

Six YU Graduates Named by Flask in City Administration

Harry Meshel, a member of the Business Administration faculty, has been appointed secretary to Youngstown's new mayor Anthony B. Flask. Mayor Flask announced with Meshel's appointment that he will ask City Council to make the secretary's position carry the title and responsibilities of administrative assistant. ♦

An instructor at the University since 1950, Meshel received his B.S. degree in business administration from YU. He also has a master's degree from Columbia University.

Meshel was chairman of the Citizens-for-Kennedy Committee in Mahoning County in 1960 and was a candidate for County Commissioner in 1960. He belongs to the Curbstone Coaches and he is a member of the board of St. Nicholas Church.

Meshel serves as advisor to two campus organizations, AHEPA and Phi Sigma Kappa Fraternity. He was recently selected as Man-of-the-Year by the Association of Eastern Orthodox Men.

Five other cabinet positions went to graduates or former students of Youngstown University. J. Philip Richley was appointed City Engineer. Richley has been serving under the city engineer for nine years. He served as city engineer under former Mayor Frank Franko. Richley received

The new police prosecutor is Joseph Donofrio. He was assistant police prosecutor under both the Kryzan and Franko administrations. Donofrio received his law degree from Youngstown University.

Attorney Edward Miller was named to assist Donofrio. Miller was an assistant loan manager at City Savings and Loan before joining the new administration and is a graduate of the University.

Attorneys William Higgens and Michael Yurchison were named as assistants in the City Law Department. Higgens is a former cabinet
