





Therefore I sometimes make it my business to read certain copy before it goes to press. The copy which is destined to appear in this issue of the paper was particularly interesting-especially Martha "Neag's" column. In this so-called column she again gives vent to her own peculiar style of poisonous propaganda. She makes a left-hand answer to Mister Lanz and Mister Downey. Then she turns to some very interesting figures in which she claims that the Independents have succeeded in greatly outnumbering the Greeks this year on the Dean's list and on the roster of Delta Epsilon. But I'll wager few people know by what a major-NOW SOLD AT THE SCHOOL CAFETERIA ity. There are 600 students enrolled in day-school here at Youngstown College. 189 of these are Greeks. That is not even one-third. The Independents thus outnumber the Greeks by YOUR COLLEGE CAN NOW more than two to one! Now let's look at the percentage of enrollment on the Dean's list and in Delta Epsilon. The Greeks managed to place 12 on the Dean's list for a score of 27 percent. They placed 14 in Delta Epsilon for a score of 25 percent. HELP YOU BECOME A Now I don't think that is so bad-and remember Miss Neag's claim that the Greeks very seldom do any school work. As an added feature to this outburst I would like to take NAVAL OFFICER this opportunity to present Miss Neag with written recognition of "her good work." She has undoubtedly done more to create strife and ill will among the members of the student body than anyone of the hundreds of people who have been privileged in the past to write for this paper. By repeatedly taking advantage of her position on the Jambar she has been able to present her markedly predjudiced and over-emphasized and even often exaggerated, that is the nicest way I know of expressing that thought, opinions on matters that most of the time were none of her business. In conversation Neag manages to give one the impression that she likes very little about our school, very few people who comprise its student body or personnel, and the city, state, and country in which she is privileged to live. I have been singularly impressed by the "old-world" attitude which she takes about almost everything. As a bit of advice to her and people like her - if they don't like it here why don't they go elsewhere. That's about all there is to say, except this final




