

The third time around, though, Murphy publicly gave the names of four girls he said had been accused of illegal campaigning. He said: "If these girls come up here and prove me wrong, I'll apologize to them."

The girls he named were not at the meeting. As it turned out, Murphy had not talked to the accused girls. He had not made them aware of the charges he would publicly bring against them. He considered them guilty until proven

Later on, when asked who the accusers were, Joe Murphy refused to give their names publicly because they were not present. He, therefore, publicly exposed the accused girls while avoiding the accusers any embarrassment.



In most colleges twelve hours attempted usually result in full time classification. Part time students, on the other hand, are subject to immediate call and change in deferment classification. 



It certainly is. On May I of this year the YF-12A (formerly known as the A-11) reclaimed the world absolute speed record from the USSR. It was clocked at 2,062 mph over Edwards Air Force Base.

#### How big is the YF-12A?

The exact dimensions of the YF-12A have not been released yet. But it's approximately 100 feet long, with about a 50-foot wingspan. That's half again as big as our present interceptors!

### **Nutrition Expert** Talks at Strouss'

By MARY GAZDIK

The air at Strouss' Auditorium was filled with organic chemistry terms and formulas October 7 and most of the seats were filled with pre-med students, home economics classes, student nurses and others interested in nutrition.

The occasion was a lecture on "Nutritional Adaptations, Friend and Foe", given by Dr. Richard C. Bozian, professor of internal medicine, University of Cincinnati College of Medicine. His appearance was sponsored by the American Medical Association, The Mahoning County Medical Society and the Home Economics Club of the Univer-

Trying to Interest Students Dr. Bozian said part of his purpose in being here was to interest young people in science. He said we should all be interested in nutrition from the standpoint of our own health and that of our families.

He showed slides dealing with the human body's handling of carbohydrates and said the capacity to store fat is almost limitless and this factor probably aided humans in survival long ago.

He described regulatory obesity and metabolic obesity. Experiments Cited

Dr. Bozian cited examples of nutrition experiments done with rats and mice. He said many obese humans have the same problems as obese rats. Both take food in at one interval, resulting in an accelerated conversion of carbohydrates to fat.

Touching on the problem of why people become obese, Dr. Bozian said scientists don't know all the answers yet. He said optimal nutrition hasn't yet been determined.

Dr. Bozian said there were many possibilities as to develop ments in the field of human nutrition.
