SUBJECT

This will acknowledge receipt June 18, 1981, of the "Revised Recommendations for Library Budget 1981-82" as adopted by the Library Committee and provisionally approved by the Senate Executive Committee, and your recommendation in this matter. In transmitting the recommendation to me, Dr. Jean M. Kelty, Chairman of the Senate Executive Committee, noted that the matter would have to be presented to the Senate at its next regular meeting, scheduled November 4, 1981, but that by that time the matter would be moot. I agree that it will be moot because it is not feasible to delay allocation until that time.

I am approving the allocation of \$40,000 for binding and \$560,000 for books, periodicals, and microforms as stated on the attached table. This allocation is totally consistent with the Library Committee's recommendation, as approved by the Senate Executive Committee, as to distribution among the schools and colleges. You will note that I do not, however, list any departmental allocations. In the past, the allocations for the College of Arts and Sciences and the College of Fine and Performing Arts have been departmentally specific, and the 1981-82 recommendation was advanced in a similar manner. I request that Maag Library proceed following the distribution among the Arts and Sciences departments and the Fine and Performing Arts departments as recommended by the Library Committee. I also request, however, that the cognizant Deans, assisted by college library committees, review these departmental sub-allocations at their earliest convenience and inform me in writing as to the allocation desired. Should Deans of other schools and colleges, which have not had allocations divided by department, wish to review the allocations with their school or college library committee and make a recommendation for sub-allocations, they are welcome to do so.

I suggest that next year, especially in view of the expanded responsibility of the Senate Library Committee, it would be best if the Committee advanced recommendations by school or college only and that we again involve the Deans and the school or college library committees in the sub-allocation. I urge the Deans to be actively involved in this entire process in order to help insure equitable distribution.

I note that included in the "explanatory notes" of the Senate Library Committee is the recommendation that the developmental ". . .increments carry the restriction that no funds from this category may be used for new subscriptions." I understand the Committee's point and appreciate the caution they advise; however, I believe that it is too restrictive. I request that Dr. Genaway, University Librarian, work closely with the Deans to hold down the new subscriptions but allow them if considered advisable. Executive Vice President Neil D. I wish also to take this opportunity to suggest that the 1981-82 Library Committee should not use incremental budgeting but should use either: (1) a zero base concept supported by requests originating with school or college library committees advanced through Deans; or (2) develop a distribution formula grounded on the multiple considerations of type and level of program, number of faculty, number of students instructed, and consideration of approved new programs.

I thank the Library Committee and the Senate for their work and advice. For clarity of understanding by the people receiving a copy of this memorandum I am enclosing a copy of Dr. Kelty's memorandum to me.

Library Budget

I am, as Chairman of the Senate Executive Committee, enclosing the Revised Recommendation for Library Budget 1981-1982.

As you know the previous recommendation was turned down by the Senate on June 3, 1981. At its next meeting the Senate Executive Committee then ordered the Library Committee to submit a revised budget to them on or before June 22. The Library Committee met and presented the enclosed budget to the Senate Executive Committee on June 12. The Senate Executive Committee provisionally approved that budget on behalf of the Senate, as it is charged to do under Charter and By-Laws. It is my interpretation (and the interpretation of Gratia Murphy, chairman of Charter and By-Laws) that this matter will have to be presented to the full Senate at its regular meeting on November 4, but by that time the matter will, of course, be moot.
