
The entire meeting was devoted to a discussion of the problem of reducing the number of conflicts between classes in the schedule. A chart of all the fall classes, except Secretarial Studies, had been prepared and was used to illustrate the composition of courses which fell well outside the established patterns. As a result of the discussion some of the conflicts will probably be eliminated in the spring schedule.

Since this matter of working out a satisfactory schedule is a perennial problem, Mr. Worley moved that the President be requested to appoint a permanent faculty committee on scheduling. The motion was seconded by Mr. Swartz and unanimously approved.

Members of the Committee are reminded that on Thursday, October 28, at 11 a.m., Mr. Fulkerson will continue his discussion of the required social science courses.

The next regular meeting of the Committee will be on Thursday, November 4.
