

Protestant Chaplain To Leave April 1st

Reverend Albert L. Linder, the Protestant chaplain on the Youngstown University campus for the last 18 years, has resigned as chaplain, his resignation to become effective April 1st this year.

Rev. Linder explains in his resignation presented before the Youngstown Council of Churches: "I feel that with the rapid growth of the University a younger leader is needed to carry on a religious work that is well established at present but will be entering an important period of expansion during the next few years."

Commenting on his years as chaplain, Rev. Linder qualified them as "exciting." He feels that the cooperation existing among administration and faculty and the chaplains has resulted in a truly ecumenical approach to the problems facing the different religious groups.

Rev. Linder commented that his association with college students helps him keep an optimistic outlook on life. The satisfaction that comes from helping someone through personal counseling far outweighs the few disappointments of the chaplain's office, he also commented.

As a final word of advice, Rev. Linder urges all students to equip themselves for life

with a good education. "Keep an open mind," he said, "and follow the Biblical injunction 'Prove all things, hold fast to all that is good'."
