## Informational Report

## May 6, 1998

Deliberations on the general education model and its implementation continue. The ASC reports to the Senate that it has reached consensus on the following; however, no motion to adopt is being made because deliberations are on-going. The ASC invites comments.

The ASC will recommend:

a) There will be a coordinator for general education.

b) The coordinator will report directly to the provost.

c) The coordinator shall be appointed by the Provost after a call for nominations or application.

d) The general education coordinator shall be a faculty member with reassigned time.

e) A general education committee shall be formed.

f) The coordinator will chair the general education committee.

g) The general education committee would approve courses for general education, but would not have authority to "approve" faculty to teach general education courses. Departments offer courses; chairs assign faculty to courses.

h) The general education committee is not to be one of the Senate committees or subcommittees.

i) There is need to link course proposals to the University Curriculum Committee, and policy and general education program proposals to the Academic Standards Committee.

j) The general education committee shall be composed of 13 members plus the coordinator.

k) The 13 members shall consist of

- one representative selected by each college (6)

- one representative from each of 5 categories of the general education model (namely, Essential Skills, Natural Science, Artistic and Literary Perspective, Societies and Institutions, Personal and Social Responsibilities), appointed by the Provost.

- two students selected through Student Government.

1) The general education coordinator shall be an ex officio member of ASC.
