

ACADEMIC STANDARDS COMMITTEE

Item 1. Mr. Dykema reviewed the items concerned with probation in the 1956-57 minutes; they are as follows:

- 14 February Items 2 and 3
- 28 February Item 4
- 28 March Item 2
- 11 April Item 2

Item 2. The committee confirmed the actions of 1956-57 which means that beginning freshmen will not be dropped if they have more than one-half F grades until the end of the academic year, and that probation will be determined on the basis of the point average of the preceding semester only. The statement in the catalog was altered to read as follows: "A student whose point index for a semester is less than .5 while he has fewer than 29 semester hours, less than .75 while he has fewer than 61 semester hours, or less than 1.0 after he has 61 semester hours, will be on probation the following semester. If he does not raise his point index to the required minimum during the probationary semester, he will be readmitted for the following term only at the discretion of the Dean of the University. The student must have a cumulative point index of 1.0 to be eligible for a degree." The acceptance of this statement was moved by Mr. Kitchen and seconded by Mr. Swartz and unanimously approved.
