OLD BUSINESS

1. Approval of Minutes of February 22, 1984

- In the second statement in section 1., Old Business, the phrase "...because further examination of any course is considered irrelevant at this stage of our proceedings" was deleted.
- Under New Business, 1. (6)b. was reworded to read "Since the individual colleges complete the task of adding to our proposed requirements, there will not likely be a great shift in any degree requirements."
- On Page 2, under (9)a., "Our Proposal could provide for the establishment of Testing Out procedures" was deleted.

2. Approval of Minutes of March 14, 1984

- For the record, the phrase "for these courses" was added onto the end of the motion on Page 2, which was distributed to the Academic Senate on March 19.

3. Dr. Larry Cummings (Criminal Justice), Dr. Bradley West (School of Education), and Dr. Allen Viehmeyer (Chairman, Curriculum Division) all requested appointments to present new material to the Committee.

4. The Committee meeting time for this quarter was scheduled for Fridays at 1:00.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Courses Which Satisfy Area Requirements

- a. Dr. Rost (Chairman, Curriculum Committee) explained the Memo of January 10, sent by Dr. Viehmeyer to Larry Esterly and entitled "Courses Which Satisfy Area Requirements." The Academic Standards & Events Committee is charged with the responsibility of making recommendations to the Academic Senate regarding which specific courses will satisfy area requirements, including those proposed as additions or changes. Not every proposed course submitted by the University Curriculum Division to the Senate will be directed to the Academic Standards Committee; only those in which there is uncertainty regarding academic classification will come under the jurisdiction of the AS&E Committee.
- b. A motion to submit the following statement to the Academic Senate Executive Committee was called by Henneman:


"The Academic Standards & Events Committee accepts the chartered responsibility of forwarding to the Academic Senate recommendations regarding course proposals seeking to satisfy University General Education Requirements which are at variance with currently stated criteria."

The motion was seconded by Earnhart and passed unanimously.

2. A motion was called by Guzell to add to the Agenda of the next meeting a discussion of the Audit procedure. He would like to recommend that the grade of AU not appear on a student's transcript.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:30 p.m.
