OLD BUSINESS

1. Approval of Minutes of April 13:

Because of a lack of a quorum, the Minutes for last week's meeting will be approved next week.

2. Dean Scriven suggests that an implementation date of <u>FALL QUARTER 1984</u> be included in our Motion A of April 17, which prevents a student from changing registration status from audit to credit or from credit to audit after the last day to add a class. He added that an implementation date of <u>FALL QUARTER 1984</u> should also be intended for Motion B, but will depend upon completion of the necessary computer programming and the approval of the Provost.

NEW BUSINESS

- 1. Dr. Cummings spoke in favor of his request to allow social studies credit for Criminal Justice courses 500, 602, 603, 665 and 875. He stated that Criminal Justice is strongly social science oriented by nature, and that, generally, most of the C.J. Faculty have a social science background. Only two of the courses in the C.J. Department are <u>not</u> social studies courses and it should not be assumed that the C.J. Department deals primarily with law enforcement.
- 2. According to further testimony of the guests, those opposed to the request for social studies credit for the above courses will argue that a) the C.J. Department is seated in CAST, and b) the C.J. Faculty are not true social scientists.
- 3. Dr. Swank included that students outside the Criminal Justice Department are being denied exposure to the area of Criminal Justice because its courses do not fulfill the social studies requirement.
