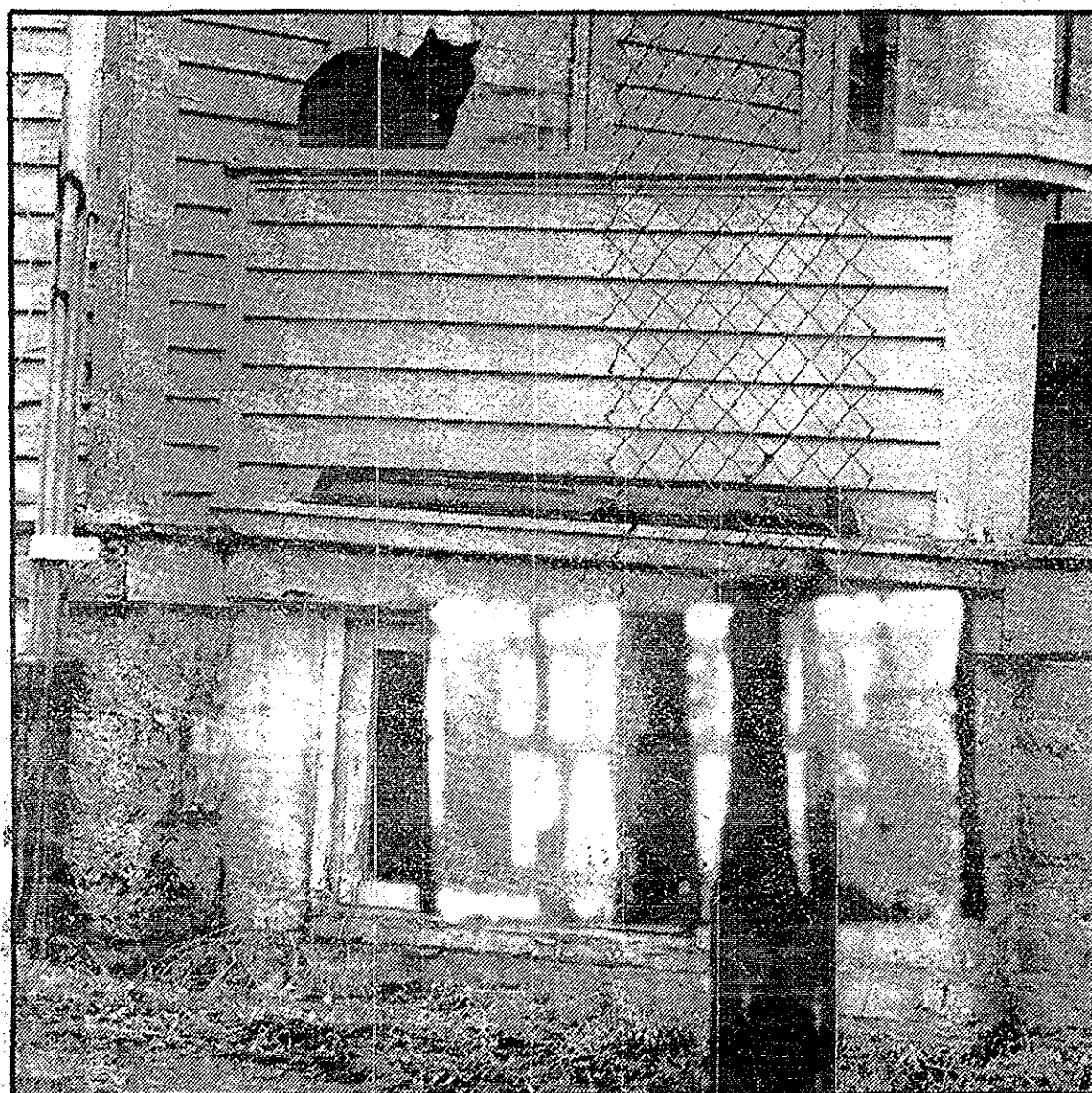



On Tuesday, April 1, President Cobalt, mumbling as he stumbled the 57 steps from his limosine to his gold inlaid mahogany

Pina Colada postpones deck's renewal

Plans to recondition the badly deteriorated Washington Avenue parking deck during this summer will be "delayed another year or possibly longer," according to Pina P. Colada, dean of safety services.

Although Colada said that he was aware of structural deteriora-

tion signs—large holes, broken concrete and shifting—of the deck since last summer, he explained he felt it wise at that time to put-off necessary major repairs until this summer for reasons he said he could not disclose.

However, Colada said he is "not sure" why the major repairs plan been postponed this time and

that "the reason for the delay is not important."

But, "I would like to assure students that to my knowledge the parking lot maintenance monies (obtained from the selling of parking permits and campus parking fines) are not being mismanaged or tampered with," he remarked.

What is important, he stated, is for students to understand that the condition of the deck will "probably worsen" before repairs can be made and that there "might be" risks involved when parking in or near by the deck.

"The University cannot and will not be held responsible for any bodily and/or vehicle damages that might occur just because the parking deck is unsafe," he continued. "Students must park at their own risk."

Colada suggested that students make an effort to be "consciously aware of where they walk" in the deck in order to avoid falling through the holes and to "park as close to the exits as possible to insure a quick get-away" should the deck begin to collapse.

In any case, Colada stressed that he will "keep his fingers and toes crossed" in hopes that the parking deck holds-up while in use.

barking problem

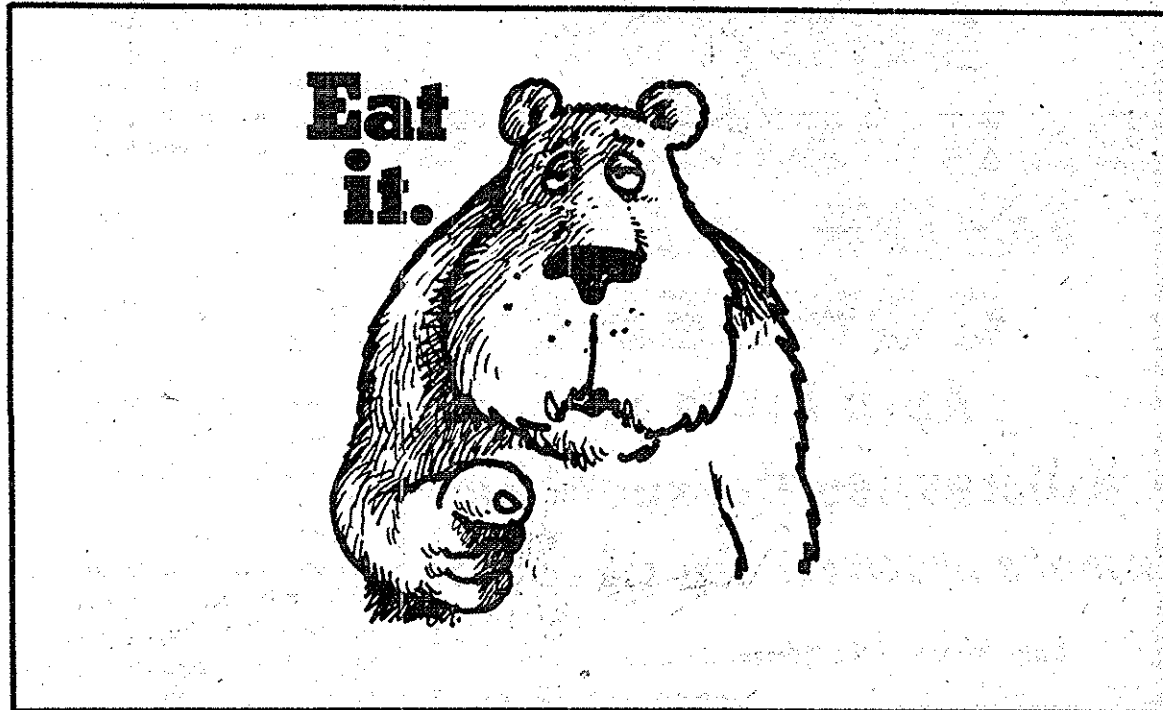
To the Editor of *The Scumbar*:

Unbeatable Pelicans flip Indian-Anna

The YU basketball team capped off their first undefeated season in history, as they blew-out Big Ten champ Indian-Anna 112-49 in the finals of the NCAA championship, held Monday night in Philadelphia.

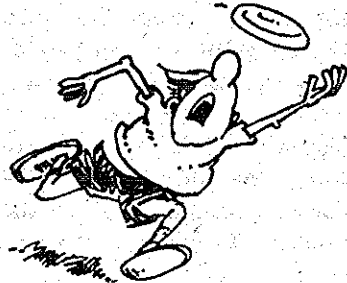
