

**Y. U. ENROLLMENT UP
600 OVER LAST YEAR**

Total Enrollment Now Over 5200

Enrollment for the fall semester for the College of Arts and Sciences, William Rayen School of Engineering and Dana School of Music of Youngstown University has reached a record high of 5,205, according to the latest figures released by the University. This figure, which does not include enrollments for the Secretarial School, Technical School and School of Law, which are as yet incomplete, indicates a gain of approximately 600 students over last year's final figure of 4,597.

Former students were pleasantly surprised at the number of changes made for the purpose of expediting registration and relieving congestion during the registration process. All student records have been moved from the main building to the large basement of the university library where a new records office has been established, so that records were more accessible for use by advisors during registration. The IBM facilities formerly housed in the main building, and the service department in Central Hall, have also been moved near the records office, thus relieving congestion in the Administration office and office of the registrar in the Main Building, according to university officials.

A new plan to expedite payment of tuition and fees also went into effect. After registering at the library, students made payments while in line for scheduling, thus eliminating the necessity of waiting in line at the cashier's office in the main building. Increased facilities and space in the cashier's office were made available for the purpose of speeding up the paying of bills there for new students and others.

In spite of these innovations, many students reported for scheduling who could not be handled during the regular registration time, which necessitated a two-day extension of registration.
