MINUTES UNIVERSITY SENATE MEETING February 1, 1963

President Jones presided. He commented on the bookstore situation. We sell books at a price lower than most bookstores with a profit of about 1%. The new bookstore across the street is asking for a list of books used for classes claiming they have a right to this information. He told the faculty that it makes it very difficult for the University Bookstore if this information is given out, and asked the cooperation of the faculty in controlling this information. He stated that we did not object to the sale of second-hand books. A discussion followed regarding facilities in the new bookstore. He also cautioned faculty about turning out lights in classrooms when they leave.

Mr. Jones reported on enrollment figures: Last fall, 8500; this semester 8050, about 500 less. There were 1300 new students so we dropped out about 17 or 1800. We need to study this situation to find out the reason. The chairman felt that academic failure was the biggest reason for the day students drop-out and he thought the faculty, through a more personal interest in their students, could help.

Mr. Jones reported on a meeting of the Executive Committee regarding change of hours for evening classes for summer session. The Summer School classes will meet at 8:00, 10:00, 12:00, and 2:00, with a break of ten minutes each hour. For fall the change will be primarily Saturday morning classes, plus more Friday evening classes from 7 to 10 p.m. with a ten minute break each hour. Saturday classes will be from 9:00 to 12:00. General discussion followed regarding the merits of three hour classes.

Dr. Riley and Mr. Baker were asked to postpone reports on their meetings until the next meeting.
