UPDATE ON YSU'S READINESS FOR Y2K: Donna Esterly, executive director, Computing & Information Systems, presented a brief progress report on YSU's preparation for Y2K (i.e., its attempts to foresee and prevent any problems that might occur when computer calendars change over to January 1, 2000)

According to Esterly, the Y2K Task Force has produced considerable information. Having made substantial progress on centralized services such as computer services, phone services, and facilities, the University will now work on decentralized services. The task force has been working since January to do research on Y2K tools and to provide assistance
