Dr. Ward Miner To Head English

Prof. Karl Dykema, New Arts Dean, Keeps His Teaching Duties

Dr. Ward T. Miner has been named head of the English Department following a shift in personnel there.

Former English Department chairman Prof. Karl Dykema remains as head of the departments of Language and Literature, and Communications. Prof. Dykema was recently named Dean of the College of Arts and Sciences.

Dr. Miner will continue to teach his 12-semester hour schedule. Prof. Dykema is teaching 10 hours.

Dr. Miner has been associate professor of English here since 1957. He received his B.A. degree from the University of Colorado, M.A. from the University of Pennsylvania, and Ph.D. from the University of Pennsylvania.

Among the new responsibilities Dr. Miner is now assuming is the assignment of courses to various English teachers.

Dr. Miner's wife, Thelma, is also a member of the English faculty.

Dr. Miner has taught as Fulbright Professor in American Literature at the University of Turku, Finland. Both he and his wife taught as Fulbright Professors during 1960-61 at the International People's College, Elsinore, Denmark.

In 1955, Dr. Miner wrote "Transatlantic Migration: The Contemporary Novel in France." This followed two years of research in France. Other works include "The World of William Faulkner," 1952; and "William Goddard, Newspaperman," 1962.

A holder of the American Council of Learned Societies' Scholars Award, Dr. Miner has served on the faculties of Queens College, Temple University, Colorado School of Mines, and South Dakota State College.
