RE: Post Secondary Enrollment Outcomes - Data Report #2

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As appointed sub-committee chair charged with providing data relative to the success of students exercising the post-secondary option at YSU, I provide the attached sets of data tables which add Winter Quarter information to that previously distributed. I am also providing copies to Dr. Gillis, Dr. Yiannaki, Dr. Kraynak, Dr. Siatras, and Dr. Rost since they have interest in continued updates regarding these data.

There were 24 students attending YSU registering for 42 courses Winter 91; this compares to 25 students who attended YSU during the Fall '90 and registered for 47 courses. The grades used for Winter Quarter tabulation were as posted March 28, 1991. One of the 24 withdrew from all courses (1); thus 23 students finished the quarter with at least one grade recorded. The 23 students are out of a total of 31 students accepted under the program guidelines during 1990-91.

For easy reference, I have interspersed the comparison tables generated from the Fall Quarter 1990 (pages 2 and 4) with Winter Quarter 1991 (pages 3 and 5). The Fall Quarter tables are the same as those previously distributed.
